A WORK OF ART APPROACHES COMPLETION-PARK SOUARE RESIDENTIAL AND RETAIL COMMUNITY

Remaining Residential Units at Park Square Readying For Occupancy
The Park Square development project located at Elizabeth Avenue and
Irving Street is now nearly complete. These mixed-use, market rate

residential and commercial buildings began on the drawing board many years ago at a time when the block that it today occupies was the home to Rahway landmark businesses Cliff Hardware and Anthony's Key shop as well as two Victorian homes, a former gas station, the Rahway Junior Service League and a municipal parking lot. Voluminous plans and permits were filed by the developers; demolition of structures took place; ground breaking and then some years ago construction commenced. It's been a long time and a long haul but this project will be judged not by the time it took to complete but rather by the superb quality of the finished product.

I live directly across the street from Park Square and I've seen firsthand the detail and labors and love that have gone into this project. In these trying times, for me it's so uplifting to see a business stick to the guiding principle "let's do it right the first time". I've met a couple of the owners over the last few years and in casual conversation what impressed me was their determination to build in the old way: with excellence. Building thoughtfully and with taste, sacrificing the fast buck and quick construction methods of others and ultimately creating a little treasure for our downtown that will endure and I believe prosper.

These owners are in tune with a new movement in architecture that promotes detail, care, and the attention that thought, love and passion can bring. Sarah Susanka, author of the bestselling book "The Not So Big House" proposes that quality should come before quantity



and that to change a house to a home we need emphasize comfort, beauty, and a high level of detail. Kudos to the Park Square guys as I believe that Ms. Susanka would approve.



Following the spring release of her second album, Mondo Amore, Nicole Atkins and the Black Sea's US tour will be stopping in Rahway on Thursday, July 21. This New Jersey born singer/songwriter has been featured in People Magazine, Entertainment Weekly, on David Letterman, the Conan O'Brien Show and Last Call with Carson Daly. Referred to as "a female Roy Orbison", Rolling Stone magazine named Nicole one of the Ten Artists to Watch.

The series debut concert which was postponed due to weather has been rescheduled for Thursday, July 28 and will feature Total **Soul** an ensemble of lead singers, hot horns, a groovin' rhythm section and a mix of four part vocal harmony. PAVON ATTENDS YOUNG LEADERS CONFERENCE







LAFAYETTE LODGE GIVES SUPPORT TO MERCHANTS AND DROVERS TAVERN MUSEUM

Earlier this year LaFayette Lodge #27 made a donation to the Merchants and Drovers Tavern Museum Association. F. Alexander Shipley accepted it on the Museum's behalf and returned the favor in April by giving a great talk to the members of the Lodge which is located on Irving Street. Mr. Shipley, a popular Rahway author, local historian, and retired RHS English teacher, educated the members on the history of Rahway and the early residences of LaFayette Lodge. He inspired the May Trestleboard written by Worshipful Master Larry Bodine when he spoke of Mason Brother and Companion Seymour Williams. Mr Williams

was a famous Rahway architect who not only designed the Masonic Temple built in 1924, but Grover Cleveland School, the Rahway Savings Institution, the original field house for Veterans field, and several church annexes and homes in the area. Mr. Shipley also spoke about his newly award nominated book, "The Case of the Unknown Woman", the famous story of the murder of a young woman in 1887 in the city of Rahway. Mr. Shipley was kind enough to autograph several books for the brethren and promised Mr. Bodine that he would find more historic Rahway Masons for the Worshipful Master to write about.

Elizabeth, New Jersey The Auxiliary of Trinitas Regional Medical Center welcomed Richard "Rick" Stone, Executive Director of the Senior Citizens Council of Union County, who shared his more than three decades of knowledge of senior health and societal issues with an audience at Trinitas recently. Dr. Stone, whose PhD is in life-span developmental psychology from West Virginia University, informed the audience that there is increasing knowledge of older citizens thanks to a variety of factors, including the growing study of gerontology.

"Thirty or 40 years ago, there was plenty of information about young people but very little was known about the health and wellbeing of people as they aged," Dr. Stone explained. "Better health care and better nutrition are helping people live longer now as we see growing numbers of people in their 80's and 90's and those who are 100 years old or older."

