# OLYMPIC GOLD MEDAL WINNER SHARES STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESS WITH RAHWAY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

On Friday, February 17, Dain Blanton, Olympic Gold Medalist, professional a thlete (Beach Volleyball), and sportscaster for the LosAngeles Clippers, spent the day with students at Rahway High School.

In the morning, he met with freshman students who are part of a new Freshman Transition initiative, a program that provides students with skills in financial literacy and enables them to create a personalized, comprehensive, yet flexible, 10-year plan for their own transition into adulthood.

He shared with these freshmen the importance of goal setting, having a positive attitude, developing the ability to overcome obstacles, and displaying self-discipline in academics and extra-curricular activities, so that the students might be able to successfully pursue their dreams just as he has. He stressed the need to be prepared now in case opportunities present themselves later, citing as an example, Jeremy Lin of the New York Nicks, who was on the bench in Los Angeles, but was prepared when injuries sidelined those players ahead of him on the New York team. He even passed around his gold medal from the Olympics, making concrete the fruits of hard work Later in the day, he met with some students in classes, and then in the afternoon, he made a presentation to the upperclassmen.

Finally, he joined faculty members after school at a reception where teachers had an opportunity to know him better. Blanton, a highly skilled public speaker, who effectively engages his audiences in order to encourage them to pursue excellence, created a special bond with staff and students at Rahway High School during his visit here.

# Message from the President LET'S MAKE OUR TOWN'S PHARMACIES TOBACCO FREE

Sometimes I think that I'm from another planet cause so much here on earth just doesn't make sense to me. Case in point: Rahway's pharmacies are still selling tobacco products.

I grew up at a time when my dad smoked pipes and cigars at home and nearly every well known actor on TV or in the movies did the same. I'm a

former cigarette smoker who quit 10 years ago for the 100th and final time.

In autumn of 2001 while vacationing on Cape Cod I was told that a law had been passed that no more smoking was allowed inside summer restaurants and clubs. I was in disbelief but after the initial shock passed I realized, WOW, times are a changing: then NYC followed suit and in 2004 the pubs throughout Ireland were told by law, no more inside smoking. Our world made a leap in consciousness. Some things change for the better and this was one of them.

In 2008, San Francisco enacted laws banning the sale of tobacco products in pharmacies: many towns in Massachusetts have recently done the same. There's a movement now around our country to do likewise.

The science has been out for a long time that smoking causes lung cancer and heart disease and many other illnesses. If you choose to smoke, that's up to you, but in many opinions to include mine, it's no longer appropriate to sell tobacco products at retail locations which claim to be devoted to improving our health and well being. As former San Francisco Mayor Gavin Newsom related his city's simple rationale: "Pharmacies should be places where people go to get better, not where people go to get cancer."



#### **SHOULD I FILE A TAX APPEAL?**

their tax bills and realized they have been hit with a substantial increase. The 2010 tax rate was \$5.128 per \$100 of assessed value. The 2011 tax rate is \$5.765 per \$100 of assessed value or an increase of almost 64 cents or 12.4%. To put it in perspective, I live in Rahway and my home has an assessed value of \$132,100. In 2010 I paid \$6,774.09 in taxes and in 2011 I paid \$7,615.57 in taxes or an increase of \$841.48. Ouch!

Unfortunately, an increase in my real estate taxes does not increase my odds of winning a tax appeal. The tax assessment is based on market value. Somewhere in the 1990's the City of Rahway went through a revaluation and everybody's assessment was, in theory, 100% of market value. As home prices increased over the years, the ratio of assessed value to market value continued to fall. In 2011, the ratio of assessed value to market value is 46.69%. If I want to know what the City thinks my house is worth, I divide my assessment of \$132,100 by the ratio of 46.69%. Therefore, \$132,100/.4669 =282,929.96. The City thinks my house is worth roughly \$283,000 and they are right. The City is

By now everyone in Rahway has received not always right. I have a client in Rahway who purchased their home in 2010 in an arm's length transaction for less than \$300,000 but the City has the property assessed based on a market value of \$430,000. This is one of the more obvious cases.

If you are thinking about filing a tax appeal please keep in mind that, by law, the assessor is allowed a margin of error, which in Rahway is roughly 13%. This keeps municipalities from being overwhelmed with trivial cases. If I were going to file an appeal on my own home, I would have to prove a value less than \$246,000.  $($283,000 \times .87 = $246,210)$ . This is called the lower limit of value.

