

#### ROBERT E. (BOBBY) JEANS, SR. NAMED GRAND MARSHAL

2014 Union County St. Patrick's Day Parade is dedicated to all POW's and MIA's

The 2014 Union County Saint Patrick's Day Parade Committee proudly announces Robert E. "Bobby" Jeans Sr. of Kenilworth has been named Grand Marshal of the 18th Annual Union County Saint Patrick's Day Parade. The 18th Annual Union County St. Patrick's Day Parade will step off at 1 p.m. sharp on Saturday, March 15, on Morris Avenue in Union.

Robert E. Jeans, Sr. was born in Brooklyn, New York and traces his Irish Ancestry on his mother's side (McTague) and his father's side (Jeans, Connelly) to County Cork. He graduated from Brearley High School in Kenilworth in 1968. After graduating from high school, Bobby served in the United States Army from 1968-1974. He served in Vietnam from 1969-1970. Bobby was honored with numerous awards and citations as a Sergeant in the 23rd Infantry Division (Americal), 196th Light Infantry Brigade, 31st Regiment. He received the Purple Heart, 2 Bronze Stars, Combat Infantry Badge, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, National Defense Ribbon, Presidential Citation, Valorous Unit Award, Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Palm, NJ Vietnam Service Medal, and the NJ Distinguished Service Medal.

Upon leaving the Army, Bobby joined the Kenilworth Police Department, where he served from 1972-2000 and retired from the force as a Lieutenant in the Patrol Division. He was also owner of R. Jeans Landscaping from 1976-1983.

Bobby married Lenore J. Morrison in 1972 at St. Theresa's Church in Kenilworth, where they are still active members of the parish community. Bobby and Lenore have a son, Robert, Jr., who is married to Kristen. Their grandchildren by son Robert are granddaughters McKenna and Emerson and grandson Declan. They also have a daughter Stacie who teaches 4th grade in the Kenilworth School District.

His devotion to the Veterans is remarkable. He has been a member of VFW Post 2230 since 1970 and served as District 5 Commander. He is a Life Member of the American Legion Kenilworth Post 470, a Life Member of the Vietnam Veterans of America Westfield Chapter 688.

Bobby is a 3rd degree member of the Knights of Columbus Kenilworth Council 4168 since 1971. He is a member of the Emerald Society of Union County and the Nugent Association.

#### **MESSAGE FROM MAYOR KATHI FIAMINGO**

This month the Borough welcomes our new Borough Clerk. Laura Reinertsen officially took over the Clerk's office on February 3, 2014. I expect Laura will be a great new addition to Borough Hall. She previously held the position of Clerk in Winfield and is very familiar with the needs of a small town. I look forward to having Laura join the team at Borough Hall.

The Borough is also welcoming three new police officers. Sean Kaverick, Kevin Fernandes and Matthew Torre, who had been the Borough's civilian dispatchers, were sworn in as members of the Kenilworth Police Department on January 8, 2014. Our new police officers are attending the academy and will start their jobs after graduation.

Also on January 8, 2014, Sgts. Wayne Fennes, Paul Campanelli and Daniel Sims were promoted to the rank of lieutenant, and patrolmen Anthony Giacalone and Christopher Bryson were promoted to the rank of Sergeant. I was pleased to administer the oath of office to each of them and again congratulate them on their promotions.

In addition to the new hires and promotions, the Police Department was formally recognized for achieving Accreditation for the Department through the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police. Accreditation is a huge achievement, which few police departments in the State have accomplished. The accreditation process began under Chief Grady and was finalized under Chief Zimmerman. Chief Zimmerman and Lt. Timothy Dowd had both acted as Accreditation Managers, working very hard to complete all of the requirements of the process.

A number of police officers were recognized with merit awards at the January 8th council meeting. Officer Michael Scanielo was recognized with an Exceptional Merit Award. Sergeants James Grady, Daniel Sims, Mark David, Paul Campanelli, Officers Edward Paster, Anthony Giacalone, Valerie Smith, Michael Devlin, Len Lueddeke, Christopher Bryson and Ryan Kernan were all recognized for their excellent police Duty. Officers Joseph Balwierczak and Michael Scanielo and Sergeant Sims also received the CPR Life Saving Award. Several officers were recognized multiple times for their service. Lt. Timothy Dowd detailed the efforts of each of the officers who were being recognized at the meeting which you can view by clicking on the link on the Borough's website, www.kenilworthborough.com. All council meetings can be viewed through the streaming application on the web site.

I'd like to recognize the DPW for job they did in snow removal during the several snow storms we have had so far and for those which we will apparently have in the near future. I'd also like to remind everyone about the snow ordinance. When there is a snow fall parking on the odd numbered side of the street is prohibited, as is parking in municipal lots for 24 hours after the snow. This will allow the DPW to plow the streets and the lots quickly and without obstructions.

