Message from the President WE NEED TO PROTECT AND MAINTAIN RAHWAY'S EXISTING STREET TREE STOCK

I took the "before" Irving Street tree photo on Arbor Day, Friday April 29. I took the "after" photo a few days later. Nobody in the neighborhood had any idea what was going to happen. In total, 7 mature, healthy flowering pear trees were sawed down for sidewalk improvements.

These seven trees made their home on our downtown streets for the last 30 years. As they matured they provided: shade and cooling during the summer; beauty of foliage in the spring and the fall; a home for the birds and the bees; a pleasing and softening look in a commercial neighborhood and when in leaf, each tree each year converted 50 pounds of carbon dioxide into oxygen.

It was explained to me that the old tree locations just didn't fit into the spacing and rhythm required by our City Engineer's new plan. That planning maybe appropriate for a brand new shopping center when you're starting from scratch, but certainly not in an old downtown. For those of us old enough to remember, the rhythm method didn't work very well for the Catholic Church nor should it rule decisions when improving older neighborhoods: you need to work around what you've got.

What can we do?

1st: Seriously implement Rahway's Green Building & Sustainability Master Plan Element which makes it a priority to "save trees that are threatened with redevelopment and routine street repairs, consulting a certified NJ arborist to help make these decisions".

2nd: Form a tree commission that is comprised of representation from City engineer, DPW, RPD Traffic Department, Environmental Commission, a Certified Arborist and interested residents. Many caring communities in New Jersey, like our neighbor Linden, have found that forming a



tree commission is the best way to go.

Lastly: Ask our town's residents and stakeholders for genuine input before taking actions that affect their neighborhoods and keep them informed of what is going to happen and when.





STEVE ERDELAN: MUSIC IS MY ART - SEWERS IS MY JOB


Rahway native, Steve Erdelan has a real sense of humor when it comes to how he juggles the station pump or been on call for sewage yin and yang of his work and his play. While holding the position of Sewer System Supervisor at the Rahway Department of Public Works, Steve is also a long-time musician and music archivist who is pragmatic in deciding which is more important. "It depends ... music can soothe the soul," he says, "but when your sewer's backed up you don't want me to rush over and play you a song, right?"

His life-long love of the arts began when he was just a kid growing up in Linden with nothing to do. To keep him out of trouble, his mother looked at him one day and pronounced, "You're a drummer." Then she marched him down to the local music store and bought him his first set of drums. He started banging on them and hasn't stopped. "Playing music is something I do just for the fun of it," says Steve. "It's a great pick-me-up and a way to make lots of friends."

WE TRANSFER

For the past 21 years, Steve has manned the emergencies so committing to a serious music career would have been impossible. He made the decision early on to look elsewhere to make a living so that his love of writing and making music could remain a pure pleasure. "If it's something you're gonna want to do for your whole life, you gotta pace yourself."

Steve's taste in music lends itself to hard rock and jazz but over the years he's played in a wide range of local bands from "Punk Rocker Overdrive" and "That 70's Band" to the "Polkats", a two-man polka band he formed with his then-boss at the old American Flange steel plant.

Nowadays, he teams up with partner Joe Danker in a classic rock party band they call "I Loathe Lucy" that plays around town at private parties and local events, like his own sister's wedding. Joe builds his own guitars, basses and amps to create a unique sound that they record in their own studio under the equally unique name of "Lighten Up, Francis."

Perhaps one of the biggest perks he's experienced with his devotion to music has been his penchant for bumping into rock legends. "I always find myself in the company of people like Joan Jett, Meatloaf, Ted Nugent and Jewel", remarks Steve, "I even bumped into Michael Jackson, TWICE. Once in the Garden when I had stolen his seat and once in a little music store on Wood Avenue of all places." It appears that the late King of Pop was looking for a small store he could shop in quietly and, before he left, racked up a \$900 purchase of his own Michael Jackson merchandise.

Steve recently surprised Tommy Chong, of Cheech and Chong fame, with a dub of a rare recording of the comedy duo's very first radio interview. As he looks to the future, one day he hopes to open an archival research center offering up his collection of over 2,500 music recordings and memorabilia for others to study and enjoy.

Rahway's arts and music scene gives him hope, especially seeing younger artists leaving cyberspace for awhile to perform live music. "Creativity is so important," says Steve E. Knicks (his current rock drummer pseudonym.) "It can save your life."