There are several ways to appeal your taxes. You can do it yourself by going on line or visiting the county tax board to get the appropriate forms. You will have to do your own market research and be ready to present your comparable sales to the assessor and the tax board. The filing fee for a typical house is \$5.00. You can hire an appraiser to do an appraisal to determine the market value of your property. You will still be responsible for filing the forms but the appraiser can provide you guidance and appear with you at a hearing if one is necessary. You can hire an attorney.



#### **BLACK HISTORY MONTH**

Black History Month culminated in "Stepping into the Harlem Renaissance Day" on Friday, February 24, 2012 at Roosevelt School in Rahway. Students and staff celebrated with a "Dress Up Day". There was a gallery walk for students in the gym by Mrs. Carol Scott, who presented a doll collection of famous Harlem Renaissance figures. There was a gallery walk in the afternoon for parents and guardians. They visited the hallways throughout the school and observed and reviewed projects students completed throughout Black History Month. The highlight of the day was a school assembly program about the Harlem Renaissance presented by Wincey Terry.

Each grade level at Roosevelt School participated in activities related to the theme. These activities included the following:

Kindergarten: Teachers read Honey, I Love by Eloise Greenfield and illustrated by Jan Spivev Gilchrist. Students completed an art/writing project interpreting the poem that was displayed in the Kindergarten hallway. In addition other African Americans were discussed throughout the month of February and additional projects completed within the classes.

**Grade 1:** After an introduction to the Harlem Renaissance and famous African Americans during this time period, teachers read Harlem by Dean Myers. This picture book is Langston Hughes' poem "Harlem" and his life. After an "Author Study" talking about the life and works of Langston Hughes, students wrote their own poem utilizing his style (prose).

**Grade2:** Students created dioramas on a famous African American from the Harlem Renaissance Era. Individual reports by students were given about their chosen African American and their diorama. The dioramas were displayed in the 2nd grade hallway for observation during the parent/guardian gallery walk.

**Grade 3:** Students researched a notable musician, poet, or artist from the Harlem Renaissance Era. The information found by the students was used to create a newspaper article which was displayed for a gallery walk. Additionally, students choose ways to bring the Harlem Renaissance into the classroom by creating poems, songs, and essays to reflect their learning about the era.

**Grade 4:** Students read The Sweet and Sour Animal Book, written by Langston Hughes. Each student was given a letter of the alphabet and wrote a poem about an animal using their letter. They then drew a picture of the animal using only geometric shapes. Reading, writing, and math were incorporated into this project. Each fourth grade class completed the entire alphabet. Teachers also shared other works from Langston Hughes.

**Grade 5:** Students created reports on jazz, artists, singers/musicians, and poets from the Harlem Renaissance. The school cafeteria was decorated in the Harlem Renaissance time period. Students performed songs from the era during the lunch.

#### **UNKNOWN WOMAN MURDER OF 1887 STILL OUTSTANDING CRIME IN CITY**

It's hard to imagine that news of a strange crime which took place in Rahway 125 years ago could captivate attention and excite interest all across the United States and even reach countries on the other side of the Atlantic. But the brutal murder of a young woman and the ensuing layers of mystery that unfolded during the investigation, created one of the most intriguing murder mysteries of the nineteenth century.

On the morning of March 26, 1887, Alfred, Thomas, and Irving Worth set out along Jefferson Avenue for their two mile walk to work. At Central Avenue, they spied something on the ground that appeared to be a discarded coat. The brothers approached the object for a closer examination and were horrified to discover a bloody corpse of a young woman.

Rahway Police Chief William Tooker was immediately summoned, but by the time he arrived at the scene, approximately 100 curious neighbors had beat him to the site. Many were hovering around the body and others were kicking through the scrub grass searching for clues. Tooker restored order as best he could and finally had the opportunity to examine the scene.

The ground around the body showed every sign of a terrific struggle. The woman had been brutally murdered. Her throat had been slashed from ear to ear and her face was discolored with bruises. She was blue eyed, brown haired, and appeared to be in her early to mid-twenties. She was dressed in a dark green dress, wore tan kid gloves and was clad in a pair of shoes which looked foreign made. Near her body lay a fur cape, a black straw hat, and a parasol. A small willow basket and nine eggs, all but three of which were broken, were strewn among the other effects.

While Tooker was making his survey, two men came up to him with objects they had uncovered. One handed him a small black bag which he said he found in the river by the Jefferson Avenue Bridge. The other man gave the chief an item of even greater interest. It was a bloody knife. These items; the clothes, the eggs and basket, the black bag and the bloody knife would make up the primary bits of evidence as the search would begin for the killer.

