WHAT'S THE FUTURE FOR DOWNTOWN'S **SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT?**

Many questions are being asked on Main property taxes and these SID monies are used to Street about what the future will bring for downtown's Rahway Center Partnership. Slashed funding forced the recent elimination of the job held by longtime RCP Director Ray Mikell, maintenance workers lost their jobs and staffing is drastically cut and running on a skeleton crew.

The downtown commercial property owners are assessed an additional 7% of their annual support the RCP and downtown improvement efforts. The annual renewal of the SID assessment will be on the August City Council agenda.

The Chamber supports dialogue on this issue and would encourage Mayor Kennedy and City Council to host an open and informal forum in July to discuss the issues with downtowners and interested citizens.


MORE GRAFFITI APPEARING IN TOWN





Farmer Fred Schieferstein and Other Favorite Vendors Return




PAPER MILL RISING STAR AWARDS

when Arthur Macaspac opens Chess Mates in downtown Rahway, NJ. The storefront will be part cafe, part club and part school featuring instruction by International Grandmaster Leonid Yudasin, a two time candidate for world champion who was ranked one the top five players in the world.

Macaspac is a formidable player in his own rite. A national master since 1998, Macaspac won the US Army Championship three times and was a team Captain for US Military Team in NATO Competition.

In Iraq, Macaspac played the role of "chess ambassador" at Camp Bucca. Dispite working 10 hour days he found time to start a chess club. Participants came from different services -Marines, Air Force, Navy, Army and even Iraqi interpreters.

The weekly tournaments became so popular that Macaspac, through Army Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation officials acquired 20 chess sets and 10 clocks donated by the United States Chess Federation.

Chess Mates is located in the newly build Park Square building in downtown Rahway, one block from the train station making it convenient for players to travel from New York and Philadelphia as well as across New Jersey. Park Square is in the heart of the revitalized downtown arts district. With ample parking and plenty of restaurants in walking distance.

The public is invited in to sit and play at any time in the cafe area during business hours. The doors will be open seven days a week for classes and tournaments. Chess Mates will offer lite fare, coffee and snacks for casual players and have dinner and lunch catered by Michelino's

Local chess players are in for a special treat Pizzeria and Restaurant for students and tournament players.

> Lessons are offered for every level of player, beginner and veterans. Classes are organized by age starting with the 55 and older community in the early afternoon, followed by youth lessons for six to thirteen year-olds and early evening classes for fourteen to 54 year olds. These restrictions are casually enforced and players may opt for private lessons also.



SGT POWER RETURNS HOME


