SCIENCE HONOR SOCIETY PREPARES FOR CHALLENGE

Science National Honor Society held a demo event recently to cleanup. The club advisors, Ms. Janet Tuohy, a chemistry prepare for Science Challenges they will be performing teacher and Ms. Reba Ducore, a biology teacher have been during lunch periods during the week of April 7th. They have excited by their students' enthusiasm. prepared scientific demonstrations to answer these questions:

Who will make the best nail design? Who will make the biggest bubble? How do you make ice cream in a plastic bag? What poprocks blow up the largest balloon?

The nail design demonstration is based on water marbling. Nail polish is dropped in water. Since it is a non-polar substance, it will separate from the water, a polar compound. Since nail polish has a lower density, it will float on the water. Participants will use toothpicks to marble the floating polish. Their fingers will be taped, exposing only the nail, which is then inserted in the water with the polish floating over the nail. Then the tape is removed as the nail polish dries.



ROBOTICS TEAM WINS TWO TROPHIES, MAKES IT TO SEMI-FINALS

Robo-Tribe Team 1228, the robotics team from Rahway High School participates in the FIRST competitions each spring. FIRST, an acronym for "For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology," is a national program that promotes youth interest in science and technology. Dean Kamen, entrepreneur and inventor of the Segway human transporter and insulin-pump technology, founded the program in 1989.

Recently, the Rahway High School competed twice, first at Mount Olive High School and then at Clifton High School. At Mount Olive, Team 1228 won its second Excellence in Engineering award in a row. This award, sponsored by Delphi celebrates an elegant and advantageous machine feature. The team that wins this award must be able to describe as well as demonstrate the chosen machine feature.

Although they had plenty of pressure and juice in their battery, this team discovered that they could not follow the straight and narrow path to score. Although their machine would start to head in the correct direction, it would soon begin to wander. So, team members came up a a simple solution, by measuring the distance each side of their machine moved. They knew that they were dealing with more than a simple arcade game following a dotted line.

In addition, they placed second at the FIRST

Robotics Competition (FRC) Mid-Atlantic Robotics (MAR) District Qualifier Competition at Clifton High School. The event took place on March 15 and 16. Team 1228 was ranked second out of 31 teams with a record of 10-2-0. They were able to make 2 balls in autonomous and for the first time in 11 years, made it past quarter-finals into the semi-finals. They also won the Innovation in Control Award for their 3D printed parts sponsored by Rockwell Automation. This award celebrates a team's innovative control system and application of control components.

RAHWAY HIGH SCHOOL ROBOTICS TEAM TO COMPETE FOR REGION CHAMPIONSHIP

A team of 40 students from Rahway High School and their robot will travel to Lehigh University on April 10 to spend the weekend competing against 50 other teams in the Mid-Atlantic Robotics Region Championship.

Team "RoboTribe" was formed 11 years ago and is a respected competitor in the tri-state region. This year, the team has won the "Excellence in Engineering Award" and the "Innovation in Control Award" at district qualifying events.

Mid-Atlantic Robotics' competitions closely resemble raucous sporting events – complete with cheering crowds, mascots and banners. Each robot competes in a three-team alliance against a second similar alliance in a game that changes every year. This year's game is called Aerial Assistsm and involves the robots throwing 25" balls into goals of varying point values over a two-minute, 30-second period.

RAHWAY POSTS STELLAR TRACK PERFORMANCES IN POST SEASON MEETS

Congratulations to the Rahway High Winter Track Team on a series of outstanding achievements in post-season play at the NJSIAA Meet of Champions, the Eastern States Championships, the State Group 2 Championships and the Union County Championships.

Special congratulations to Deshawne Bunion on being chosen as all-area first team in the 400m by the Home News Tribune. The honor is well-deserving as Deshawne solidified himself as one of the top 400m runners in the State of New Jersey. Deshawne was runner-up at the Union County Championships and then went on to win the State Sectional and State Group titles before finishing third at the New Jersey State Meet of Champions. Deshawne closed out a magnificent season finishing third in the emerging elite 400m at the New Balance Indoor National Championships.

