BUSINESSES AND STUDENTS VOLUNTEER TO BUILD A DREAM

On Sunday November 20th, the community came together for the greater good. The organization "Be the Change" Kean University led by Dr. Norma Bowe participated in the firstever Dream Room Makeover.

Dream Room Makeovers is an organization that supports families with children who have life-challenging illnesses or disabilities by giving the child the bedroom of their dreams. The goal is to create a space that only the child can imagine, while also addressing their unique medical needs. All makeovers are made possible by donations and volunteers.

The first recipients of their efforts are the members of the Willoughby-Hazel family from Union, N.J. Danielle Willoughby is a single mom with three children. The two youngest have a neuromuscular disease called spinal muscular atrophy and are in wheelchairs.

Over 80 volunteers pithed in from Kean University, Home Depot and area construction companies. Access Storage in Kenilworth provided the boxes and moving supplies along with the use of their box truck to move the donations.

The project couldn't have been done without the generosity of several area businesses. Big Apple Pizza at 700 Boulevard in Kenilworth provided a hot lunch Italian buffet for over 100 volunteers. Ralphs' Italian Ice provided dessert, I Love Bagels donated bagels and Manhattan Bagels of Union donated the spreads. The volunteers were so grateful for the "fuel" that fueled the project.

The entire house was "made-over" to accommodate the special needs of this family. Happy holidays will take on a new meaning for them this year. "Be the Change" Kean University thanks everyone for making this project such a success and we look forward to many more collaborative projects!




FIFTH GRADE MATH BEE





On Sunday, December 11th, a gathering of some of New Jersey's top Rock bands and musicians gathered at The Cup in Linden to perform for a worthy cause. Blank-Fest NJ VI raised over \$500 and collected coats and blankets for the homeless advocacy organization Monarch Housing of Cranford.

The concert was headlined by East Coast Tom Petty Tribute Band Damn the Torpedoes. Other local bands that participated were Splooge, Mike Zuko, Off The Record, Stupid Should Hurt, Our Black Friday, Little Raymond and the Rhythm Preachers, Bell Bottom Blues and The Baghdaddios from NYC.

BOGAN NAMED GATORADE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Committee Meeting Jamauri Bogan, a Union High School sophomore received a Mayor's Award from Mayor Joseph Florio. Bogan was recently awarded the Gatorade Player of the Year. Bogan is the second Gatorade New Jersey Football Player of the Year to be chosen from Union High School.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school sports and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

"Having a young man like Jamauri win this award is special not only to me but also for our program and everyone who has been involved in the program," stated UHS Head Football Coach Brian Sheridon, "He is such a hard-worker and it was an amazing athletic accomplishment having him win this award as a sophomore and he is a tremendous leader."

The 5-foot-9, 165-pound sophomore running

On December 13th during the Township back rushed for 2,260 yards and 27 touchdowns on 258 carries this past season, leading the Farmers (7-3) to the Group IV, North II state quarterfinals. A preseason Honorable Mention All-State selection as named by ESPNHS, Bogan eclipsed 200 rushing yards in seven of his team's 10 games. A First Team All-Union County selection, he rushed for 1,100 yards and 17 touchdowns as a freshman in 2010. Bogan is not only a great athlete but he has maintained a 3.09 GPA in the classroom. In addition to donating his time as a youth football instructor, he has volunteered extensively on behalf of his church.


