



WARREN MIDDLE SCHOOL'S GEO BEE FINALISTS AND WINNER!

Where is the highest peak in North America? The Maldives are located off the SW coast of what country? For the last 25 years, students have participated in the National Geographic Bee. The first round of the Geography Bee was held on December 6, 2013. All Warren Middle School students in grades 6-8 had an opportunity to show what they know about geography during their social studies class as questions were administered by their teachers. Each class was given seventy questions, a mix of multiple choice and short answer, and the most knowledgeable in geography moved on to the second round. Mr. Arnold, 7th grade Social Studies teacher and Geo Bee coordinator said proudly, "Some of the questions on the Geo Bee are very difficult and every year I am amazed how much Warren Middle School students know about geography!"

The second round of competition questions were administered on January 8, 2014 to the following 11 finalists: Jayden Baltuch, Ruitao Chen, Matthew Istanfanous, Victor Osoliniec, Lindsey Shi, Arbi Ulaj, Neelay Trivedi, Mayur Sharma, Amay Mehta, Michael Harrison, and Shaun Cagnetta! Congratulations to Neelay Trivedi who placed 1st and will now take a written test that will be submitted to National Geographic and scored against other New Jersey school winners. If he places in the top 100 in the state, Neelay will continue on to the state competition. Winning the state Geography Bee means Neelay will head off to Washington D.C. and be one step closer to the grand prize of a \$50,000 scholarship, a lifetime membership to the National Geographic Society, a \$500 cash prize, and a trip to the Galapagos Islands! The

Washington D.C. competition will also be moderated by the famous broadcast journalist Soledad O'Brien!

Studying geography increases students' awareness on a national and global level, bringing knowledge of locations in terms of physical geography, as well as appreciation of people, beliefs, traditions and cultures. The National Geographic Bee is designed to encourage teachers to include geography in their classrooms, spark student interest in the subject, and increase public awareness about geography. It is a challenge, but one that thousands of children across the nation are willing to take on!

How can one improve his or her geography skills? Get a good, up-to-date world map, atlas, and geography reference book. Learning map terminology will help with reading coordinates keys. Recognize and map interconnectedness of geography such climate and culture so it is easier to categorize and remember information about countries and regions. To keep geography fun, visit the National Geographic website; try the GeoBee Challenge, with ten new questions each day, and GeoSpy, which tests map skills. Ultimately, start to follow current events and become an informed citizen of the world!
