### **CRUSADERS GET ADVICE AND GUIDANCE FROM NFL STAR**

Members of Arthur L. Johnson High School Crusaders football team defensive line received some well received advice from an expert in the field recently: retired National Football League star Tony Siragusa. Known as "The Goose" in his playing days, Siragusa visited the football field at Arthur L. Johnson High School to speak with the student athletes and to work with them on the field throughout a team practice.

Tony "The Goose" Siragusa graduated from and starred at both Brearley High School in Kenilworth and the University of Pittsburgh and then went on to play 12 full seasons in the NFL as a defensive nose tackle. After completing seven seasons with the Indianapolis Colts, he joined the Baltimore Ravens for his remaining five seasons, which included winning a Super Bowl the Ravens' 2000 season. The Siragusa family has ties to Clark as his father attended Arthur L. Johnson Regional High School, played football for the Crusaders, and earned the nickname "Mr. Regional" during his time at the school. Current Crusader head football coach Mike Mancino was a high school teammate of Siragusa's at Brearley High School in Kenilworth.






## **7TH GRADERS INVESTIGATE THEME**



Four staff members who recently received state-wide recognition were honored at the Clark School District's Superintendent's Convocation held recently.

The Convocation, a district-wide gathering of the entire staffs of all five Clark schools, is used as a forum for celebrating district successes, among other agenda items.

Superintendent Kenneth Knops called up honoree, highlighted each their accomplishment, and presented each with a certificate. Among those honored were Arthur L. Johnson High School Field Hockey Coach Katrina (Anderson) Poskay, who was recognized by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association when she received Field Hockey Award through selection of the association's Honors Award Committee. In an illustrious career as the district's field hockey coach, Poskay has built the program up to its current status as a state powerhouse, with 14 alumni of the program now playing field hockey at the collegiate level.

Also honored was Frank K. Hehnly Teacher Nicole Parlavecchio, whose cutting edge technology based program "Teaching, Technology, and the Tennessee Titans" was selected as an "Innovation in Special Education" recipient by the New Jersey School Boards Association. Parlavecchio's program was one of only eight special education programs honored state-wide by the NJSBA.

The final two honorees were Assistant





## **5K RUN/WALK SET FOR OCTOBER 5 IN CLARK**

Miracles for Myeloma, a 5K Run/Walk, is scheduled for Saturday, October 5, 2013 in Oak Ridge Park, Clark. The course, staged entirely within the park on paved paths, is USATF certified and people of all ages are encouraged to participate in this community-wide fundraiser.

Multiple Myeloma is a cancer of plasma cells which attacks and destroys bone. The two founders of the race are Clark resident Sheree Pask, a Myeloma survivor and a teacher at a Westfield nursery school, and Westfield resident Gina Klemm, whose brother Frank Guarino died of the disease in 2012.

Entry fees are \$30 per walker or runner. Children's fees are \$15. Runners may also register at the door. For pre-registered participants, T-shirts will be distributed. Awards will be given for best times in various categories. The proceeds will be donated to the International Myeloma Foundation (IMF).

Registration will open at 7:30 a.m. with the race officially starting at 9 a.m.

Featured that Saturday is a memorial path where maroon and white balloons will be tied to placards with names of people being honored with a donation. Maroon is designated for patients living with Myeloma and white in remembrance of those who have passed on from the disease.

Mrs. Pask, currently in remission, has undergone chemotherapy and two stem cell transplants over the last few years. "I am blessed with a wonderful support network of family members, friends and co-workers and doctors and nurses who have helped me immensely during my cancer journey," she said. "Now I am calling upon all of you to help us get to the finish line...finding a cure for Multiple Myeloma."

will be held at ALJ High School, 365 Westfield Ave, Clark.





## **ANNUAL MUSEUM "GHOSTS OF THE PAST" CEMETERY TOUR**



Alex recently Association (MDTMA) has announced that their annual "Ghosts of the Past" Rahway Cemetery Tour this year will once again celebrate the rich history of Rahway (once a part of Clark) through the stories of the city's past residents. The tours will take place over two days, Saturday and Sunday, October 5 and 6 from 1-4 p.m. in Rahway Cemetery, St. Georges Ave., Rahway. This exciting event will take visitors through the circa 1724 cemetery to meet the "ghosts" of long-ago residents and learn about the history of this city from the stories of the people who lived it. Tour participants will be rewarded with an experience that takes them to the graves of 13 former citizens and, through interpreters in period dress, they will hear their real-life, interesting or poignant stories that helped shaped local, state and national history. Alex Shipley, Rahway's city historian, and Museum Director noted that this cemetery, located next to the Merchants and Drovers Tavern Museum, holds the remains of 300 years of Rahway citizens. Alex explained, "Walking through this cemetery is a lesson in regional as well as national history. You will find some very prominent, famous, interesting and even mysterious people buried there. It was hard to choose who among them who we would portray. This year we're including some tour favorites such as Abraham Clark, the signer of the Declaration, Ambo, a 19th century slave woman, Carolyn Wells, who wrote and published 170 books. Dr. Fredrick Albee. internationally famous WWI surgeon and a Civil War soldier of the U.S. Colored Troops. Also included will be the cemetery's most famous resident, the Unknown Woman, who was murdered here in Rahway in 1887. As everyone knows, she was never identified, nor her killer

wrote and published a book documenting this famous cold-case, which has become a local best seller and is on sale at the Museum.

Tours begin at 1 p.m. and leaving every 15 minutes on both days, October 5rd and 6th, with the last tour leaving at 4 p.m. This popular annual event which draws hundreds of visitors is designed to be a memorable as well as educational experience for all ages. All tours begin at the Merchants and Drovers Tavern Museum located on the corner of St. Georges and Westfield Avenues in Rahway, next door to the Rahway Cemetery. Reservations are recommended but tickets may also be purchased at the museum both days at \$10 for adults, \$8 for members and seniors, \$5 for students and children under 12, and free to children under 5. All proceeds benefit the continued restoration of the Museum buildings and grounds. The museum gift shop will be open and free parking is located at Parkside Plaza on St. Georges Ave. one block south of the museum.
