REMEMBERING RAHWAY THE WAY IT WAS

Standing in front of City Hall Plaza, one can almost see the entire extent of the Main Street business district from Milton Avenue to Monroe Street. It is a relatively short distance, yet much history and many memories abound in those few blocks. No matter what period a shopper may recall, nostalgic emotions are kindled when one hears the names of stores that were a part of our town and a part of our lives.

The period I personally remember is the fifties, a time when the downtown area was in its heyday. This was a time before the shopping malls, when bus lines made frequent stops bringing customers from Carteret, Iselin and Clark. Friday night was the big night, and downtown Rahway was like "Grand Central Station." One only needs to think back to the fine service and merchandise offered in the following stores to realize why Rahway was "the heart of shopping in Union County."

Chain stores, such as Woolworth's, W.T. Grant, and McCrory's 5 and 10 moved into Rahway's larger buildings. Rahway residents had a choice of shopping at five modern grocery stores, three of which were in the downtown area. The ACME was on Main Street at the head of Monroe, while the Safeway and the A&P were on Irving Street. Demblings and the National Grocery Store were on Grand Avenue.

Main Street businesses included Miller's Men Shop, Miles Shoes, S&A Hardware, National Shoe Store, Mary's Bake Shop, Green's, Robert's Hardware, Sadye Cooper, Schwartz Shoes, Jack and Jill, Robinson's Hardware, Oxman's Gifts, Sargents Men Shop, Saffian's Children's Shop, Rahway Hardware, Sentry Auto, Conner's Music Shop, Amorelli's Sport Shop, Harris' Men Shop, Miller's Shoes, Sydney's Men Shop, and Schatzman's Toy Store. Located on Cherry Street were Bertie Pachman's Millinery, Goldblatt's Jewelry, the Fashion Shop, Kuznitz Shoe Store, Rae Lou Women's Shop, Kagan's Shoes, Ducoff's Stationary, Rahway Shoe Repair, Rahway Book and Gift, Clayton Camera, Em Bee Jewelry, Loft's Candy Store, and Ben Pachman's Women's Store.

If one was hungry or thirsty after a long afternoon of shopping, there were plenty of places to stop for a quick snack or an ice cream soda. The shopper might patronize Voss,' the Beverly Sweet Shop, the counter in Woolworth's, the Rahway Diner, or the Rahway Grill. Over on Irving Street were Bauer's and Estelle's. Two of the few pizza

places in town were Roma's and, on the other end of Main Street, Norrante's.

Several fine drug stores filled Rahway's needs including Golodner's, Kirstein's, Verneau's, Lloyd's and Bells.

By the mid-sixties, the business district was changing dramatically. A new shopping trend began with the creation of the nearby Menlo Park and Woodbridge malls, offering more stores, more variety and more parking. Shoppers quickly bought into this innovative retail concept and soon abandoned the local stores for the ultra-modern complexes.

Today, trends are again changing and downtown areas are being redesigned for the consumers who want to shop by where they live. Rahway too is rebuilding with hopes that our downtown district will once more become "the heart of shopping in Union County."

A MAN NOT ONLY WELL LIKED BUT ALSO WELL RESPECTED.... THAT'S BILL DAVIS

Bill meets life fully in his gracious way with tact and a warm smile

Bill Davis was born in the Wyoming Valley of North Eastern Pennsylvania in the old coal mining town of Pittston. Bill's mom was from Irish heritage and Bill's dad was of Welsh decent. When Bill's father returned from World War 11, he decided it was time for the family to move on to greener pastures and so off he went to work in New Jersey: first at the Kearney Ship Yard and then to Ford Motor Company's newly built Edison assembly plant.

The Davis family followed and they bought a home in Hillside and it was there Bill grew up and went to high school. "I worked each day after school at Sweeder's Food Market in Hillside stocking shelves and bagging food and delivering groceries on my bicycle. The extra money I earned was appreciated in my family. I still remember Mrs. Sweeder really well; she spoke little English and she was also little in stature but boy she commanded respect and when she told us something we listened" remarked Bill.

