



Johnson, has been accepted by Yale University and will begin attending classes there this September. Johnson, who has maintained a perfect 4.0 grade point average during his high school years, is also an outstanding athlete. He has been a member of the varsity football squad since his sophomore year.

On this past Saturday, January 29, the talented senior spoke at two assemblies at the Union School District's Township "Saturday Academy", a special prep school-like weekend program where students receive additional classes in mathematics and language arts. In assembly Johnson addressed each approximately two hundred students who came from grade 5 through 8, and who sat politely in the "no jeans-no sneakers" dress code that is part of the academy.

Johnson began his address by telling the younger students that he had attended the same public schools they are attending. He then encouraged them to make a plan for themselves, seek out challenging courses, and work hard at their studies - making sure to give the extra effort that will ensure success. "Seek balance,"

Union Township High School senior, Everett Johnson advised his younger colleagues. "Strive to mix your academics with athletics and extracurricular activities so that you give the right amount of attention to everything. It's not easy."

> The soon-to-be Yale freshman thanked his parents, who were present in the audience, for helping him to concentrate on his studies. He related how they would not ask him to walk the dog or take out the garbage while he was doing his homework.

> Accompanying Johnson on the assembly's program were Union Township High School principal, Ed Gibbons, and the high school's supervisor of the Guidance Department, Bridget Jackson. Both echoed Johnson's formula of goal setting and hard work.

> Several parents of Saturday Academy students attended the presentations.

> Following the speeches and a question-andanswer period, many pupils of the Saturday Academy crowded around Everett Johnson asking for his autograph.

> Students in this year's senior class at Union Township High School have also been accepted to many other fine schools such as Brown, Rutgers, and Boston University.

"National Battery Day' affords our employees the opportunity to educate consumers about how to extend the life of their batteries," said Angel Cartagena, owner of the Union, NJ, Batteries Plus store. "Seeing that the average household has over 21 battery powered devices, we thought what better day to remind customers to check their batteries in these devices and make sure they're powered up.



THE EXPERTS AT BATTERIES PLUS IN UNION, NJ OFFER THE FOLLOWING 10 BATTERY TIPS:

- Turn off non-essentials Turning off the LCD or other accessories that are not in use and decreasing the LCD brightness of your netbook/laptop or cell phone screen will extend battery runtime. Turn off Bluetooth when you are not using it.
- Don't expose to extreme temperatures Storing a battery at extremely high or low temperatures and in areas with high humidity can wear it out, so be sure to bring it in from the car on cold winter nights and hot summer days. Never attempt to charge a laptop, cell phone, or car battery that is colder than 60 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Power cycling Turning your cell phone off while charging not only will help extend the life of the battery; it also acts as a reset similar to your computer. Power cycling, turning the cell phone off and then on again, will allow your cell phone to use the optimum tower for its location and clears the cache of the phone.
- A new netbook or laptop battery generally must be charged a minimum of 4 hours before using it for the first time and needs to be fully charged and fully discharged up to four times before performing at full capacity. This is called "initializing" and allows the battery to fully charge by calibrating the fuel gauge so that it "learns" what full is.
- If a netbook/laptop battery has been inactive for a long time you will notice a decrease in runtime. After the netbook/laptop battery has

- been fully charged and fully discharged three to four times, the battery runtime should be restored.
- When relying on battery power, operate the netbook/laptop or cell phone battery until the low battery warning is given and it is fully drained. Then fully recharge the battery.
- Remove the battery from the netbook/laptop when operating on fixed (AC) power for long periods of time to protect the battery from heat and overcharge. This is the most common cause of premature failure for netbook/laptop batteries. Store the battery it in a cool, clean, dry place away from heat and metal objects.
- To extend the life of a laptop battery, defragment computers regularly, reduce the number of external devices and programs running in the background and keep computers in hibernate mode, not standby.
- Loose car battery hold-downs leave the battery subject to vibrations, which can cause the active material to shed from the car battery plate grids, resulting in a shorter battery life. Make sure the battery cables are tightly connected that the battery is firmly secured to its mounting bracket.
- Corroded car battery terminals resulting from sulfuric acid overflows from the lead acid cells within the battery, or moisture buildups, can also cause car battery failure. Make sure the battery terminals are corrosion free and do visual inspections to ensure the battery is dirt free as well.
