

START WITH THE SOIL

Whether your goal is a plush green lawn or a large harvest of vegetables, soil fertility testing is the place to start. It helps by determining a soil's pH and need for lime and fertilizer.

The best time to take a soil sample is before spring fertilization or after harvest in the fall or. Do not sample shortly after a lime, fertilizer, or manure application or when the soil is excessively wet. For lawns, late summer sampling will prepare you for fall fertilization.

The Rutgers Soils Laboratory uses state-of-the-art instruments and methods of soil analysis. They suggest soil testing be repeated every 2–3 years.

WHY DOES SOIL PH MATTER?

Soil pH is a scale to measure how acidic or alkaline the soil is. Soil pH of 7 is neutral, below 7 is acidic and a pH above is alkaline.

Plants, vegetables and grass grow better, are healthier and produce more within their own pH range. The proper pH permits plants to absorb minerals from the soil. Evergreens require an acidic pH around 4.5 while tomatoes need a pH of 7.0

By knowing the plant nutrition needs of your lawn and gardens, you can prevent the overapplication of fertilizers.

Soil test sampling kits are available for a fee of \$20 from most of Rutgers Cooperative Extension offices at the Garden Helpline offices.

Separate soil samples will need to be taken from areas used to grow different types of plants. For example, separate soil test kits

should be used for lawn areas and vegetable garden areas. Samples from rhododendron, azalea, and other broad leaf evergreen areas should be kept separate from other shrub areas. Also sample separately areas that have previously received different lime or fertilizer treatments and areas that are noticeably different in plant or soil quality.



RAHWAY PUBLIC LIBRARY'S 10TH ANNIVERSARY

This March will be the 10th anniversary of when Rahway Public Library re-opened at its new location in City Hall Plaza. Five years earlier, the library was hit hard by Hurricane Floyd at its original location, and had to split their operations amongst different locales of the city in the interim. However, come 2004, RPL became part of a state-of-the-art, 32,000 square foot facility that had been in the making since 2001.



GEORGE WASHINGTON VISITED THE HISTORIC TERRILL TAVERN

The small, white structure located behind the Merchants and Drovers Tavern Museum (corner of St. Georges Avenue and Westfield Avenue) was built circa 1760 and has a history that more than rivals the imposing four-story corner museum.

In the years of the American Revolution, the Terrill Tavern was a popular stop for soldiers of both armies during the British invasion of 1775-1777. The Proprietor, Abraham Terrill, was a staunch patriot, but when the British came into town he was forced to disguise his loyalties to protect his business. Whenever the redcoats were in the vicinity, he hoisted the British flag and served the soldiers draughts of apple flip and metheglin. As soon as they left, he hauled down the Union Jack and converted his tavern into a rebel recruiting station.

The most famous visitor to stop at the Terrill Tavern was George Washington, who happened there unexpectedly as he led his weary Continental Army down the Old King's Highway while being pursued by British troops in late 1776. As the story goes, the General found Mrs. Terrill, with sleeves rolled-up, doing the family wash. When she recognized the distinguished guest, she made apologies for her appearance and invited him in for an abundant meal of ham and eggs. He ate his meal with great relish, expressed his hearty appreciation, and hastily continued on his trek toward Trenton and his fateful Christmas raid.

Other noteworthy patrons to visit the tavern were Generals Lafayette and Gates, and Lords Cornwallis and Howe.

The tavern was originally a one and a half story, four-room cottage built by Mr. Terrill for his bride, Mary Dunham, whom he married in a church in Westfield in 1763. Soon after the Revolution, the number of coach runs along St. Georges Avenue, the main road between New York and Philadelphia, increased, necessitating

the need for more inns. Terrill recognized a business opportunity and seized the chance to fill this need by adding a two-story addition to the south side of his building in order to accommodate overnight guests.

In its long history, the Terrill Tavern has been located on three different sites. It was originally built on the west side of St. Georges Avenue between Hamilton Street and Stone Street, approximately across from what is today the St. Thomas Church complex. By the late 1800s the two-story hotel portion was razed, but the original cottage was saved and moved behind the tall privacy fence protecting the 13 acre Squier/Searles estate which encompassed the property between St. Georges and Jefferson Avenues and Hamilton and Stone Streets. Two large mansions stood on the expansive tract of

land along with stables and several other outbuildings. The former tavern building was used as a reading room and tack house (storage room for horse gear).

In late December, 1971, the Squier/Searles estate was being cleared to make way for a new development of 53 homes and the Terrill Tavern came close to being torn down. Fortunately, through the efforts of Merck, Purolater, Arthur Delorenzo, and John Markey, the building was saved for a second time and moved to its present location on December 29, 1971.

Today the Terrill Tavern houses the gift shop of the Merchants and Drovers and remains a fine example of an 18th century single room structure. The citizens of Rahway can now boast of the unique situation of having two historic tavern inns on the same piece of property.


