10TH ANNIVERSARY 9/11 MEMORIAL CEREMONY

On September 9th the Township of Union remembered those that lost their lives on the tragic day of September 11, 2001. The 10th Anniversary Memorial Ceremony at the Town Hall Memorial Plaza brought members of the community together for a moving tribute.

The Union High School JR ROTC commenced the ceremony with the lowering of the flags followed by the National Anthem played by the Union High School Band. Essays were read by two Union High School students based on the theme "How did these last 10 years shape you? And how will your generation keep the memory alive?"

The memorial ceremony also highlighted the 9-11 Generation 5th graders whom marched at the ceremony representing the generation that was born on that tragic year of 2001. The students marched to the ceremony from Connecticut Farms lead by Superintendent Dr. Patrick Martin, Union Police Department Honor Guard and parents. This year's flags were presented to each one of the Township's schools. A student representative from each school received the flag.

In the event of rain, the Parade will be cancelled. However, the costumes will be judged in Connecticut Farms School at 2:00 p.m.



KAWAMEEH STUDENT TO BE AWARDED THE GEORGE WASHINGTON HONOR MEDAL

Kawameeh does it again! Last year's Kawameeh Middle School President Luis Alvarado won the Valley Forge Freedom Foundation's national contest. He came in first place out of thousands of students across our country. Luis will be awarded the George Washington Honor Medal.

Luis accepted the challenge of writing an essay on "What it Means to be Patriotic". He was encouraged and instructed by Mr. Jack Soroka. The two had a unique experience. Mr. Soroka, a World War II naval hero and educator of over 60 years served as a mentor to Luis.

Luis was inspired by Mr. Soroka to write the essay. He heard of the senior man's experience and was honored to write the essay. Luis was also assisted by English teacher Jennifer Winters and History teacher Ed Graf.

In the essay, Luis referred to some of his family's experiences and how far they have come, particularly due to hard work and determination. This was especially so with the struggles of his great grandfather.

The hard work that Luis shows, his willingness to learn from elders such as Jack Soroka, his patriotic spirit, and his evident leadership demonstrated as Student Council President, will certainly enable him to succeed now at the Union County Magnet School as well as in the future.

Summer is over, school has begun and children have returned to the classroom. With all of the excitement related to back to school, sometimes important things can be overlooked. The Township of Union Police Department urges students, parents, and especially drivers to be aware of the increase in vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Parents should take time to review the basic safety rules with children, including the routes they should be taking to and from school and the locations of school crossing guards. Encourage use of the same route each day. Young children should be advised of basic safety rules, including the importance of not talking to strangers.

Parents who drive students to school should remember to pull up to the curb before letting children out and only park in designated areas around schools. Disregard of parking regulations, especially around schools, can create dangerous situations for both drivers and children.

Sergeant Robert Christie, Supervisor of the Union Police Department's Traffic Bureau feels children are never too young to learn good safety rules. "Learning how to stay safe is something that can be fun and doesn't have to be frightening," advises Christie. "Children need to be taught how to keep themselves safe as they grow and venture out into the expanded world of school and community, although the Police Department and other community helpers are there to provide assistance, parents are often their child's first and best teachers in this area," added the Sergeant. Mayor Florio encouraged parents to sit down with their children and to advise them about basic safety rules. "Parents

are a child's best and first teacher when it comes to safety," stated Mayor Florio. "Safety should never be overlooked."

Parents of students who walk to school (Middle and High School students) should be aware that walking in the street rather then on the sidewalk is not only dangerous for the student, but is a violation of a traffic law 39:4-34. (Where sidewalks are provided it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to walk along and upon an adjacent roadway.)

Parents of students who ride bicycles to school should know that any person under 17 years of age is required to wear a properly fitted and fastened bicycle helmet. The safety of the students should be a concern of all, so following these rules will help make Union safe for the children on their way to and from school.

According to Union's Police Director, Daniel Zieser, the Department will be utilizing strict enforcement when it comes to motor vehicle and pedestrian violations. "Strict traffic enforcement and summonsing of all violators is an effective tool in reducing motor vehicle accidents and protecting the safety of local residents, said Zieser. "The serious injury of one person due to disregard of traffic laws is one too many. We have to do everything we can as police officers to modify driving behaviors that are obvious causes of accidents and injuries," added the Director.

The Union Police Department also advises parents to discourage children from taking items of value to school such as cell phones, i-pods, mp-3 plays, expensive jewelry or other costly items. These items are often misplaced or can become the target of a theft.
