



There will be two handicapped-accessible beds as well. The park is gated to keep out the deer. Gardeners and volunteers will have access to the park from dawn till dusk. They must apply for the lease by October 31st.



A JOURNEY TO STOP HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Kawameeh Middle School, in Union, hosts a Multicultural Festival annually in the spring. The Eighth Grade Honors English Classes, under the direction of their English teacher, Mrs. Lina Blanchet, wanted to take their multicultural research a step further this year, not only learning about a different culture, but actually connecting with that culture, by fundraising for a particular group in need.

The Multicultural Charity Project began in January 2014. Groups of 4 students researched charities using several charity navigators provided by their school librarian Mrs. Mary Lewis, on a specially prepared project pathfinder. The groups then picked a reputable charity whose mission they felt a connection to. In continuation, the groups wrote and presented a persuasive speech to present to their lassmates. All the classes voted on their favorite charity. The two finalists were the groups that chose Heifer International and LOVE 146. In the end LOVE146 had the most votes, and the classes are working to raise money for this organization. (http://love146.org)

LOVE146 is a non-profit organization that works towards the end of child trafficking & exploitation by caring for survivors, prevention & empowering a growing Abolition movement. The Eighth Grade Honors English Classes then had the difficult task of raising money for LOVE146, not an easy endeavor considering the amount of fundraising that happens in schools these days for class trips and other causes. A team developed and they have been meeting every Tuesday afternoon to make handmade bracelets. These bracelets were then sold for a minimum of \$3.00 at lunch to students and faculty. Currently they have raised \$566.00, and the fundraising efforts continue.

A documentary of the whole experience was also made, led by eighth grade student, Jeric Brual and assisted by Marion Afante. The President and co-founder of LOVE146, Rob Morris, saw this video and contacted Mrs. Blanchet and her students to thank them for their efforts. He was so impressed with these students and honored by


The Union High School Performing Arts Company hit the road this past weekend to participate in the World Strides Heritage Festival; a national competition featuring participants from across the United States and Canada. This year the UHSPAC traveled to Boston, Massachusetts with over 90 students who participated in various ensembles including instrumental, color guard and swing choir. Participating in these activities helps enrich the lives of students through music and performance. The World Strides Heritage Festival has been following this mission for nearly 35 years, giving opportunity for students to perform in some of the nation's most prestigious venues as well as working with professionals in various performing fields, with the ability to be recognized for their countless hours of hard work.

Embracing the mission of the World Strides Heritage Festival, the UHSPAC has been participating in the event for many years traveling to various locations across the country taking with them performing arts groups to help

the students continue to have a well-rounded, multi-faceted arts education. This year the groups featured were the UHS Jazz Ensemble and UHS Wind Ensemble under the direction of Laura Muller; the UHS Marching Band under the direction of Muller, Carlos Esquivel and Michael Hamilton; the UHS Indoor Color Guard under the direction of PJ Tankard; and the UHS Swing Choir under the direction of Melissa Abbate, James Moser and Choreographer Jennifer Williams. The UHSPAC walked away with the top prize, the Festival Sweepstakes Award, which is given to the school with the combined highest overall average of all their recognizing the well-rounded performing arts program at Union High School. The UHSPAC also walked away with three Adjudicator Awards for the Jazz Ensemble, Marching Band and Swing Choir. Adjudicator awards are chosen by the judges, and are touted as "one of the most difficult awards to receive." These awards honor the schools with the Best Overall Ensembles in the completion. Five soloist awards, the most of any school participating in the competition, were also given out to choral soloists Kerry Jules, Javon King and Raquel Martinez; and instrumental soloists Simón Crosby (alto saxophone) and Christian Rodriguez (guitar).

The UHS Music Department continues to prove why they are listed as one of the top 100 Music Education (as voted by the NAMM Foundation) programs in the nation. Their Choirs, Instrumental Ensembles, and Color Guard continue to gain national recognition and are at the forefront of arts education.


