

#### STAR-LEDGER COLUMNIST, MARK DI IONNO, TO SPEAK AT HISTORICAL SOCIETY MEETING

Mark Di Ionno, career journalist and fourtime winner of the New Jersey Press Association's first-place award for column writing, will speak at Connecticut Farms Presbyterian Church, 888 Stuyvesant Avenue, Union, on Sunday, September 9, 2012, at 2:30

In addition to his twice-weekly column in The Star-Ledger, New Jersey's largest newspaper, his "Mark in the Morning" column appears daily on ni.com. Mr. Di Ionno is the author of three award-winning nonfiction books. New Jersey's Coastal Heritage and A Guide to New Jersey's Revolutionary War Trail won the New Jersey Academic Alliance Award, which is presented by a consortium of librarians and historians. Backroads, New Jersey was named among the most notable New Jersey books (1995–2005) by the New Jersey Center for the Book.

Mark's debut novel, The Last Newspaperman, focuses on the Lindbergh baby case, which celebrity-obsessed media of today. Di Ionno's appearance coincides with the novel's national launch this fall.

"While much of the action is set in New Jersey in the 1930s, The Last Newspaperman is not strictly a historical novel," Di Ionno said. "My goal was to connect the past with the contemporary, sensationalist media dominates the airwaves, newsstands, and internet."

The protagonist, Frederick Haines, former star tabloid reporter for the New York Daily Mirror is nearing the end of his life. He gives the narrator, a young reporter, the back stories on the Lindbergh baby kidnapping, the Hindenburg disaster, the deadly Morro Castle cruise ship fire, and the hysteria that followed Orson Welles's "War of the Worlds" broadcast. The novice learns that the Lindbergh kidnapping was about media intrusion into the private lives of celebrities; the Hindenburg explosion was



man who, it was later discovered, set the fire; and the "War of the Worlds" broadcast presaged alarmist reactions to new technology.

Di Ionno is the father of six children, who reside with him in Mountain Lakes. New Jersey.
