### **SQUAD 4 NOW AT YOUR SERVICE**

The Union Fire Department recently put into service a 2012 rescue/pumper known as Squad 4. The vehicle is a state-of- the- art 2012 Spartan ERV Gladiator equipped with a 28' boom. The boom is capable of providing 1,000 gallons of water or foam per minute, has (6) 750 watt flood lights, capable of lifting 1,000 pounds and a vision boom camera system.

At present, there are only 3 of its kind in the nation and only one in New Jersey. In addition to a full range of EMS equipment, Squad 4 carries

a vast inventory of hydraulic, electric and air rescue tools. The Squad carries 750 gallons of water, 50 gallons of foam concentrate and is capable of producing 1,500 gallons of water and 500 gallons of firefighting foam.

Squad 4 replaces a 1988 apparatus with almost 500,000 engine miles. The Union Fire Department is now capable of having two rescue/pumpers in service (Squad 4 and Squad 41) when necessary. Both units are equipped with similar rescue and firefighting equipment.

### UNION CELEBRATES RESTORATION OF THE LITTLE HOUSE, HONORING 100 YEARS OF GIRL SCOUTING

On Saturday, September 15, 2012, the Mayor little house: "We want to make sure that the girl Union Township. The Girl Scouts of Union, NJ are part of a rich national history. National Leadership Founder Juliette Gordon Low held the very first Girl Scout meeting a century ago in Savannah, Georgia. Together with just 18 girls, Low embarked on an ambitious mission to provide young American women with the opportunity to develop their leadership potential. Today, Girl Scouts is the largest, longest-running, and most effective leadership program for girls in the nation and in the world.

Rosa Santos, troop leader for Union, praised the citizens for ensuring the girl scouts continuing success in the coming hundred years.



### **FINDING YOUR FAMILY ROOTS**

James Amemasor, PhD, will conduct a seminar on "Finding Your Genealogical Roots Utilizing the New Jersey Historical Society Library" on Tuesday, October 16, 2012 at 7 PM in the Union Public Library. The public is invited to this admission-free program.

The primary goal of this lecture is to acquaint audiences with the rich Genealogical resources of the New Jersey Historical Society (NJHS) and how the staffs of this repository assist patrons to research their family histories.

The local militia and the New Jersey brigade of the Continental Army thwarted the British effort with their victories at the Battle of Connecticut Farms (now Union) and the Battle of Springfield. On Sunday, September 30, members of the Union Township Historical Society (UTHS) completed the first leg of the 12-mile Victory Trail--a colonial history walking tour, which approximates the route the

British used as part of their strategy to attack George Washington and his men in Morristown during the American Revolution.






