GRAND OPENING OF RENOVATED AUDITORIUM AT RHS

Rahway High School is hosting a "Grand Opening" on Saturday, October 12th to showcase the improvements at this building. Tours will be given starting at 10am, and a program will be held in the new auditorium at 5pm, showcasing student performance, invited guest speakers, etc. The Rahway Public Schools wish to thank the community for its support of this project. As we continue to move forward, together we will provide opportunities to our students and "Expect Excellence" in our schools.

The September 2009 Rahway Public Bond Referendum project has reached substantial completion. The project's total cost was \$34 million, of which \$22.8 million was funded by the local bond referendum. The remaining \$11.2 million was funded by the State of NJ through R.O.D. Grants. This project has brought our district into the 21st Century by updating systems district-wide.

Improvements include:

- Secure vestibules in all elementary schools
- New fire alarm systems in all schools
- \bullet New solar panels at both the 7th & 8th Grade Academy and RHS
- New electrical service at Grover Cleveland, the 7th & 8th Grade Academy, and RHS
- New performing arts addition at RHS, including new band room, chorus room, dance studio, rama classroom, and a state-of-the-art auditorium upgrade
- New family and consumer science labs at RHS
- New state-of-the-art science labs at the 7th & 8th Grade Academy, and RHS
- A new addition at Grover Cleveland School with classrooms and Media Center
- New HVAC system at the 7th & 8th Grade Academy
- New floor and auditorium seating at Roosevelt School





TICKS IN NEW JERSEY

October is an active time for adult ticks and it is important that we stay diligent with their detection. Even an Indian Summer can cause these tiny creatures to become active when we often let our guard down.

In New Jersey we have four hard body ticks; The American Dog tick, the Brown Dog tick, the Lone Star tick and Deer ticks. It is the Deer tick, also known as the 'Black legged tick' that causes humans in our area the most concern due to the transmition of Lyme Disease.

Early tick detection is the surest way to avoid problems. This simply means taking a visual exam of yourself and your children every day. Deer ticks need 24-36 hours to transmit the Lyme Disease bacteria. An adult deer tick is about the size of a sesame seed. Now with more and more deer roaming though our area we need to increase our guard.

If you do find a tick correct removal is very important. Remove the tick carefully with tweezers and put it into a container with a moist cotton ball (an old prescription bottle works best). A good tick is essential if your doctor decides to have it tested. Do not put rubbing alcohol on the tick as it will kill the bacteria and that tick will no longer be viable for testing.

Rutgers C.E. Garden Helpline can identify your tick for you. Bring the intact tick to the Union County office at 300 North Ave East, on the 2nd floor. For more information call 908-654-9852.

Rutgers suggest you always call your doctor when you are bitten by a tick. They will know the best course of action to be taken.

A major part of Harvest celebrations are the decorations. They can be as simple as a pumpkin







RAHWAY HIGH SCHOOL VOLLEYBALL TEAM HELPS "HEAL THE CHILDREN"

For the past 25 years, the Rahway High School Volleyball team has been linked to the charity, "Healing The Children". This began years ago when (then coach) Ray Candiloro was approached by Dr. Francis Light, Head of Anesthesiology at Rahway Hospital, and was asked to run a recreational tournament to raise funds for the cause. The group performs life changing surgeries on children in Third World countries for only the cost of supplies. A typical operation costs \$100.

In 2005, the coach decided to make it an "inseason" girl's invitational tournament; it has continued to be run that way since, even though two coaching changes. Since 2005, the team has

been able to contribute over \$25,000 to the charity, and has generated its own nickname, "Kids helping Kids". Over the years, the tournament has garnered the support of the officials, who also donate their time at the event, led by assigner, Linda Liebiedz.

This year's event was won by Woodbridge High School. Other participating schools were: Elizabeth, Rahway, Colonia, Scotch Plains, Bishop George Ahr, and Union. Thanks are in order for the current Rahway coaches, Danielle Marsh and Amanda Porr, as well as Linda Kaspryzyk, and the Rahway JV Team, who volunteered to run the tournament. This year's anticipated gift: \$3,500.



From 10:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M., the Rahway Police Department will be hosting "Operation Take Back New Jersey" at the Rahway Police Headquarters, located at 1City Hall Plaza Rahway, NJ.

Prescription drug abuse is rapidly becoming one of our nation's greatest emerging drug problems and it is widely recognized that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from home medicine cabinets.

According to the 2012 Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration's National Survey on Drug Use and Health, more than seven million Americans currently abuse prescription drugs. Additionally, the survey reported for the 3rd year in a row that prescription drugs are the 2nd most abused drug category behind only marijuana.

The goal of "Operation Take Back New Jersey" is to allow the citizens of New Jersey to deliver all of their unused, unwanted, or expired medications to law enforcement officials who can in turn dispose of these controlled substances in a safe and non-hazardous manner, preventing these pills from falling into the hands of juveniles or into the illicit market in our communities.



