## **GIRL SCOUT SISTERS EARN SILVER AWARD**

The Silver Award is the Second Highest Award in Girl Scouting. It is the highest award that Cadette Girl Scouts ages 11-14 or in grades 6-8 can earn. Going for the Girl Scout Silver Award gives girls a chance to show they are a leader who is organized, determined, and dedicated to improving their community.

Letter read and presented to the Watchung Borough Council by Benc Sisters on September 12, 2013: second highest award a Girl Scout can earn is the Silver Award. Earlier this year my sister and I decided we would begin working on our award. But first we had to decide on a project that would not only benefit the community but have a lasting impact. We truly had only one choice: we decided to dedicate our one hundred combined hours to the Watchung Library. Ever since we were little, my sister Anastasia, brother Nicholas, and I have come to the Watchung Library to attend programs, track our reading minutes, or simply look through the endless number of books to find some of interest. We have always felt that our library was an important part of our community and we felt obliged to do something for it after all it has given us and our family. We started off this summer by making calls to local families reminding them about the programs for which they signed up. In July, we started the biggest part of our project. This included coming to the library at least twice a week to do some "summer cleaning" in the children's and young adult sections. Leading teams of friends and Scouts, we managed to remove, clean, and reorganize roughly 20,000 books crammed into a little space. After many visits, some lasting up to four hours, we realized that there were times we could not easily return the books to the shelves because there is not enough space to contain the volumes of non-fiction, picture, board, and young adult books in our library. In fact, there are books on the tops of shelves in the children's section that little ones cannot even reach on their own.

The current library does not have adequate space and we are here tonight to urge the Borough Council to move forward with plans to renovate or build a new library. The citizens of Watchung—young and old—need a cultural, social, and educational center in the community. The Watchung Library has the highest circulation rate in the county yet one of the smallest buildings! Why should our

young patrons go to other county libraries to use facilities that should be available in our own wonderful little town? A renovated library could and should become a technology center, media center, social center, and, if need be, a community center in times of emergencies.

Some may say that libraries are a thing of the past. One needs only to look at Watchung's circulation numbers or visit the library on a busy summer day to see that this is not true. Many people still prefer holding a "real" book in their hands rather than an e-book! Tonight we present to you a petition signed by the young people of Watchung. We have gathered the signatures from many children and teens who ask you to move forward with plans for a new building. The time is right.


