NORTHFIELD BANK CELEBRATES THE OPENING OF THEIR NINTH NEW JERSEY BRANCH





SGT. BOLL PRESENTED WITH MAYOR'S AWARD

Sergeant Michael Boll was presented with the Township of Union's Mayor's Award on December 18th, 2012. Boll, husband to wife Trish and father to twin daughters, Victoria and Jacqueline, is a graduate of both Union High School and Rutgers' University, and holds a degree in Criminal Justice. He was appointed to the Union Police Department in July of 1994 and promoted to Sergeant in April 2007.

During his career as a police officer, Sergeant Boll has participated in programs and services such as patrol, D.A.R.E., bicycle units, and street crimes. He has also used his title for other good; becoming a prominent figure in the community and organizing multiple fundraisers to aid and promote awareness for charitable causes including the annual Torch Run and the Polar Bear Plunge, which both benefit the Special Olympics. In 2010 the proactive officer formed the Township of Union Police Department Honor Guard and has been the face of the notable Santa-in-Blue program since he established it in 1995. This year, in the wake of Hurricane Sandy, Boll expanded the Toy Drive to include all of the affected children throughout the state. He worked tirelessly to promote the event even lobbying Union's own, Ray Liotta and other celebrities to lend a helping hand.

Thanks to Sergeant Boll, Santa-in-Blue is a continually a tremendous success. Mayor Joseph Florio commended Boll on "his selfless, untiring dedication to the community of Union."

REGISTER FOR EMBERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS

The Township of Union has contracted with Emergency Communications Network, LLC to license its CodeRED high-speed notification solution. The CodeRED system provides Union officials the ability to quickly deliver messages to targeted areas or the entire township.

Mayor Clifton People Jr., cautioned that such systems are only as good as the telephone number database supporting them. "If your phone number is not in the database, you will not be called." One of the reasons the CodeRED system was selected is it gives individuals and businesses the ability to add their own phone numbers directly into the system's database, which is an extremely important feature.

"No one should automatically assume his or her phone number is included," Mayor People said, urging all individuals and businesses to log onto the Township of Union website, www.uniontownship.com, and follow the link to the "CodeRED Community Notification Enrollment" page.

Those without Internet access may call the Administration Office (908) 851-8500, Monday through Friday, (8AM-5PM) to supply their

information over the phone. Required information includes first and last name, street address (physical address, no P.O. boxes), city, state, zip code, and primary phone number, additional phone numbers can be entered as well.

All businesses should register, as well as all individuals who have unlisted phone numbers, who have changed their phone number or address within the past year, and those who use a cellular phone or VoIP phone as their primary number. "CodeRED allows geographically based delivery, which means street addresses are required to ensure emergency notification calls are received by the proper individuals in a given situation. The system works for cell phones too, but we need to have an associated street address to provide relevant messages," Mayor People explained.

CodeRED gives those who want to be included an easy and secure method for inputting information. The data collected will only be used for emergency notification purposes. Questions should be directed to the Administration Office (908) 851-8500.




SHELLS FOR NJ SHORES