SOLDIER AND SAILOR MONUMENT HAS STOOD FOR 100 YEARS

Within two months after the outbreak of the Civil War men from Rahway had trained and enlisted and were off to join the fight to save the Union. Because this initial group of thirty–nine men had formed an artillery battery they connected with the 9th New York State militia as New Jersey was not accepting artillery or cavalry units. The battery which was designated Company K detached from the 9th Regiment on December 22, 1861 and became the 6th Independent New York Battery, commonly called Bramhall's Battery. The unit was kept in constant service to the close of the war seeing action in the major battles of Chancellorsville and Gettysburg.

Besides the artillery group other Rahway boys heeded their call to duty and joined the nation's struggle. In July of 1862, when President Lincoln called for three hundred thousand volunteers, seventy-two young men from Rahway enlisted. A year later thirty-two more joined the Union Army. By the close of the war almost one-tenth of Rahway's population had participated in the War Between the States.

After the war's end veterans returned to their hometowns and formed G. A. R. (Grand Army of the Republic) posts. The Rahway veterans established Barry Post #27 and by the late 1800s had built a handsome headquarters building on Main Street that still stands today.

In 1912, with the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg approaching, Post #27 began plans to construct a fitting memorial to commemorate the heroic deeds of soldiers and sailors in all our country's wars. The triangular piece of land between Irving St., Main St., and Central Ave. was chosen as an appropriate location. Fundraisers were planned to cover the expense of the monument which was estimated at over \$2,000. Money was collected through a city–wide canvass for donations, a school pageant, a ballgame between city officials and members of the Board of Trade, and a sauerkraut

supper. By the end of the successful campaign a total of \$2,300 was raised.

Ground was broken and a cornerstone laid on July 4, 1913. The projected date for the unveiling ceremonies was set for Monday, October 13.

The festivities of the October afternoon started with an impressive street parade that ended at the monument site. It was reported that more than 5,000 persons were present to take part in the impressive ceremony. After the

invocation the flag salute was recited led by 450 students from the High School and eighth grade. Speeches were presented by Mayor Fyffe, the commander of the G. A. R. post, monument committee members, and several ministers. Musical selections were preformed after each speech. A large American flag covered the monument and when it was drawn aside a band played the Star Spangled Banner. The monument, a figure of a color bearer, was produced from Barre granite. The figure was 9' 6" in height and the total height of the monument was 23'. Appropriate wording was inscribed on each of the four sides.

In the words of Father O'Brien of St. Mary's Church, "No words that human lips may frame can equal the power and eloquence of this sermon in stone. It is not only eloquent of the past but also a voice of the future and shall be one of the most powerful speakers of civil and religious liberty, patriotism and valor and moral integrity."

BRESENHAN REMINDS RESIDENTS TO BE STORM READY

"In conjunction with September being storm preparedness month, area residents need to be proactive and prepare for the upcoming storm season," said Rahway Councilman Bob Bresenhan. "Residents are warned not to wait until the last minute when all basic supplies including bottled water, flashlights, batteries, candles, matches and so many other basics essential to riding out a storm disappear from supermarket shelves," he added. "I urge residents to be vigilant and visit the American Red Cross (redcross.org/prepare/location/homefamily/preparedness) or the National Hurricane Center (www.nhc.noaa.gov/prepare/ready) for their useful storm guides and checklists to be sure they are ready for any upcoming storms that may pose a threat to the local region," he continued. Councilman Bresenhan stated "besides having adequate supplies on hand and moving individuals or automobiles to higher ground, residents also need to secure outside property such as patio furniture, umbrellas,

grills, garbage cans or any other items that can become dangerous flying objects under extreme storm conditions." "I also encourage families to plan an evacuation route should it be necessary, gas up vehicles and choose an out-of-area emergency contact person. If you are told to evacuate, please do so immediately, he continued."

Bresenhan warned, "It is imperative for citizens to heed storm warnings and advice from such organizations as the National Weather Service, local news forecasts as well as messages from state, county and local emergency organizations. These warnings are treated seriously and only sent out when the threat is real." Bresenhan added, "it's better to be prepared and safe than put oneself or the lives of emergency personnel in a dangerous or compromising situation just because an individual was reckless and did not take a storm warning serious."

Bresenhan also provided some key

emergency organizations and their contact information detailed below:

PSE&G -In case of power outages or if you see downed power lines or smell gas call 800-436-7734.

Nixle: Nixle Connect is an application that allows the NJ State Police and the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management to communicate with the public via text/SMS, email, and internet posts. You may register to receive messages by sending a text message with your zip code to 888777 (data rates may apply depending on your plan). Online registration is also available at www.nixle.com.

FEMA: FEMA's website has suggestions for preparing your home or business for a hurricane, what to do if a storm approaches, and how to respond after it passes: http://www.ready.gov/hurricanes.