It's important to maintain a positive attitude. "Some people go into a panic when they see the first signs of aging and the health issues they may have as they get older," the psychologist noted. "Simply put, life can be an adventure. As people get older they should never stop doing what they have done their whole lives simply because they are older." Dr. Stone cited the work of Maggie Kuhn, founder of the Gray Panthers in the 1970s, stressing, "She believed that too many people accepted stereotypes about what it meant to be 'old.' She worked hard to change that view and, decades later, we're still

The Auxiliary of reaping the benefits of her progressive Center welcomed thinking."

Dr. Stone recommended that older people remain active, engage with younger people, keep up with lifelong hobbies and interests, and consider retiring to an area where public transportation, culture and entertainment are readily available instead of more remote suburbs. He further emphasized that society overall needs to refocus on the potential of aging, instead of the debilitating aspects of becoming older.

He reminded the audience that volunteering energizes older people. "It's better to think about 'giving back' to society rather than concentrating on 'getting' services and entitlements."

Continuing its tradition of volunteerism, community health education and commitment to the mission of Trinitas Regional Medical Center, the Auxiliary is a committed group of volunteers who dedicate their time and energy to a variety of events and programs. DINER TO HONOR BARRY HENDERSON Submitted by: Rahway High School Alumni Celebration Committee

Barry Henderson has served Rahway proudly for his entire life. He was born March 24, 1941, to Robert and Ann Henderson. Along with his older brothers, Fred and Bob, and younger brother Bruce, he excelled in the city's youth and athletic programs which included PAL baseball and boxing in the late 1940's and throughout the 1950's.

Barry's high school career was unparalleled. Lettering in varsity basketball for three years, and baseball for four years, he led Rahway to athletic glory. An outstanding baseball player under Coach Earl "Ace" Hoagland, the left-handed, power-hitting first baseman earned the tag of "Ted Williams II" as he routinely deposited home runs onto Central Avenue. Barry earned All State honors in both his Junior and Senior years and was an All American in his senior year. He led Rahway to State Championships in his sophomore 1957 and junior years 1958 as well as the 1957 Greater Newark Tournament Championship.

Less than a year after his graduation in 1959, Barry signed a contract with the Detroit Tigers Professional Baseball Organization in January of 1960. Playing first base for the Greensboro Hornets, Barry's great glove and booming bat made him the star of the team. The highlight of his professional career was when he slugged a home run off of Dodgers' Don Drysdale in a spring training game.

His career cut short because of a severe ankle injury, Barry returned to Rahway and in 1964 began his career with the Rahway Police Department. Along with Albert Smith, he was actively involved in solving school related problems during the late 1960's. His relationship with the school system went to a different level when he was elected to the Rahway Board of Education. Barry went on to be elected three additional terms which totaled ten years of service, including one year as president in 1979-1980.

He rose through the ranks of the police department quickly; promoted to Detective in 1970, Sergeant in 1972, Lieutenant in 1976 and Captain in 1983. On February 1, 1988, Barry was appointed as Chief of Police by Mayor Daniel Martin. Overcoming many obstacles, his career moved forward. In October of 1991,

Barry was appointed the city's first Public Safety Director by Mayor James Kennedy. In addition to his duties as Police Chief, Barry would oversee Rahway's Fire Department and Office of Emergency Management.

Barry's contributions to both Rahway and the law enforcement profession have not gone unnoticed. He is a member of New Jersey's Honor Legion and a two-time member of the 200 Club, which rewards valor in the line of duty. Barry was honored with the American Legion Distinguished Service Award in 1980 and again in 1993. He received the New Jersey State PBA Lifetime Membership Award (Silver in 1984 and Gold in 1987). He was elected to the Union County Baseball Hall of Fame in 1988; served as President of the Union County Chief's Association in 1993; Honorary Member of the Rahway First Aid Squad in 1995; and in 1997 he was a recipient of the NJ State Police Chief's Association Humanitarian Award. He retired from the Police Department on April 1, 1998, ending a 35-year career. That same day, he reported for duty as the City's first Superintendent of Solid Waste and Recycling.




