



# HURRICANE SANDY PROGRAM.

A little blurb could say: that the meeting room was packed to capacity, it was basically standing room only. The program started with a slide show presentation of photos, most of them taken by Amy Ellis Nutt (2011Pulitzer Prize winner) about the devastation post-Sandy in the Shore area. It was fascinating to listen to the stories they told about what they saw, such as a full-size walk-in freezer from a restaurant, which had floated away and was found intact several blocks from its original place. Although we saw our share of destruction in Morris and Somerset Counties, and most of us had to contend with days or weeks being without power, our problems paled in comparison to the people who saw their whole lives being washed away, houses completely destroyed, where the only thing left standing were cinder blocks. Both Amy and Mark are obviously very good writers, so their descriptions were very visual and some stories just hearbreaking. The attendees were very engaged and at the end there was a very spirited Q&A session.