There is one more thing I would like to add about snow removal – if you remove the snow from your sidewalk or driveway and throw it into the street, you are not helping and can be ticketed. Snow removal efforts are exhausting for DPW workers; they often work around the clock to clear the streets so that we can safely navigate the Borough. Let's hope that we are done with the snow storms, but if not, let's all work together to get through them safely.

## KENILWORTH POLICE REMIND RESIDENTS OF SNOW PROCEDURES, PARKING RULES

- There is no parking on the Boulevard & Michigan Ave during snowstorms. All other borough streets have the snow parking ordinance in effect. Cars should be cleaned out and moved according to borough ordinance for the streets to be properly cleaned.
- No snow is to be pushed or thrown into the borough roadways. Residents will be issued a summons if they violate the ordinance.
- All residents are reminded to notify their contractors not to push snow into the roadways.
- All sidewalks need to be cleared of snow and ice within 24 hours of the completion of any storm
- Residents who have hydrants located on their property are asked to help the volunteer fire department by clearing an area around the hydrant to ensure it is accessible in the case of an emergency.
- No parking on the odd numbered (residences/businesses) side of the roadway while snow is falling and 24 hours after the snow fall ends.
- No parking in municipal lots while snow is falling and 24 hours after the snow fall ends.

• There is no parking on the Boulevard & prohibit plowing by the Borough of Kenilworth ichigan Ave during snowstorms. All other Department of Public Works.

- Snow bound vehicles that are never moved or dug out are subject to the Abandoned Motor Vehicle Statute 39:4-56.5 which reads in part as follows:
- It is unlawful for any person to abandon a motor vehicle on or along any highway, other than a limited access highway, or other public property or on any private property without the consent of the owner or other person in charge of the private property. A vehicle which has remained on or along any highway or other public property or on private property without such consent for a period of more than 48 hours or for any period without current license plates shall be presumed to be an abandoned motor vehicle.
- It is dangerous and also a violation of the NJ State Motor Vehicle Laws to not clear the snow off the roof of your vehicle before operating. For the safety of all kindly remove snow from your vehicles before operation.

#### **JANUARY 2014**



Speaking as a parent, I know how difficult evenings can be with scheduling the many things we need to accomplish.

When our schools engage families in ways that improve learning at home and school, students make greater gains. When our schools build partnerships with families, they are able to sustain connections that are aimed at improving student achievement.

I'd like to share some simple, yet important facts about parent involvement which will benefit our children:

#### SUPER KIDS SUPER SHARING



#### ST. THERESA SCHOOL IN KENILWORTH RECEIVED A PRECIOUS GIFT FROM THE DIAZ FAMILY

St. Theresa School in Kenilworth received a Moesia and home to millions of Roman citizens. precious gift from the Diaz Family: Angel, Bozena, Elizabeth, Sophia, Fausto and Emilia, Diaz when they presented a rare 24-piece ancient Roman and Byzantine coinage collection to commemorate the 193rd Anniversary of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton's death.

From the face of Augustus, (27 BC-14 AD) 1st Roman Emperor, to the face of Jesus Christ under Romanus III, (1028-1034 AD). The 24 bronze and copper ancient coins were excavated in today's Balkin region of Eastern Europe. 2000 years ago this region was the Roman Province of

These ancient coins were used in daily transactions. The listed years on these coins reflect when the Emperor ascended to the Roman throne and the date of their deaths.

The children celebrated with a mass and also a lesson on some of the pieces from family member Angel Diaz, a former US Marine who served in the US Marine Corps Infantry for 8 years. This rare collection of coins will be treasured for years giving the students a spiritual and educational benefit of Roman and Byzantine History.

#### **DON ALEX SERVES AUTHENTIC PERUVIAN FARE**

Don Alex's newest restaurant opened in Kenilworth in June 2012. It is the third location for the family owned business. The restaurant is managed by Mark Osores, who grew up in the business learning the ins and outs from his parents. Don Alex offers authentic Peruvian cuisine in a casual setting.

The Kenilworth location offers a sitdown restaurant atmosphere and features live music on certain nights. Couples and family can dine to the sounds of Andean music played on the panflute, an ancient musical instrument.

All three locations (Kenilworth, Union and Elizabeth) have a robust takeout service. Don Alex's specialty is the authentic rotisserie chicken "Pollo a la Brasa". But the menu is rounded out by a mix of seafood and steak entrees which are uniquely Peruvian in their preparation. Sides like Choclo, a large kernel corn from the Andes, are the types of rare dishes not common to many restaurants. Jars of thier popular home made hot sauce called Picante can be purchased.
