Spc. Ny'Riq King and Spc. Roberto A. Roman, had never met before they began working at La Strada Ristorante and Pizza, located on Somerset Street. They began working a few years ago while finishing high school and navigating the life of a post high school graduate. While working together these boys learned of a shared interest of joining the army, with a strong focus on the Military Police.

Spc. King, a 2011 graduate from North Plainfield High School, participated in ROTC during his Sophomore and Junior years. Spc. King signed his contract for service in 2010, and after graduating left for basic training in December of 2011 with the intention of training for Military Police. "I've always wanted to join the service, and becoming involved in the Military Police seemed like something I would enjoy," said Spc. King.

Spc. Roman is a 2006 graduate of Plainfield High School. He enlisted in January of 2011 and left for basic training that December, also having plans to train for the Military Police. "I joined the service because I wanted to open more doors for my future," said Spc. Roman. "I wanted to be a police officer but also wanted to be in the military, so I figured what better way to kill two birds with one stone than to become part of the Military Police."

Spc. King and Spc. Roman ended up being placed in the same unit. They completed basic training and Advanced Individual Training (AIT) together where they trained for their job as Military Police. They then had the same deployment to Afghanistan. They both came home on leave this past August and are currently on reserve leave, enjoying their time home with family and friends.

Owner of La Strada, Joe, Spc. King and Spc. Roman's former boss and friend is extremely proud of what they have accomplished. "These boys

# TIMOTHY D'ARMIENTO AND KYLE FINNEGAN **RECEIVE EAGLE SCOUT RANK**

On Sunday August 18th, 2013 North February 2013. Plainfield BSA Troop 235 chartered by the West End School PTA, held an Eagle Court of Honor in Saint Luke's Church hall to recognize two members who received the Eagle Scout Rank -Timothy D'Armiento and Kyle Finnegan.

Both Timothy and Kyle joined Cub Scout Pack #135, in North Plainfield, as first graders in September 2001 as a Tiger Cub Scout; advancing to Webelos, where they were awarded the Arrow of Light in March 2006 before crossing over to Boy Scout Troop #235 in North Plainfield.

D'Armiento completed his advancement from Tenderfoot to Eagle Scout rank on April 26, 2013 having earned 29 merit badges and having served as Patrol Leader, Troop Guide and Assistant Senior Patrol Leader. During this time he attended North Plainfield High School, where he graduated this past June, and was involved in a variety of activities such as; National Honor Society, Italian Honor Society, track, varsity baseball, varsity football, Mentoring and religious education teacher.

For his Eagle Project, Timothy consulted with Father Lancelot McGrath, Pastor of Saint Luke's R.C. Church and decided on a plan to beautify and enhance the area that surrounds a statue of Saint Luke's. The statue was donated by a family in the parish and is located to the left of the church. The improvements focus on welcoming the community and providing an area in which

Timothy lead other Scouts and volunteers in the creation of a memorial garden with landscaping, including flowers, installation of two benches, and construction of a 22 foot x 5.5 foot long walkway consisting of small decorative yellow stones and edging. Planting along the installed edging included various small bushes and flowers. After successfully securing all of the material and supply donations, he completed the project with the help of many Scout volunteers and friends in

Kyle Finnegan completed his advancement from Tenderfoot to Eagle Scout rank on July 25, 2013 having earned 28 merit badges and having served as Assistant Patrol Leader, Troop Guide and Senior Patrol Leader. During this time he attended North Plainfield High School, where he also graduated this past June, and was involved in a variety of activities such as; National Honor Society, Italian Honor Society, marching and jazz bands, golf team, varsity track, Mentoring program and religious education teacher.

For his Eagle Project Kyle consulted with Lauren Ryan, Director of the North Plainfield Library and together decided to completely renovate, repair, restore and beautify the front grounds of the North Plainfield Library. This area is adjacent to the World War II memorial which was damaged by foot traffic and shade from a tree that was recently cut down which hindered the growth of vegetation.

Kyle lead other Scouts and volunteers in the re-grading of the dirt area by tilling the existing soil with compost and top soil to improve the quality which allows grass and other vegetation to grow. He also constructed a fence at the corner of the building to stop undesirable foot traffic, planted butterfly bushes and azaleas between existing benches, installed two limestone pathways from the benches to the sidewalk and planted new bushes in place of existing overgrown junipers and yews in front of the building. After successfully raising over \$600 thru monetary donations and supplies, he completed the project with the help of many Scout volunteers and friends in May 2013 before Memorial Day.

Timothy and Kyle are the 63rd & 64th Eagle Scouts from Troop 235 which is in its 53rd year of developing leadership in "A Proud Community". This fall both are attending college, Timothy is a freshman at The College of New Jersey and Kyle is a freshman at George Mason.

North Plainfield is one of 16 New Jersey municipalities participating in the Walk to Win wellness incentive sponsored by the Garden State Municipal Joint Insurance Fund (GSMJIF). This incentive is open to all Borough employees, of which 26 are participating.



# NORTH PLAINFIELD ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCE INVENTORY NEARLY COMPLETE

The North Plainfield Environmental Commission (NPEC) secured a 2012 Sustainable Land Use Planning Grant from ANJEC (Association of NJ Environmental Commissions) to prepare an Environmental Resource Inventory (ERI) for the borough. Mr. Harry Strano of Amy S. Greene (ASG) Environmental Consultants has prepared a final draft of the ERI and has submitted it for review by NPEC. It is now in the hands of the review team, which includes the Green Team, the Shade Tree Committee, the Planning Board, and the Library.

Established under the Municipal Land Use Act, the ERI is a compilation of information about the natural resources and environmental features of the Borough. It describes the soils, topography, hydrogeology, surface water hydrology, storm water management, contaminated sites, climate and cultural resources of the area, existing manmade structures or features and the probable impact of a proposed development on the environmental attributes of the site Borough. It discusses how these resources have changed and how they are likely to change due to human activities and natural forces. The ERI also presents local history from pre-Columbian to the present. The ERI is an important tool for environmental commissions, planning boards and boards of adjustment. It can provide the

Plainfield Environmental foundation and documentation for developing resource protection ordinances and resource based land use planning. It is a valuable reference for students and others interested in doing research into the Borough.

Public input was requested in October 2012 and at several open meetings since then. An announcement and request for input also was made at the Memorial Day Celebration at Monument Park in May of 2013. Progress on the ERI was made over the spring and summer as various sections of text and draft maps were delivered and reviewed. Two site visits by ASG yielded local information on wildlife habitats, invasive plants, and other observations which were not part of the State databases. These materials have been incorporated into the final draft ERI. There are sections of the History and Introduction sections which are still being worked on, with a particular need for input from residents with local knowledge they would like to share.

Under the conditions of the ANJEC Grant, the ERI was to be completed by June 30, 2013. We anticipate finalization in October 2013. The next Environmental Commission Meeting will be held at the Vermeule Community Center.
