The event will mark the launch of the Chamber with the goal of attracting businesses from the Warren community to participate.


The Chamber is the result of a few businesses who formed a committee to explore interest in organizing. The response was great with many local businesses expressing interest. Evan Tornquist, branch manager of the Warren branch of the Fulton Bank of New Jersey, was the catalyst in forming the Chamber and has volunteered to be chairman until an executive committee is formally put together.

"I am so pleased to chair this new group," Tornquist said. "Warren hasn't had a business organization since the Warren Business & Professional Association and it's time for a fresh start. We welcome businesses large and small to attend the meetings and we look forward to working together to make Warren an even better place to live and work."

The Warren Township Chamber of Commerce will meet monthly for breakfast, networking and presentations from experts in various industries. The Warren Township Chamber meetings will offer members and attendees interaction with other businesses and township officials. Mayor Victor Sordillo, Chief of Police Russell Leffert, Superintendent of Schools Tami Crader and Carolyn DellSala, director of the Warren Township library, will be invited to every meeting and encouraged to offer information on what's going on in town.

The new Chamber will be affiliated with the Gateway Regional Chamber of Commerce bringing the total of local chambers and networking groups to 12.




THE TEEN SPACE @ **LIBRARY IS UNDERGOING** TRANSFORMATION!

TOBYHANNA ADVENTURES AT SENIOR CENTER

On Wednesday, July 17, the Somerset County 4-H Creative Writers Club came to the Warrenbrook Senior Center to create two new Tobyhanna adventures – one set in India and the other that took them to the American Wild West.

Tobyhanna is the creation of Tony Siniscalco and his wife. They have all the copyrights to the character, Tobyhanna. Tony is a leader within the 4-H Creative Writers Club. The official name of the club is WorldWideWriters.Ink. The purpose of the Tobyhanna books is to provide an idea about other cultures, customs and language and to promote cooperation across these cultures and different generations.

Tobyhanna is a young boy who was orphaned as a baby and left without a name. As his new home was in a small town – located in a coal mining region in Pennsylvania, he was given the name of Tobyhanna, by his new parents. One day he found an interesting nugget that glowed like a diamond. But a strange thing happened whenever he rubbed it – he was transported to a different time and place.

Tobyhanna has a magic nugget/stone that can take him to another time and place. So far, Tobyhanna has traveled to Japan, 19th century Italy, Russian Amerika and the South Pacific Islands. He always brings back one memento of his travels. Now, in collaboration with the members of the Warrenbrook Senior Center and the Somerset County 4-H Creative Writers Club, he has the opportunity to travel to India and to the American Wild West.

Members of the center and the Club broke into two groups and each group brainstormed what Tobyhanna would experience. While in India, he is going to experience the India

Independence Day parade, barter with street vendors and spend the night with his new friend's family in their one room house. He will take a trip to the countryside and go to a clay pit and bring back clay to make a bowl. The clay bowl he makes will be his memento of the trip.

While going back in time to the American Wild West, Tobyhanna will ride in a train that is held up by bandits. He will also sign up for a wagon train trip on the Oregon Trail where he

will encounter American Indians. Before Tobyhanna leaves on his wagon train journey, he will learn how to ride and take care of his horse. He will bring back a horseshoe – a lucky horseshoe - as his memento of the trip.

The Creative Writers are now in the process of researching historical facts to support both journeys. Once the story is complete, the Creative Writers will present copies of the book to the Warrenbrook Senior Center.