Deshawne and his 4x400 relay teammates were named all-area second team. The team of Deshawne, Jordan Scott, Thorne Roberts, and Harlan Clarke won the event at the Union County Relays, Union County Championships, State Sectional Championships and The Group 2 State Championships before finishing sixth at the Meet of Champions and tenth at the New Balance Indoor National Championships.

At the Meet of Champions, the Lady Indians finished 22nd in the 4x400 Relay. The team of Nina-Simone Murriell, Alana Peterson, Assata Edwards and Gabrielle Charles were the first quartet since 2010 to qualify for the Meet of Champions in this event.

At the 80th annual Eastern States Championships, held February 24 at the Armory in New York City, Deshawne Bunion posted a sizzling time winning his heat of the 400m. His time, which is the second fastest in school history and is the third fastest in the state this season, earned him fourth place overall. Harlan Clarke won his heat of the 800m posting a personal best performance and the second fastest time in school history. Less than an hour later Deshawne and Harlan teamed up with Jordan Scott and Thorne Roberts to win the seeded heat of the 4x400 Relay. The Indians blazed the sixth fastest time in school history and the 17th fastest time in the nation this season.

Bianca Bumpas moved up to third in Rahway history in the shot put, while the 4x400 relay of Nina-Simone Murriell, Alana Peterson, Assata Edwards, and Gabrielle Charles ran the third fastest time in school history.

In the Group 2 Championships held Thursday, February 20 at the Bennett Center in Toms River, the Indians finished in second place in the team standings. Junior Captain Deshawne Bunion led the Indians by winning his first individual state group title. Deshawne took home gold in the 400m and then teamed up with Jordan Scott, Thorne Roberts, and Harlan Clarke to win the 4x400 Relay. Harlan Clarke took third place in the 800m running the third fastest time in school history. Kurt Williams also finished second in the 55 Hurdles.

The Lady Indians had a stellar performance in the 4x400 relay. The team of Nina-Simone Murriell, Alana Peterson, Assata Edwards, and freshman Gabrielle Charles finished fourth.

In the Union County Championships held January 23 at the Armory in Jersey City, the Indians took second place led by outstanding performances by Senior Captain Harlan Clarke and the meet record breaking 4x400 Relay. Harlan brought home the gold medal in the 800 Meter Dash and then teamed up with Jordan Scott, Thorne Roberts And Deshawne Bunion to smash the meet record in the 4x400 Relay by three seconds. Other medal winners for the Indians included: Deshawne Bunion (second, 400m), Jeffrey Reyes (third, 55 hurdles), and Joshua Michel (third, shot put). Thorne Roberts, Tyler West and Nadir Williams-McLaurin also scored for Rahway.



LIBRARY HISTORY DATES BACK TO CITY'S INCORPORATION — 1858

hosted a gala celebration to commemorate the 10th anniversary in their ultra-modern building, located at 2 City Hall Plaza overlooking the scenic Rahway River. For many of the guests who were socializing in the spacious main floor of the state-of-the-art facility, one might not be aware of how the library's 156 year history is woven through the history of the city.

In 1847, William Squier and five other prominent gentlemen organized a small, private library in the Exchange Building which was on Irving Street adjacent to the railroad tracks. After a few years, the men realized the difficulties in running a library and eventually removed the books and divided them among the subscribers. Mrs. Catherine Squier, William's wife, thought the concept of a permanent library was basically sound and attributed the initial failure to the fact that no women were involved. With a new project in mind, the altruistic Mrs. Squier gathered a group of community spirited women and began a search for books and a location for their proposed library. Susan Woodruff, principal of a girls' "select school" which was located on Oliver Street between Grand Avenue and Union Street, offered this new group of trustees a small room in her school. Thus, with a new home and 144 books, Rahway's first library opened on June 15, 1858.

The library proved to be successful, but the space soon became overcrowded. This time the trustees decided to take a major step and build a new structure. An ideal parcel of property was available on the corner of Irving Street and Seminary Avenue and with donations from citizens, the property was obtained and books purchased. In 1864, the beautiful new library, designed in the Greek Cross architectural style, with a mansard center roof and gabled wings, opened with shelves containing 1,500 books.

