CLARK FOURTH GRADERS GET PERSONALIZED TOUR OF STATEHOUSE AND CHAMBERS FROM SENATOR CHRISTOPHER BATEMAN

Fourth graders from the Frank K. Hehnly School in Clark traveled to Trenton for a visit to the New Jersey Statehouse. The Statehouse field trip, an application of the fourth grade social studies curriculum of New Jersey, was a very special one for the nine and ten year olds and their teachers.

Instead of the standard tour of the Statehouse that features observing the General Assembly and Senate Chambers from upstairs viewing rooms, the fourth graders were most fortunate to get a personalized tour from Senator Christopher "Kip" Bateman. Senator Bateman accompanied the fourth graders to first the General Assembly Chambers, then the Senate Chambers, where he gave them a historical perspective of the Statehouse, pointed out how legislators vote via the red and green buttons on their desks, and reviewed the composition of both houses of the legislature. Senator Bateman graciously allowed the students to sit in the actual General Assembly and Senate Chambers during their visit, thus the fourth graders were allowed to sit in the same seats lawmakers do when the legislature is in session. Senator Bateman explained to the impressionable fourth graders that he was a member of the General Assembly from 1995 to 2007, and the New Jersey Senate from 2008 through the present time, representing the 16th Legislative District of New Jersey which includes part of Somerset, Hunterdon, Mercer, and Middlesex Counties. The enthralled students peppered Senator Bateman with a wide variety of questions on each of the chambers, how the legislature works, and his career as a legislator, among others. At the conclusion of the Senator's remarks, the students posed for group pictures with him in the Senate Chambers, in one picture holding up masks depicting the likeness of the Senator, and the other without their masks.

Superintendent of Schools Kenneth Knops, who accompanied the students on the field trip to the Statehouse, remarked that the students thoroughly enjoyed their field trip and the personalized tour the Senator provided. "Through meeting Senator Bateman and gaining a first-hand perspective by being seated in both the General Assembly and Senate Chambers, the field trip was particularly enriching to our fourth graders. Senator Bateman provided the students with a great deal of information about how their state government works, and the students' interest was sparked and heightened, leading to a wide variety of questions of the Senator. The staff and I are grateful to Senator Bateman for providing our students with such a focused and engaged learning experience, it was a cherished and memorable field trip for our fourth graders."





Superintendent of Schools Kenneth Knops served as the host of the evening, during his opening remarks he recognized Clark Chief of Police Alan Scherb as well as three Board of Education Members in attendance: Robert Smorol, Laura Caliguire, and Henry Varriano. Knops thanked Clark Retired Police Chief Sandy Danco for his assistance in lining up one of the guest speakers, Toms River Police Department Officer Mark DeGrandis. Knops set the purpose of the sober tone of the meeting by highlighting the fact that ALJ students have much to look forward to during their time in high school, and that millions of dollars in potential scholarships awaited them, as well as limitless opportunities upon their graduation. However, Knops cautioned that these golden opportunities might be lost by an arrest or being at the wrong time in the wrong place during a shore weekend. Superintendent Kenneth Knops then introduced Clark Mayor Sal Bonaccorso whom he described as a true resource to the schools and a visionary leader.

Mayor Bonaccorso delivered an impassioned talk to all those in attendance, stating his desire for all Clark students to strive to become all they can and realize their rich potential. He stated that as both a mayor and parent he held to a firm



"zero tolerance" of underage substance abuse. He urged students and their parents to make the right decisions about avoiding the pitfalls of shore weekends and their damaging consequences.

The next speaker was Officer Mark DeGrndis of the Toms River Police Department, formerly a member of the Seaside Park Police. During his no-holds barred talk, Officer DeGrandis utilized a Power Point presentation to share alarming data and statistics about underage drinking, and the accompanying consequences facing both students and their parents. Officer DeGrandis shared pictures of students partying at the shore, and told of numerous arrests made for underage alcoholic consumption, driving intoxicated, possession, and disturbing the peace. He also told of the squalid conditions of the motels rented out by students and the danger of predators. During his talk all eyes were riveted on the officer as he shared his experiences as a shore officer and the subsequent poor decisions he had seen students make, and the lasting consequences these teenagers faced.

The evening's final speaker was the Honorable Gary Bundy, Municipal Judge of Roselle Park. Judge Bundy make a riveting presentation, sharing his expertise as both a lawyer and a judge. Judge Bundy reviewed the consequences facing students for creating false IDs, being arrested for possession of alcohol, driving while intoxicated, and a host of other violations of the law. Mixing in dry humor with his fact-filled presentation, the Judge cited various laws and statutes and the potential lasting consequences facing students in violation of these.

At the conclusion of the evening's presentation, Assistant Superintendent Edward Grande thanked the guest speakers and all those in the audience for their attendance at the "It's A Shore Thing..." presentation.


