



STUDENTS HOLD FUNERAL FOR DEAD VERBS

Seventh grade students, teachers, and administrators at Kawameeh Middle School gathered together for a unique "funeral" on Friday, October 14th. As part of a language arts lesson on verbs, students were given a list of twenty-four words that they could no longer use in formal writing. These words were dubbed "dead verbs," and in an official ceremony, students literally buried them under a tree behind the school. With KMS band members playing violins, trumpets, and flutes to set the solemn mood, Language Arts/Social Studies Supervisor K-7, Bob Ghiretti, read an enthusiastic eulogy commemorating the loss of the "dead verbs" and encouraging the use of their "strong, vivid relatives." Many students,


who were also asked to write brief, rhyming eulogies, and recited their work to the crowd. KMS seventh graders, Mr. Ghiretti, and Language Arts teachers including Rich Brown, Jacquie Fernandez, Deana Rittenhouse and Nikki Toccaceli were recognized for the efforts during the October 18th BOE meeting.

In her book, Blowing Away the State Writing Assessment Test: Four Steps to Better Writing, Jane Bell Kiester writes: "The key is that in good literature and well-liked books, "dead" verbs are used fairly sparingly. Instead, strong, vivid, active, "showing" verbs abound in descriptions, action, and dialogue.

The use of strong vivid verbs

= better writing = higher scores..."


