On just about any day, for several hours, you can find Ryan Hardgrove, a 2008 graduate of Green Brook Middle School and a 2012 graduate of Watchung Hills Regional High School, swimming laps in an Olympic-size swimming pool, preparing for his dream, which came true on September 13, 2013 when Marc Edenzon, President of the Special Olympics New Jersey, invited him to join Team New Jersey on the Aquatics Team for the 2014 United States Special Olympic Games, which will be held in Princeton, NJ.

"We are so proud of Ryan and all that he has accomplished," said Tom Hardgrove, Ryan's father and long-time bus driver for the Green Brook Township Public Schools. "While we knew Ryan was talented, we never dreamed that he would be swimming at this level," said Mr. Hardgrove.

"I never had the pleasure of working with Ryan while he was a student in the middle school, but I have heard many wonderful comments pertaining to his work ethic, character, and love for swimming by many parents and staff members from Green Brook," stated Dr. Richard Labbe, Superintendent of Schools for the Green Brook Township Public Schools. "Both Ryan and his father have represented the Green Brook Township Public Schools so well over the years that we feel the need to assist and support him in any way that we can. Therefore, the district will be participating in the Team New Jersey T-Shirt Fundraising Campaign. In addition, prior to the commencement of the games, we will host a pep rally for Ryan, at the middle school, as he is truly an inspiration to all members of the Green Brook community."

GBMS STUDENTS GET "STEERED STRAIGHT"

On Monday, October 21, 2013, the students at the Green Brook Middle school were visited by two remarkable individuals from an organization called Steered Straight so that they could "stay in their lane" in order to make goodlife decisions and stay out of trouble, as well as to prevent bullying. According to their website (www.steeredstraight.org), "Steered Straight, Inc. is a non-profit educational and prevention/intervention organization, committed to reaching children, teens and young adults with a message of reality about life-choices and the importance of consequential thinking so that they understand that there are consequences for their actions. Today, there exists an everincreasing need to reach the youth of our communities. With school violence, escalating use of drugs and alcohol by teens, accelerated recruitment into gangs, bullying and vandalism, and subsequent life-changing consequences, children and young adults need a profound message delivered to them from experienced, identifiable and caring messengers."

The organization prides itself on bringing powerful speakers - some of whom are living examples of negative life choices - to schools so that students can hear first hand what the pitfalls in life may be and how to avoid them by making good-life decisions. In addition, they take pride in the fact that their presentations just might be the missing message that students in New Jersey and across the nation may need to hear. Furthermore, they postulate that educators and parents also need to hear their message about the realities of what is happening with the social consequences of the choices that young citizens are making. Based upon the overwhelming feedback provided by the students and faculty that attended one of three assemblies, which were all funded by the PTO, the message was heard loud and clear.

According to Dr. Labbe, Superintendent of Schools, who sat in on one of the assemblies, "Both speakers delivered their powerful messages with candor and sincerity." Along with the upcoming "White Out Bullying" campaign that the students in Green Brook will be participating in with students from WHRHS and the other sending districts, this workshop will serve as one of the required Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying training activities that students and staff must participate in yearly according to the recently-passed Anti-Bullying Statute.



HILLS PHYS ED SUPERVISOR TO RETIRE AFTER 35 YEARS

"Almost 35 years to the day," muses Mario Diez. "It's almost thirty-five years ago that I came to Watchung Hills Regional High School," says the retiring chairperson of the Phys Ed/Health Department as he ticks off the years since December 17, 1979.

And what a career it has been! Diez has not only shaped Hills' phys ed program, but has also become known in wider circles as a winning baseball coach, who has led Hills teams to significant championships: seven at the (Skyland) Conference level; four at the county level (Somerset County Tournament of Champions); and three on the state level.

A graduate of Athens State College (Alabama), and holder of a Master's Degree from Kean College, Diez has been named to the Hall of Fame of New Jersey Baseball Coaches as well as the Hall of Fame of New Jersey School Coaches. But more than that, Diez' philosophy about the function of phys ed as part of the total picture of a student's development has been a model in educational circles. He has been instrumental in developing an elective phys ed curriculum that is progressive and current, one that is student-centered and individualized. Rather than a one-size-fits-all curriculum to which all must subscribe, the Hills physical education course of study offers options that develop life and wellness skills which students can pursue outside of school and beyond school years. Among options selected by students on a halfsemester basis are such courses as fitness, yoga, dance, judo, power walking, Project Adventure, body sculpting, wellness education, marriage, and more. These are the activities they can still pursue as adults, Diez says.

Students also fill in a "fitness-gram" which helps them assess their aerobic capacity, strength, agility, etc., all of which may play a part in their choice of phys ed courses.

The Hills elective phys ed program, started in the mid-80's, has been both successful and wellreceived by Hills students and has been visited by instructors from other schools.

The physical education offerings in the schools in the local sending district are coordinated with those at Hills.

Diez also acts as supervisor of the Business Arts Department. In addition to overseeing financial, family and consumer-oriented courses, he has been interested in developing courses in sports management and entrepreneurship.

Have students changed much in the 35 years of Diez' tenure? Technology has changed, says "Coach," but kids remain essentially the same. "Kids are still kids. They are a spirited bunch," Diez states. "They love to talk and they're interested in being social. They are facing greater challenges than my generation ever did—but they will overcome these, as every generation does."

Working at Watchung Hills has been "the thrill of a lifetime," Diez concludes, but retirement will also bring its joys, such as working in his Whitehouse Station garden, playing with his four grandchildren, some informal coaching, fishing, and finding out what else he can learn to do. Retirement will thus be a special adventure, just as teaching was.

Life will continue to be, as it always has been, a "perfect 10" for this retiring department head.

The Peterstown Book, Published by Joe & Tina Renna