The library continued to expand over the next seven decades. A twostory addition was built onto the rear of the original building in 1891 and in 1907 a children's department was added. On January 11, 1941 the city became the official caretaker of the operation establishing the Municipal Free Public Library of Rahway.

As the community continued to grow, so did the library in both use and resources. In 1959 the building was bursting at the seams making it necessary to move the children's department to the basement of the city hall on Campbell Street. Even after this move, the trustees, realizing the building was nearly 100 years old and obviously antiquated, began making plans for a new building. To this end, a library was eventually built on the south-east corner of St. Georges Avenue and Central Avenue and opened on July 18, 1967. The building was a modern, 21,000 square foot structure with shelving for 74,000 volumes.

The demise of the St. Georges Avenue site was not caused by overcrowding or the need for modernization, but rather by the ravages of Tropical Storm Floyd. On Thursday, September 23, 1999, torrents of rain

On Saturday evening, March 22, 2014, the Friends of the Rahway Library caused the Rahway River to overflow its banks, completely filling the library basement and covering the first floor with 18 inches of water. It was estimated that damages exceeded \$750,000. To the city's chagrin, not only was the building deemed beyond repair, but it was concluded that the corner site could be susceptible to future flooding and should be discounted as a spot to rebuild.

> For the next four-and-a-half years, city officials spent time and energy finding a suitable location, developing the plans, and securing the funds that ultimately produced the present library. The \$15 million, 32,000 square foot, high tech facility is wired for high speed access to service 36 Internet capable computers. The library has over 110,000 books available for patrons to borrow along with countless numbers of CDs and DVDs. Numerous rooms were built into the floor plans to accommodate programs and activities to fill the needs and interests of all age groups. A Rahway History room is located on the second level where young and old can research local, Union County, and New Jersey history.

> In the summer of 1863, when plans for the Seminary Avenue library were being prepared, the trustees had one goal in mind - to build a building "that would be a credit to the City of Rahway." The new library, celebrating its tenth year, has proven to be like its predecessor, "a credit to the city."

The 4th annual Amazing Rahway Race, a two-hour scavenger hunt centered in downtown Rahway and pitting teams against the clock and each other, is on the mark and set for Saturday, May 3rd, beginning at 11 a.m. on



PANSIES & VIOLETS



The State flower of New Jersey, The Common Blue Violet shown with our state bird, The American Goldfinch.

After a long and brutal winter, garden centers and stores are once again full of brightly colored pansies. These delightful small spring plants come in a wide range of colors, blends and 'faces' on the same flower. White, yellow, blue, purple, orange and mixed. Choosing your pansies can be a great deal of fun. A pot of pansies by your door is a

wonderful welcome to family, friends and yourself arriving at your home. Pansies also make a wonderful hostess gift.

The very popular 'ohnny Jump Up' has a small yellow and purple flower and reseeds itself successfully in our area.

Pansies are members of the large family named 'VIOLA'. The state flower of New Jersey, the tiny 'Common Blue Violet' can be seen blooming in our local parks and lawns in midspring.

For us, pansies are a spring flower which will bloom for three months until the heat of summer forces them to fade away. In warmer climates, pansies can be planted in the autumn and will bloom though the winter and spring, then fade when the summer heat is too much for them. When pansies wilt in early June, I replant the pot with summer annuals. Remember that potted plants do need more watering than flowers planted in the ground. Also match your plants with the amount of sunlight it will receive. In the garden plant violets in ordinary well drained soil, out of direct afternoon sun and keep the soil

slightly moist.

To keep pansies blooming well, 'DEADHEAD' the spent blooms. Once or twice a week pick off wilted flowers with your fingertips. This prevents the plants using energy to produce seeds and diverts it to create many more flowers. Pansies react great to this process, often blooming twice as many flowers.

Often pansies are sold root bound. This means the roots are overgrown in a tight knot at bottom. When you take the pansy out of the cell pack you will find a white mass of tangled roots. This will prevent the plants from absorbing water and will stunt them. Break the bottom of the root ball with your fingers or a knife before repotting to promote healthy growth. The plants will respond to this process better than you might think.
