GATEWAY REGIONAL CHAMBER OF COMMERCE NAMES WINNERS AT 2012 MAYORS DINNER

The mayors and government officials of Union County held court at the annual Mayors Dinner of the Gateway Regional Chamber of Commerce Thursday, March 26, at the Newark Airport Marriot Hotel. Common themes included the state's 2 percent property tax cap, high store occupancy and area development.

Award winners were:

- Joseph Menza of Hillside as Mayor of the Year for his perseverance in promoting city interests despite significant opposition;
- Chris Cotter of Summit as Business Administrator of the Year for making Summit a business-friendly town;
- Police Chief Eric Mason of Cranford as Public Safety Official of the Year;
- Scotch Plains Mayor Nancy Malool as Speaker of the Night for her light-hearted poetry, accompanied by bongos.

The collective overviews of the county's municipalities included: the challenges and successes of meeting the state's property tax cap; Fanwood and Westfield retaining 100 and 90 percent store occupancy during the recession, respectively; Linden moving forward with development of 108 acres of former General Motors property; Rahway's continuing expansion of facilities dedicated to the arts; New Providence allowing alcohol to be served in restaurants; and more than 1,000 new jobs coming to Hillside due to business development.

"Each year the mayors' presentations reflect the issues towns and cities throughout the state are facing," said James Coyle, Gateway president. "While the night is light-hearted and fun we hear both the realities of economic pressures and the pride in addressing these challenges. Municipal government always is demanding and often thankless. Once each year we try to say thanks."

Mrs. Stempniewicz and Mrs. Hrdina's Room 204, working on community based instruction, collected needed items for St. Hubert's Animal Shelter. They were assisted by KMS's Student Council, who posted flyers and help collect the items.

BRYCE WILSON BRINGS TUSKEGEE AIRMAN TO KAWAMEEH MIDDLE SCHOOL

Bryce Wilson, a Kawameeh Middle School seventh grade student worked to bring Shade M. Lee a World War II Tuskegee Airman to his history class. Bryce's father, James P. Wilson and Edward Graf, Bryce's history teacher, helped to coordinate the event.

Bryce led off the experience a few days before by presenting a poster and an oral presentation about the Tuskegee Airmen. He spoke about the infamous group of African American expert fighter pilots who helped defeat the axis powers in World War II. Bryce spoke of their heroism, training and equipment. His talk, as well as his poster, were very detailed. The students were quite impressed.

The students then felt as if they had a good foundational knowledge of the Tuskegee

Airmen when Mr. Lee and his wife addressed the class. Mr. Lee went into further detail and personal experiences. He also spoke of suffering through discrimination due to his skin color. Mr. Lee stated that the African-American servicemen had to fight the enemy and discriminatory practices. When asked why the men were so driven to serve, Mr. Lee stated that, even though there was blatant discrimination, he and the other Tuskegee Airmen still were proud Americans and did their duty to their country.

Bryce Wilson was instrumental in making this event a success. The students learned from a once in a lifetime experience. He helped to show the bravery and honor of the Tuskegee Airmen. Bryce clearly helped show why we should all be proud of these brave heroes.

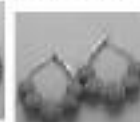

TWO UNION STUDENTS WIN STATE READING AWARDS

Students in two Union Township schools will receive Enthusiastic Reader Awards from the New Jersey Association of School Librarians (NJASL) and the New Jersey Reading Association (NJRA). Enthusiastic Reader Awards are presented annually to nine students in New Jersey who exhibit an enthusiasm for reading, sharing books, using books for a variety of purposes such as research and literature appreciation, reading independently on a

voluntary basis, and using school and/or public libraries. Regional winners are selected from northern, central, and southern New Jersey at three levels: kindergarten through fifth grade, sixth through eighth grade, and ninth through twelfth grade.

Both Union Township winners were nominated by their school librarians. Helly Florian, grade 8, was nominated for the statewide award by Kawameeh Middle School

Librarian Mary Lewis. Helly was a new seventh grade student at Kawameeh last year, and when she arrived, she spoke little English. However, she uses the school library regularly and reads extensively, and her teachers note that as her English has improved dramatically, her school work is often superior to that of her native-English-speaking classmates. According to Lewis, "I cannot think of another student more deserving of this award. I have enjoyed seeing the reading level and length of Helly's book choices increase, and this year, to accommodate her extensive reading, we've even borrowed books from other libraries for her."

Lucia Lacourtina, grade 1, was nominated by Washington Elementary School Librarian Lynne Mancinelli with a recommendation from Lucia's first grade teacher, Kathy Arminio. Arminio describes Lucia as an "endearing bibliophile," with a vast collection of books, a love of reading, and talent as a writer as well. One of Lucia's recent works is titled: "I Love Books." Mancinelli notes that Lucia loves to learn, and enjoys visits to the library as well as the book store.

The students will receive their awards at a luncheon celebration on May 5, where they and their parents and nominating librarians will have an opportunity to meet award-winning illustrator, Chris Soentpiet. In addition, the students will be recognized locally at the May 15 Board of Education meeting at Union High School. About 120 Enthusiastic Reader Award nominees from Union Township will receive certificates at a reception just prior to the board meeting.
