TEACHER HONORED FOR PATRIOTIC EFFORTS

At the township committee meeting held on February 22, 2011 Mr. Ed Graf received the Mayor's Award for excellence in Union Township. Mr. Graf was recognized by Mayor Joseph Florio for various patriotic efforts.

Mr. Graf serves as a History teacher at Kawameeh Middle School and vice president of the Union Township Historical Society.

Mr. Graf has made several contributions to the township and the nation. He has organized both Kawameeh's and the town's bicentennial colonial reenactments. Ed has sent hundreds of boxes of supplies and letters with his students over the past nine years to American troops serving in Iraq and Afghanistan. Ed is also a former infantry soldier having served as a company commander's radio operator and an infantry team leader while stationed in Ft. Lewis, WA and the Jungle Warfare School at Ft. Sherman, Panama.

Mr. Graf has used these experiences to help instill patriotism and pride in Kawameeh's students by coordinating the school's last three Proud to be an American Day events. These days consisted of a ceremony having the entire student body wearing red, white and blue on the school's field honoring the citizens of Union who died in defense of our nation during the Vietnam War. Kawameeh alumnus Wayne Russo who was a victim on 9/11 was honored as well as his father, World War II hero Arthur Russo. There was a 12 gun salute by the local veterans groups, taps was played, the school band and chorus performed, the National Guard landed several helicopters and last year the U.S. Army Golden Knights Parachute Team, the world's best sky diving team, landed on the

school's field in a sky diving demonstration.

Ed gave a short speech upon receiving the award thanking Mayor Florio and the township committee. Ed also stated that he is continuing these efforts as a member of the town's Memorial Day Parade committee. He stressed that he would not be able to have accomplished these things without the support of Mr. Harold Bell, his former principal and mentor, Jason Malanda his current principal and Bob Johnson from the VFW and Charles Capaccio from the American Legion. Ed emphatically stated that he believes in Union and the United States of America and this is what drives him in these projects.



THREE CUPS OF TEA

The students at Connecticut Farms School in civics. Union, NJ have completed a unit of study based on the novel "Three Cups of Tea".

Fourth grade students teamed up with second grade students to investigate the culture and needs of children in Pakistan and Afghanistan. Students worked together to read the book "Listen to the Wind" and shared e-readers to complete the novel "Three Cups of Tea". Shared activities included making collages, participating in a lesson which required students to record their answers with a stick, drawing in the sand, and watching video clips about housing, food, religion and education in remote villages.

Students "built a bridge" to demonstrate the need for reaching out to build bridges of friendship. Participants worked collaboratively to design map flip books, and a culture quilt. The novels were used to provide instruction in language arts skills, math, social studies and

Based on research, students learned that in these remote regions of the world, just a penny can buy a pencil, start an education, and transform a life. In a region where terrorist organizations recruit uneducated, illiterate children, that pencil can empower a child to read, write and learn.

Students organized a school assembly and initiated a "Pennies for Peace" campaign.

Proceeds were sent to the Central Asia Institute which provides education and literacy programs especially for girls in remote mountain regions of Central Asia. Children in over four hundred mountain villages in northern Pakistan and Afghanistan are waiting...hoping to learn in a new school.

Connecticut Farms students hope to help build a bridge of peace, one penny at a time, offering alternatives to the cycle of terrorism, war and ignorance.

SCHOOL CELEBRATES DIVERSITY AT MULTICULTURAL HERITAGE FESTIVAL


Kawameeh Middle School, in Union games, brochures, and a variety of art forms and Township, will present "America's Heritage: Many Parts, One Family," a multicultural heritage festival, at the school on Thursday, April 7, 2011 from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. This annual event is a celebration of the rich diversity of cultures represented among Kawameeh's students and staff. The 2008 Multicultural Heritage Festival was featured on New Jersey Network Public Television in October, 2008 during episode four of Classroom Closeup NJ.

The festival gives students an opportunity to share information about their own ethnic backgrounds with parents and community members, and gives members of the school community a chance to see what students have learned about the cultures of their classmates. Multicultural music, dancing, and cooking performances and demonstrations are scheduled throughout the evening in Kawameeh's auditorium. The gym and hallways are filled with displays of student projects in all subject areas. Past displays have included posters, slide presentations, models, handmade dolls and puppets, masks, charts and graphs, poetry,

crafts. Activities for young children often include storytelling, face or henna painting, or simple craft demonstrations done by Kawameeh students. As they view the exhibits, people who attend can sample foods from different countries donated by Kawameeh families.

There is no admission charge to attend the festival, but students must be accompanied by an adult. All attendees are asked to sign in when they arrive, and if they wish to identify a cultural affiliation, we tally that information. In the past two years, attendance has been between 700 and 900 people representing between 30 and 35 different cultural backgrounds.


