# **RAHWAY SOPHOMORE ATTENDS NATIONAL 4-H SCIENCE DAY**

Christopher Stardford, a Rahway High School sophomore, joined other students from New Jersey and around the country at the annual 4-H National Youth Science Day held on Wednesday, October 9, 2013 in Washington, DC. He and another Rahway sophomore, Sean Penaranda, were both nominated to represent Union County but Sean was not able to attend because of scheduling conflicts. The event was an opportunity for learning more about Geographic Information System (GIS) and for sharing what had been learned through the Samsung 4-H Summer Science Program which the students had attended at Rutgers in July.

Both Christopher and Sean, along with Rahway High School sophomore Osaze Morris, took part in the Samsung Rutgers summer program. Initially, they spent a week doing experiments relating about how Hurricane Sandy impacted trees at the Rutgers Ecological Preserve. The information they gathered on the damage was put into the GIS through Samsung phones.

Later, Sean and Chris went out to local communities, Sean to the Elizabeth Public Library and Christopher to the Rahway Recreation Center with the Union County 4-H Agent, Jim Nichnadowicz, to teach other young people about engineering. Christopher helped youth build paper bridges that were able to support much more weight than one would expect, while Sean helped children make cardstock gliders that travelled significant distances.

The annual 4-H National Science Day gathering of students and educators is the highlight of 4-H STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) programs. For over a hundred years 4-H has provided youth with out-of-school science education through the county extension programs of the Department of Agriculture, reaching every


# CHAMBER OF COMMERCE TESTIMONIAL Submitted by Colin Gittens

# COYOTES IN UNION COUNTY

Just as deer are now often seen in our area, coyotes have also expanded their range, living and hunting in our parks and woodlands.

Scared and elusive of humans, most coyotes are never directly seen by the public. In the west, howling is a sure sign there is a pack in the region, but adjusting to their new environments most coyotes do not howl in urban areas. This makes their presence much harder to detect.

Coyotes are a natural predator to much of the wildlife we find in Rahway; rabbits, rodents, groundhogs, Canada geese and deer fawns in the spring. This helps keep down the populations of these animals which can become a nuisance.

Sadly coyotes will also take pets, small dogs and cats. If you live in an area where coyotes might roam take extra caution, especially at night. Fencing in your yard and keeping cats indoors will help avoid heartbreak. Missing cats are one of the first signs of coyotes in the area.

Some Eastern coyotes have fur that is black or reddish. This hybridization was caused by coyotes interbreeding with domesticated dogs.



Coyotes are predominantly brownish gray, with erect ears, a slender muzzle and a bushy tail. Eastern coyote males average 45 pound and females 30 lbs. In body form and size coyotes resemble a small collie dog.

# IF YOU SEE A COYOTE DO NOT TURN YOUR BACK AND DO NOT RUN AWAY

Coyotes can reach a speed of 40 MPH. Instead, stand tall and straight and never look away. Clap your hands, wave your arms, scream, shout, and if possible throw rocks and sticks at it. This will scare it away and help increase its fear of humans. Do not chase coyotes. If cornered they will turn on you. Thankfully, coyotes are afraid of humans and will quickly scurry away.

### **AUTUMN GARDEN CLEAN-UP**

As well as raking leaves a thorough clean-up will help keep your garden healthy. Pests and diseases overwinter in dead plants. Be sure to remove dead vegetable plants and cut your flowers down to the ground. If you know that your plants were diseased, put them into the trash and not into your compost bin. This will help prevent it from recurring next season. Stop soil fungus and disease by rotating your vegetable plants every year.


After school, parents were invited to www.njhalloffame.org.

# RAHWAY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE **MEMBER SPOTLIGHT - TONY HALL**

Interested in all modes of transportation at an early age, Tony Hall has declared that "It's hidden in my genes" and claims that, regarding vehicles, he is attracted to "anything that moves!" With an Uncle and several neighbors who worked for the Pennsylvania Railroad, it's also no wonder that Tony was entranced by the fascination of tracks and trains.

His Uncle was a Master Passenger Agent and made accommodations for the New York Yankees, the Giants, and the Brooklyn Dodgers. Tony recalled that his Uncle Don had several stories about all the Yankee greats of the 1920's and 30's, including none other than Babe Ruth himself. En route home from yet another wildly victorious road trip, another well-oiled party erupted in the Yankees' private observation car at the end of the train. After a serious of double dares, Babe and some others lifted the diminutive manager, Miller Huggins aloft and dangled him by the ankles over the rear platform of the open-end car, his face clearing the roadbed below by mere inches at speeds approaching 100 miles per hour. This incident was portrayed in the 1992 John Goodman film, "The Babe." No one was injured, incredibly. Tony went on to say that his Uncle should've written a book chronicling is time on the rails with the teams.


