



THE CICADAS ARE COMING

Noise to some and music to others, every summer the whirring sound of cicadas fill the

In a few weeks a dramatic event will take place that many may remember from 1996. The emergence of the 'Periodical 17 year Cicadas'. The sudden appearance of so many critters lead early Americans to confuse them with 'locust'. Actually true locust are swarms of grasshoppers, not cicadas.

As you walk though parks and fields you can already see the 1/2" holes the cicadas have prepared, patiently waiting underground for the correct evening to begin this timeless ritual.

> Temperature plays a key part in this timing.

Within 6 to 7 weeks the cicadas will have mated. laying their eggs in the twigs of trees where they will hatch, fall to the ground, dig into the soil and live until the next emergence 2030.

Dogs and cats

gorge themselves on these insects, sometimes making themselves sick. Thankfully cicadas are not toxic. Keep a close eye on your pets during this time.

Cover small young tress with a protective cloth in June to protect them from the egg laying females. This will not be a major problem for mature trees which can withstand a 'natural pruning'.





RAHWAY HIGH SCHOOL ROBOTICS TEAM 1228 EXCELS AGAIN

Rahway Robotics Team 1228 had an extremely successful experience at the US **FIRST** Mid-Atlantic Robotics Region Championship held at Stabler Arena at Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania from April 11 to 13, reaching the quarter-finals and ranking 19th out of a hundred teams in the entire region covering New Jersey, Pennsylvania, New York, and Delaware.

In the quarter-finals, the team lost two tight matches, the first by two points and the second by 6 points. Rahway's robot averaged over 48 points per match in the event and was selected to be part of the second seeds team. This competition closed an extremely successful season.

Previously, Team 1228 also made the quarterfinals at the district level competition held at Bridgewater-Raritan High School Bridgewater, New Jersey on April 6 and 7. Here Rahway won the Imagery Award! The Imagery Award celebrates attractiveness in engineering and outstanding visual aesthetic integration from the machine to the team appearance.

FIRST's mission is to inspire young people to be science and technology leaders, by engaging them in exciting mentor-based programs that build science, engineering and technology skills, that inspire innovation, and that foster wellrounded life capabilities including selfconfidence, communication, and leadership.

In Grades 9 through 12, 50,960 high-school students compete in 2,548 teams to build robots in six weeks from a common kit of parts provided by FIRST. These robots typically weigh up to 150 lbs. Two words summarize the ethos of FIRST: Gracious professionalism, treating one another with kindness and respect while competing fiercely, and "coopertition," the notion that "that teams can and should help and cooperate with each other even as they compete." Being on a FIRST team increases the likelihood of becoming an engineer four times and over \$16 million in scholarships are offered through FIRST.



Most motorists drive past the small granite memorial situated in front of the Soldiers and Sailors Monument on the triangle formed by Irving Street, Main Street, and Central Avenue without giving it much notice. Perhaps those walking on the sidewalk might take note of the inscription etched in the stone, "Erected by Friends under the auspices of the Civic Club of Rahway, N. J., 1916." If the curious pedestrian than walked around to the front they would find the words, "Dr. Holmes Memorial." After this brief survey the questions would be obvious: Who was Dr. Holmes, why was a monument erected in his memory, and why was it placed at the curb on Irving Street?

Dr. Charles Brigham Holmes (1848–1913) came to Rahway in 1874 and became a well–loved and respected physician who would take care of the needs of the Rahway citizenry for the next forty years. It was said that he was "A faithful physician and friend, who always showed kindly sympathy and interest for those under his care. To the poor and needy his heart and hand were always open. He knew neither creed, caste, nor color where duty called."

Besides his work as a doctor, Holmes was also involved with the city in official and civic affairs. He became Rahway's twenty—third mayor, first filling the unexpired term of Mayor John Daly who died in office in 1897, and then went on to win the next seven elections (back then the term for mayor was only one year). In civic affairs he was known to support any program that promoted the welfare and prosperity of the townspeople. He had a deep interest in educational matters and always paid close attention to anything connected with the schools.

When Dr. Holmes passed away on March 2, 1913 all business in the city was suspended during his funeral service. In his eulogy the Reverend L.Y. Graham, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, related, "He had the love



of all because he loved all. He was one of the kindest men I ever met. He was a man of wonderful helpfulness."

Shortly after his death a proposition was forwarded by prominent citizens to construct a drinking fountain in his memory that would supply refreshment for people, horses, and dogs. At the time there were no public fountains for man or beast within the city limits. A number of them had previously been located in various parts of Rahway, but all were shut down in 1908 by the Board of Health due to a glanders epidemic which effected horses. By 1913, because sanitary safeguards were in place that would ensure a clean water supply, it was agreed a fountain would serve as a fitting memorial to honor the beloved doctor.

A public funding campaign was established and in 1916 the 5'3" x 3'6" Vermont granite monument was ready to be unveiled. The structure was complete with a trough for watering horses (facing Irving Street), a place for dogs to drink (on both sides), and a fountain for pedestrians (on the sidewalk side).

At the dedication ceremony it was stated, "This fountain stands as a reminder of the great-hearted physician who invariably considered his own needs last of all, and gave his life to the aid of his fellow citizens, regardless of recompense."


