CRASHES DECREASE AT INTERSECTIONS RED-LIGHT CAMERAS

From a low of 8 percent to a high of 33 percent, total traffic crashes are on the decline at Linden's five intersections with red-light safety cameras. The overall contribution to public safety is notable, but the gains are greatest at the city's three locations with cameras in place since late 2010, according to Linden Police Department records.

The change in dangerous right-angle crashes, those specifically targeted by photo enforcement cameras, is also most impressive at Linden's established red-light safety camera intersections, where angle crashes are down by onethird at two intersections and remain unchanged at zero at the remaining location. Total right-angle crashes are down 55 percent (nine to four) at all three intersections from the year before cameras to the third year with cameras in operation.

Linden, the fifth city in the New Jersey to install red-light safety cameras, has two generations of active red-light safety cameras. A side-by-side comparison of results from the control intersection and the first generation of intersections with cameras show little difference, until the number of average crashes per year at those locations is considered. The control intersection averaged 25 crashes a year, while the three intersections with cameras averaged 163 crashes a year. The locations with cameras are more dangerous and are likely having an impact on driver behavior at the control intersection.

In Linden we realize that crash numbers are higher across the state, but we believe that this is due the explosion in distracted driving. The use of mobile phones has exploded in recent years and people, although most support distracted driving laws, still text and use their mobile phones while driving. This leads to delayed reaction time and a general lack of concentration while behind the wheel, Said Sgt. Babulski. He further stated that Linden Police Accident Investigation Unit averaged fifteen (15) call outs per year with a high of twenty four (24) prior to the Red Light Cameras, many where fatal or serious injuries were the result. Since the RLR program call outs have drastically declined. In 2013 my unit was called out six times (6) and none were on the route 1 & 9 corridor.





EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEM

Since December of 1983, the City of Linden has administered the Linden Emergency Response System Program (LERS) for the elderly, physically handicapped, medically disabled and the socially isolated of Linden. To date more than 700 Linden recipients have taken advantage of the 24-hour monitoring service and we presently serve approximately one hundredfifty area residents.

The LERS unit is an easy to use wireless transmitter which becomes a 24 hour companion and a direct link to safeguarding one's health and safety. One press of the button is all it takes to notify the central station that an emergency condition exists and within minutes, an ambulance and emergency personnel are at the scene. Besides having the transmitter and emergency help immediately, your medical profile is kept on file and is at the disposal of emergency personnel.

The City of Linden has purchased the emergency units for the subscriber. The subscriber in turn pays \$12.00 a month monitoring fee and charges for the installation of the unit.

The Linden Emergency Response System, administered through the Department of Public Property and Community Services, is an invaluable service available to the residents. If you know a friend, neighbor, or relative in Linden that you are concerned about and that could benefit from having their own LERS unit, please contact the JTG Center.




JACOBSON'S PROVIDES ON-THE-JOB TRAINING OPPORTUNITY FOR LINDEN RESIDENT