Tony traces his interest in streetcars to seemingly interminable shopping trips when he was "dragged" to Newark as a young child where he and his mother reached Kresge's Basement via the City subway's trolley cars.

Forty years ago Tony and some friends purchased a derelict trolley body from a Long Valley farmer and began a life-long project of restoring it. In 1985, he founded Rahway's North Jersey Electric Railroad Historical Society, now grown to over 150 members, coastto-coast. The group meets monthly here in town and has collected half a dozen vintage streetcars each in various stages of restoration.

Tony was invited to join the Rahway Chamber of Commerce by Bob Markey in 2011 and was subsequently appointed to the Board of Trustees. He has been reporting to the Chamber at its monthly meetings on transit topics affecting Rahway and the vicinity. He also serves on several transportation panels statewide and represents Rahway on the Union County Transportation Advisory Board.

Tony recognizes the advances that we've made in recent years, but hastens to add that more remains to be done. "With more and more people choosing a lifestyle less dependent on the automobile, we need to be planning and funding additional bus routes to connect our railroad stations with their surrounding areas. Planning for future transit needs will assure a prominent





# THE EMPIRE THEATER Submitted by Al Shipley, City historian and Rahway Library research consultant


Growing up in Rahway and reaching an age in the mid nineteen fifties when I could go to the movies with friends, the only operating theater in the city was the huge Rahway Theater on Irving Street. Had I grown up some ten years earlier in the mid-forties I would have had a choice of patronizing one of two local theaters. Just down the street from the "Rahway" opposite Elizabeth Avenue and next to the Masonic Temple was the Empire Theater, a movie house that dated back to 1913.

When the Empire opened on the night of Monday, February 3, 1913 the sellout crowd must have been impressed as they entered one of the most up—to—date theaters in Union County. The 817 seat auditorium had a large stage that could accommodate all manner of live shows. There was room for an eighteen piece orchestra to accompany the performers. The opening night feature, "The Parisienne Minstrels," was advertised as a show "not like anything else you have ever seen." Second on the billing was a musical gem in three settings titled "Sweethearts." Tickets for opening night ranged in price from thirty—five cents to one dollar.

In its early years the Empire showcased the finest entertainment in the area and is credited with having shown the first moving picture in Rahway on March 25, 1913. Four motion pictures were presented that evening as part of a ten feature schedule which included six live acts.

By the twenties the business was doing so well the owners remodeled and enlarged the theater. Between 1923 and 1924 the outside façade and marquee were modernized and approximately one hundred fifty seats were added. The Grand Opening of the "New Empire" was held on Monday, December 15, 1924 featuring the movie "Welcome Stranger" along with several clever vaudeville acts.

What looked like a promising future, however, was short lived. On October 16, 1928 the Rahway Theater opened creating



competition that would begin the steady demise of the Empire.

Throughout the 1930s and 1940s ticket sales at the Empire sagged and as revenues dropped it became difficult to maintain and improve the facility. Never able to compete with the newer and larger "Rahway," the Empire quickly took on the reputation of being antiquated, if not seedy. While their neighbor down the street was showing first run movies seven days a week, the Empire, now open on weekends only, was resigned to show second-rate westerns, horror films and war dramas. In its last few years the usual staple of titles included westerns such as "Black Bart" and "Fury of Furnace Creek," war flicks like "Gung Ho" and "Eagle Squadron," and from the horror genre, "House of Frankenstein," "White Gorilla," and "Unknown Island." Having no prospect of improving their failing situation the Empire closed on Sunday, March 2, 1952. The last shows were "Sante Fe" and "A Yank in Korea."

Ownership had plans to convert the building

into a roller skating rink, as skating was a popular activity in the early fifties, but Irving Street merchants protested the conversion. The store owners cited parking problems, traffic congestion and the potential problems associated with the juvenile crowd. When a variance was brought before the city council, the elected officials sided with the merchants and rejected the application.

The building remained vacant for almost two years becoming a magnet for teens that would congregate in the abandoned theater before and after school. On the morning of February 5, 1954 a fire, perhaps accidentally set by the young intruders, ignited the rear portion of the theater. Although the building was not lost a Rahway fireman died as a result of fighting the blaze.

In the mid-fifties, the Empire was renovated for commercial and office use. Today the building still stands and presently houses a Chinese restaurant, a nail salon and spa, and has office space for several businesses.




