## FROM THE 2014 REORGANIZATION SPEECH

As everyone knows, Merck filed a tax appeal in 2011 contesting the assessment of their facility. Our tax assessor, Paul Parsons, successfully negotiated a favorable settlement with Merck which resulted in the withdrawal of the tax appeal for the year 2011 and allowed the Borough to phase in the reduction in the assessed value of their facility over 2012 and 2013. In 2014, there will be no further downward adjustment in the assessed value of the Merck facility. This stabilization will allow the

Borough a bit of breathing room in the current year.

Of course, the best news we received in 2013 is that Merck will be relocating its world headquarters to Kenilworth beginning this year. This is an enormous benefit to the Borough, its residents and our merchants. It is my hope that our future relationship with Merck will begin to mirror that which we had with Schering. I very much look forward to working with the Merck leadership and to establishing such a relationship. In fact, I will be attending a meeting in the next week with the Merck construction representatives to discuss their plans for renovating and reopening their headquarters building and related offices and how the Borough can make that process go more smoothly. While it will certainly be different than when Schering called Kenilworth home; Merck's relocation can only mean good things for Kenilworth's future.

2014 will be a year of change for the Borough. Hedy Lipke, our Borough Clerk for the last 15 years has retired and a new Clerk will take the helm in the near future. Hedy's absence will certainly be felt; she was a fixture at Borough Hall and a font of institutional knowledge. There will certainly be some growing pains during the transition period but I am confident that we will weather the storm which will be felt as a result of Hedy's retirement. I look forward to toasting her future at her retirement party.

The many volunteers who help the Borough with their service are most deserving of our thanks. The Beautification Committee has once again done a wonderful job of keeping the planter's along the Boulevard attractive during all seasons. The members of the Planning Board, Board of Health, Welfare Board and Library Board, are all volunteers who devote countless hours to assist the Borough and its residents. The volunteers on our Recreation Committee and Pat Boyle, as Recreation Director, have over seen many events and sports programs for the Borough's children.

We are blessed to have so many people who are willing to serve and volunteer their time and efforts. On behalf of all of the residents of the Borough, I thank you all.

## SHOWING TREMENDOUS GRADUATION RATES

Changes put in place by Brearley Middle-High School building leaders have already started to show benefits for the young adults whose preparation for post-secondary life we're trying so hard to improve. I reported on the school's improved High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA) scores in the November issue of Kenilworth Life. Now, I am pleased to share the satisfying news that Brearley has improved its overall graduation rate to 92.98%. More impressive is the school's high ranking among the schools to which it is compared throughout New Jersey (the state's "peer group" cohort).

Brearley ranked first among its statewide peers in helping two groups of students graduate: the economically disadvantaged and Hispanics. In its efforts to support students with disabilities, Brearley succeeded with a 88.46% graduation rate, ranking nine out of 31 peer group schools.

We attribute these successes largely to the opening of a new program that was the brainchild of Principal Brian Luciani. The Alternative Classroom Experience (ACE) serves students who are not experiencing overall success at David Brearley by providing them a highly individualized program in а nontraditional learning environment. ACE helps increase a student's ability to recover lost credit by gradually transitioning him back into the school under the supervision of mentors and through support services that meet his particular needs.

Brearley currently has 18 students enrolled (seven Seniors, one Junior, six Sophomores, and four Freshman).

Kenilworth's schools serve all of the community's children, but it is clear that some adolescents need more assistance transitioning through high school and into the post-secondary society than others. We'll continue to keep our eyes on kids who learn best in the traditional environment as the ACE program guides those who don't fit in to this pathway through high school.
