

a drive to collect goods to send to a Marine Unit in Iraq. Kenilworth resident Joe Zagorskas, age 26, is a Marine Sergeant who grew up in Kenilworth. MAYOR CONRAD REMEMBERED

William E. Conrad Jr., mayor Kenilworth, Kenilworth died May 14, 2008. Born in Newark, Mr. Conrad lived in Kenilworth for 55 years. He was a vice president for Merrill Lynch in New York City for 21 years, retiring in



1978. A World War II Navy veteran, Mr. Conrad was a recipient of the World War II Victory Medal. William was a graduate of Rutgers University and attended Syracuse University. Mr. Conrad was the mayor of Kenilworth from 1970 to 1975, chairman of the Union County Conference of Mayors, and chairman of the Board of Directors for Memorial General Hospital in Union from 1976 to 1982. He was listed in Whos Who in the East publication and was chairman of the Planning Board for the Borough of Kenilworth from 1988 to 1989. Mr. Conrad was a C.Y.O basketball coach for St. Theresa School, and served on the St. Theresa Church Advisory Board and Executive Committee. He was a member of the American Legion Post 470 and the National Security Council. He was predeceased by his wife, Mary (nee Ferry) Conrad. Surviving are his wife, Constance (nee Vallorani) Conrad; three sons, William E. III, Scott William and Kurt Edward Conrad; a daughter, Elise Dailey; five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.



The exterior of the Oswald J. Nitschke House (c. 1880) was restored and painted in its authentic colors as part of Phase I of the restoration project, which also entailed bringing basic utilities (gas, water, sewer and electrical service) to the site. The Kenilworth Historical Society is currently working to raise the estimated \$400,000 in funds that are needed to restore the interior of the house so that it can be fully utilized for its intended purpose -- as a "living history" museum and cultural arts center, where people from Kenilworth and other communities may learn about history and enjoy the arts. Approximately 400 visitors toured the Oswald J. Nitschke House last October during Union County's annual fall heritage festival, "Four Centuries in a Weekend." Kenilworth Historical Society members served as historic interpreters in leading the tours, which focused on customs, clothing, furnishings and other areas of interest from the 1907 time period being recognized in honor of Kenilworth's 2007 Centennial Celebration marking the 100th anniversary of the borough's incorporation.

NITSCHKE HOUSE EARNS PRESERVATION AWARD

The Kenilworth Historical Society's effort to save and restore the Oswald J. Nitschke House (c. 1880) has been recognized by the State of New Jersey with a Historic Preservation Award. This prestigious, competitive award is given by the New Jersey Historic Sites Council and the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Historic Preservation Office, to "individuals, projects or programs that are judged to demonstrate exceptional merit in the field of historic preservation."

The award was presented to the Kenilworth Historical Society at the 18th Annual New Jersey Historic Preservation Awards Ceremony held at the New Jersey State House on May 17.

The Nitschke House and five other preservation projects were honored.

The Kenilworth Historical Society acquired the historic Nitschke House in 2003, when its persistent efforts to save it from demolition prompted its then-owner Dr. Jerome Forman to donate the house to the organization, provided that it be relocated to make way for a new dental office on the property. In July 2003, the Kenilworth Historical Society moved the house 1,500 feet to land that it acquired with the generous assistance of the Kenilworth Veterans Center and a matching grant from the New Jersey DEP Green Acres Program.

"After working diligently over the past seven years to save the Nitschke House and now restore it, we are honored and thrilled to have the project recognized by the State in this very special way," said Shirley Boyden Maxwell, president of the Kenilworth Historical Society. Phase I of the Nitschke House restoration project, which entailed bringing basic utilities to the house and restoring its exterior — a more than \$350,000 venture — was completed last June with the assistance of a nearly \$200,000 grant from the New Jersey Historic Trust and matching funds from the Preserve Union County grant program, E. J. Grassmann Trust, Schering-Plough, Kenilworth Historical Society fundraising events, and donations from individuals and businesses. The Nitschke House also was recently added to the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places.

The Kenilworth Historical Society is currently working to raise the estimated \$400,000 that will be needed to restore the interior of the house and transform the site into a "living history" museum and cultural arts center. Its immediate goal is to raise \$225,000 to use as a match for other grants that it intends to apply for.

The Kenilworth Historical Society is an independent, non-profit, tax-exempt, 501(c)3 organization that is dedicated to researching Kenilworth's past, saving its material culture and preserving its heritage. This includes the preservation and interpretation of the Oswald J. Nitschke House, representative of the founding and early development of Kenilworth; the political, social and economic forces and cultural traditions that shaped the community; and the rich history of Kenilworth from early settlement to the present day.

"CULINARY KENILWORTH" COMMUNITY COOKBOOK ILLUSTRATED BY **LOCAL STUDENTS TO BE SOLD AT JUNE 12 RECEPTION**

"Culinary Kenilworth" -- a compilation of favorite community recipes, student-rendered illustrations of many of Kenilworth's food establishments, and poetry written by local students -- has been published and will be available for sale during a June 12 reception at the Kenilworth Veterans Center (33 South 21 Street). The event, sponsored in part by Schering-Plough Corporation and hosted by the David Brearley High School art and business management departments, will begin at 6:30

The reception will include a "tasting," which will give participants an opportunity to sample many of the foods for which recipes are provided in the cookbook. The cookbook artwork will be on display, and musical entertainment will be provided by the David Brearley jazz combo and chorus. All are welcome to attend. Admission is free.

"Culinary Kenilworth" is being sold for \$10 as a fundraiser for the David Brearley art department and the Kenilworth Historical Society, who partnered in the project. The Historical Society's portion of the proceeds from cookbook sales will benefit its ongoing project to restore the Oswald J. Nitschke House and transform it into a "living history" museum and cultural arts center.

The production of the cookbook was a collaborative effort involving local high school students, teachers and Historical Society members. Janice Marsili's art students created the dry-point etchings that illustrate the cookbook based on photographs that they and Danielle Wilkinson's photography students took during a field trip to local food establishments, while students from Anne Phillips' English classes wrote poetry inspired by the artwork. Cheryl Kress' business management students typed the recipes - many of which the Kenilworth Historical Society collected from local residents during Kenilworth's 2007 Centennial Celebration and others which were furnished by teachers - and are marketing the cookbook as part of an "Apprentice"-style team competition.

In addition to being sold during the June 12 reception at the Kenilworth Veterans Center, copies of the "Culinary Kenilworth" cookbook can be obtained by calling (908) 931-9696.

The student artwork and poetry that appear throughout the cookbook are being exhibited at Schering-Plough's executive offices in Kenilworth during the months of May and June.

The student art and writing program that up of Arts Horizons and Young Audiences New facilitated the cookbook production was made possible by an Artists-in-Education grant from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts (NJSCA) that David Brearley art instructor Janice Marsili applied for and was awarded. The grant allowed for professional printmaker Nanci Hersh and writer Penny Harter to share their skills with the high school students during a grant-funded "artist residency" arrangement at the school.

The Artists-in-Education grant program is carried out through a partnership between the NJSCA, a Partner Agency of the National Endowment for the Arts and a consortium made

Jersey. This program provides New Jersey schools with long-term artist residencies. The program is made possible through state appropriations to the NJSCA as well as funding from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation.

The consortium has cited the local student printmaking endeavor at David Brearley High School as a best practices grant project and Marsili, as a best practices teacher. In addition, Marsili has been awarded a two-year extension to continue the Artists-in-Education grant program at David Brearley.


