UNION HIGH SCHOOL PROUDLY PRESENTS CATS



Union High School's PAC produces two shows each year, and this spring they have chosen to do "Cats". But the group is very much a family and Mosser and Williams try to be straightforward with the performers. Motta mentioned, "It's all worth it in the end, and so you understand when the adults get angry or irritated, because they're working hard for us. When you finally see it on stage, it's just so worth it. Mosser explains that a well-managed schedule keeps them all from getting overwhelmed.

> Cause 4 Paws began in 1999 when President Diane met fellow member Christine while walking their dogs near the Union Animal Shelter. It is still a small group with eight core members and several volunteers, many of whom provide foster care for the animals. The organization fundraises to support veterinary costs, but the foster families tend to cover dayto-day costs. The group takes in strays and pets from municipal shelters, among other sources. Cause 4 Paws participates in adoption events every Saturday, usually at the Madison Pet Shop and on the second Saturday of every month at the Petco in East Hanover. If potential adopters cannot come to these events, foster parents welcome them to visit the animals at home. They see that once people hold these animals, it is hard to let go.

> Friends and family of Grace and Erika Rocha, both of whom died of ovarian cancer, founded GRACEful Hope more recently. The group participated in Revlon's Run/Walk for Women prior to this, but began heavily fundraising in 2009. Member Stephanie advised women that the illness is hard to detect, and if something feels wrong, it is better just to go to the doctor.

TOM MAHONEY HONORED

At a recent meeting of the Union Township Committee, Pearly Harbor survivor Tom Mahoney was awarded the New Jersey Distinguished Service Medal. This is one of the most prestigious awards given by the state. Presentation was made by U.S. Navy and Coast Guard officials including Captain Fuzz Harrison, Lt. Commander J.J. Dunne, Captain Gordon Loebl, Senor Chief Reed, Public Affairs Officer Michael Brady and Paul Kane, Militia of New Jersey.

Capt. Harrison spoke of Mahoney's war record which included serving during every day of World War II, from the Pearl Harbor attack in December 1941 through the Japanese surrender in August 1945. After his ship was lost at Pearl, Tom was assigned to the destroyer U.S.S. O'Bannon, and after 15 battles finally escorted the Missouri in Tokyo Bay for the Japanese surrender.

The citation accompanying the medal reads: The New Jersey Distinguished Service Medal is awarded to Electrician Mate 1st Class Thomas F. Mahoney by the Governor of the State Chris Christie under the authority of 38 Alfa 15 Tack2 for Meritorious Service in Sea Operations in the Asiatic Pacific Theatre of operations during World War II. It is signed by Governor Christie.

Surrounded by his wife Clara, Township and Navy officials, fellow veterans from the American Legion and VFW Posts in Union and friends, Tom give an emotional thank you to all, saying this was the finest recognition he ever received. Although he has been a spokesman for keeping the memories of Pearl Harbor alive for many years and is no stranger to receiving awards and recognitions, he was clearly moved as he thanked the Governor, Union Township officials and naval personnel. He congratulated the people of Union for their patriotism and support of veterans while calling our servicemen and women the greatest in the world and urged total support for them.

In a final tribute, Mayor People announced that the new veteran's park being built in Union will be named the Thomas F. Mahoney Military Park, and presented Tom with a large picture of what it will look like when it is completed.