When Bill wasn't working or doing schoolwork he found time to do some high school wrestling and played some tennis. Then after graduation from Hillside High in 1956 Bill enlisted in the United States Marine Corp. serving for six years. "The Corp was a good thing for me cause at 18 I was a kid and when I was discharged I had grown up. I spent part of my active duty at Marine Headquarters in Arlington Virginia. I wasn't trained as a young boy with a rifle but it turned out I was a bit of a natural and during my infantry training I still feel proud that I attained the level of Sharpshooter with the M1 carbine" said Bill.

Bill always wanted to help people and help his community and after discharge he was drawn to consider becoming a funeral director. "I asked my mom what she thought and she said "Bill, why not give it a try" and so the rest is history. I graduated from American Academy and apprenticed for 4 years. I then sat for my NJ Funeral Director's test in 1965 and passed with flying colors on the first try. Boy did that make me feel good 'cause most applicants still don't pass that test on the first try" noted Bill.

Bill was a bachelor in the spring of 1966 and while at a political function in Elizabeth his eye caught the eye of a beautiful young Irish girl who was to become his wife within 6 months. "I asked Miss Mary Duhig if I could buy her a cup of coffee but since she had come that evening with another date she said no, but on her way out she slipped me her telephone number on a piece of paper." Bill and Mary were married that same year and that was 39 years ago.


The newlyweds started to raise a family and then Bill was given the opportunity to purchase a well respected funeral home in Rahway that had been established in 1832. Bill had done work for the Pettit Funeral Home and got along well with Mrs. Pettit. In 1973 Bill purchased the business from Jeanette Pettit and the named changed to Pettit-Davis Funeral Home.

Bill reads three newspapers each day and loves to walk. "If I'm not at Rahway River Park I often go back to my old Hillside neighborhood and walk for an hour or so. I'm fortunate that Mary and I over the years have been able to travel to many, many places around the world, yet I've never met nicer people than those right here in Rahway. Our city may be facing tough times as so many other towns are but I just know we're going to make it" remarked Bill.

A NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION THAT WILL HELP OTHERS

Literacy Volunteers Recommends Volunteering To Help Others Learn to Read.

A typical New Year's resolution involves things like losing weight, giving up a bad habit or getting more organized. While those goals are important to the person making them, Literacy Volunteers of Union County (LV-UC) is asking you to expand your 2012 New Year's resolutions and help your fellow community members.

Nationwide, one in seven adults cannot read, write or do math above an elementary school level. Literacy Volunteers is part of a national network of literacy organizations offering critical education programs that help American adults learn to read and write. Volunteers in the program help teach adults basic literacy, GED preparation, math and English (ESL).

LV-UC is a member of ProLiteracy, the world's largest organization of adult basic education and literacy programs, and is one of 1,200 community-based organizations that make up the ProLiteracy network.

"Literacy literally has the power to change lives," said David C. Harvey, president and CEO of ProLiteracy. "Particularly in this economy, adults need literacy to help them be competitive for jobs and to help keep themselves and their families healthy. By helping these adults gain the education they deserve, we're helping them and their children come together to solve problems and create stronger neighborhoods and communities."

Volunteer tutors are trained at a 15-hour workshop where they will develop the skills needed to work with adult learners in their community. Resource materials are provided at the workshop and the professional staff of LVUC provides ongoing support to all tutors. In

addition, free in services on specific literacy topics are offered several times a year and tutor mentors meet with new volunteers.

A New Tutor Training Workshop Series begins January 21 at the Plainfield Public Library, 800 Park Avenue, Plainfield, and continues January 28, February 4, and February 11 (if needed for a snow day). The workshop begins promptly at 9:30 am and concludes 2:45 pm each Saturday. Attendance is required at all sessions to be come a certified tutor and you must be at least 18 years old, able to read and write English, and willing to commit to tutoring at a Union County Library for one hour a week for one year.

There is a \$40 non-refundable registration fee to cover the cost of materials provided at the workshop and need based scholarships are available to individuals to cover this fee.


