



# MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS REMEMBER

North Plainfield, a diversified Somerset County district which serves approximately 3,288 pupils from Pre-K through Grade 12, is proud to announce the opening of the 2014 North Plainfield Middle School Holocaust/Genocide Initiative. The project, a culmination of over two decades of teaching the Holocaust to our students, is a multi-faceted exhibit, featuring eighteen hallway sections with over 300 posters, an online webpage with accessible information related to the Holocaust, and actual artifacts from the time period. Last year's version of the exhibit won the prestigious Aaron Flanzbaum 21st Century Democratic Heritage Award by the Anti-Defamation League/New Jersey Regional Office and the New Jersey Association of School Administrators.

There will be an Open House on June 4, 2014 at 7:00pm, where the public is welcome. Staff members will be on hand to provide tours of the exhibit, answer questions and provide information related to the Holocaust. The exhibit will remain up until June 13.

The North Plainfield Memorial Library will celebrate the retirement of long time staff member, Terry Garatino, on May 22 from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. on the main floor of the library. Mrs. Garatino, who started working at the library in 1965, will leave after 49 years of service.

After a friend was offered a full-time position by library board president Mrs. Sherlock, Terry was referred by the friend because of her typing skills. She spoke with the library director at the time, Mrs. Bailes, who offered her the job after an informal meeting. Terry recalls typing many catalog cards and library board minutes.

When Mrs. Gartino started at the library, the building was located in a former house where the library parking lot exists today. She recalls that the grounds where the current building resides was beautiful, with a gazebo and gardens tended by a private gardener hired by the Library Association, which provided funds to the library. The building which exists today was first proposed in 1965 and was finally built in 1970. The staff moved all the materials from the old building to the new one. Once the old building was empty it was torn down to make room for the parking lot.

The library has gone through many changes since Terry started in 1965. She recalls that there were certain materials that high school students were not allowed to borrow, and a collection considered so risqué it was kept in the director's

office and was only released by request. The introduction of new materials such as DVDs, music CDs, and eBooks, have changed the landscape of materials the library makes available to North Plainfield residents, as well as card holders from member communities in Somerset County.

Mrs. Garatino has been a North Plainfield resident since 1956 and has many friends that come to the library to see her. She has touched many lives in a positive way, has made friends at the library, and will truly be missed by her colleagues and patrons alike.