There was, however, an unusual and unsettling development. Of the several hundred who viewed the corpse during the course of the morning, no one recognized the woman. It was this unusual twist that would take the crime out of the realm of a local story and make it pique the interest of a nation—wide audience.

By noon on the morning of the murder, beat

reporters from the Elizabeth, Newark, and New York City papers had arrived and by the next day reporters from as far off as Boston, Philadelphia, and Washington D.C. were in town to try to break the story. Professional and amateur detectives hurried to the community. Rewards were offered by the state of New Jersey, the local city council, wealthy citizens, and crime magazines. Photos of the woman would soon be circulated throughout the major cities on the east coast and as far west as San Francisco. Readers in Salt Lake City, Fort Worth, Chicago, and Atlanta followed the story in their local dailies.

Public viewings were held in Ryno's Funeral Home on the two Sundays after the body was found with the hope someone would identify the victim. Although over 7,000 visitors came to Rahway on each of those Sundays and stood on long lines to get a glimpse of the woman, no one could offer a conclusive identification.

The Rahway religious community, upset by the lack of dignity and decorum during the public viewings, urged the authorities to give the woman a proper funeral service and burial. The powers-to-be did allow a funeral service to take place on April 11, but would not give permission to bury the body. There was still a chance someone would recognize the victim.

Early on, a jury had been selected with the assumption that witnesses would be forthcoming. On Monday, April 18, the first of a

series of six sessions began. Twenty-five citizens were called to testify, but nothing ever came out of the inquest. As many as fifteen men were pursued as suspected killers. The ones apprehended were questioned and a few spent a night or two in jail. But in the end, no one was ever convicted.

On Tuesday, May 3rd, thirty—eight days after the body was found, the unknown woman was finally buried in a rear section of the Rahway Cemetery. Six New York reporters served as pall bearers. Of the three dozen people who attended the burial, two women swore they knew the name of the victim. The only problem—each argued it was a different person.

In the months that followed more leads would come forward. One story surfaced which named the owner of the basket, and in June, a man in Salem, Illinois confessed to the crime. Both stories led to dead ends. Ownership of the basket was never proven, and when the confession of the Illinois man was checked out, it was surmised he was a "crank" looking for free passage back to the east coast. In the next fifteen years, identifications continued to come forth, but with the body interred and the passage of time, it was becoming next to impossible to give the woman a rightful name.

Who was the woman? Who killed her? What was the motive? No one to this day has been able to solve the uncanny mystery.





Saturday, April 14th 2012 will witness the love." The purchase of "Apples" was made in response of this desire.



The most common cause of these unsightly stains on asphalt roofs is a blue-green algae called Gloeocapsa Magma. Over the past 25 years this strain of algae has become hardier. It has now become a common sight on asphalt roofs across 80% of the United States. The unsightly growth usually occurs on the north or

moisture, which accelerates its growth.

Contributing to this problem is the change that occurred about 30 years ago in the way asphalt shingles were manufactured. In the early 70's roofing manufacturers began using a fiberglass met. With the fiberglass met.

70's roofing manufacturers began using a fiberglass mat. With the fiberglass mat, and higher oil prices, came the use of finely crushed limestone. It was added to the asphalt coating as a filler or extender. Unfortunately, limestone is a favorite food source for this strain of algae. Often, these black or dark brown stains are mistakenly thought to be dirt, tree droppings, mold, fungus or mildew. Actually, they are caused when the algae begins to decompose.

Although most homeowners are concerned about aesthetics or curb appeal, the algae is actually eating away at the limestone filler in the asphalt which in time will loosen up and the granules will begin to fall away much faster than they should, taking away years of the expected

life of the roof. The dark growth also draws in more heat, which will also shorten the life of the shingle. Curb appeal is a big consideration to anyone who may be looking to sell their home. A potential buyer may truly believe they will need to replace that roof for thousands of dollars, when in reality it could be taken care of for a small fraction of that.



#### THE GARDEN AWAKES

All garden plants, including lawns grow best when they have the correct soil PH and proper fertilizer application. Keep a nice pot of pansies by the front door to greet family and visitors. In case of a late winter snow storm you can simply move the pots closer to the house for added protection. Pansies planted now will flower until late May or early June. If you take a few minutes every week to pick off the dead flowers (deadheading) you'll have a magnificent display of color.
