### **STUDENTS PARTICIPATE AS ACTORS IN EVERY 15 MINUTES**

Chief John Zimmerman of the Kenilworth Police Department reported that on May 7, 2014 his department, in conjunction with Morristown Hospital, Atlantic Health Care, along with assistance from the Kenilworth Fire and First Aid Departments, and the Brearley School Administration conducted a program entitled "Every 15 Minutes" at the David Brearley High School.

This emotionally charged 2-day program is a real life reenactment of a driving while intoxicated car crash with fatalities, where Brearley High School students were selected to participate as "actors" in the program. Professionally filmed, produced and edited, the program covers the lives of the student actors and a social gathering where alcohol is being consumed. The intoxicated students then leave the gathering after drinking several cans of beer, and a short distance away are involved in a head on collision with another car full of students. The accident scene, observed by the junior and senior class students, along with the parents of the actors, shows the real life response of the Police, Fire, First Aid, and Paramedics. The Kenilworth Police Officers determine that several of the injured are seriously hurt, and summon for the Atlantic Health Care Medevac Helicopter. Fire and first aid personnel tend to the injured, and prepare the most seriously injured for transportation to Morristown Hospital by the Medevac helicopter, which has landed at the high school athletic fields.

The Kenilworth Police went to the homes of 2 of the student actors killed in the crash and did a "real life" notification that their children had been killed. The parents of the injured were also escorted by Kenilworth Police to Morristown Hospital, where filming of the program continued.

The intoxicated driver was arrested and taken to Kenilworth Police Headquarters, given driving while intoxicated tests, and attended trial that afternoon in the Kenilworth court.

Chief Zimmerman stated "the intoxicated driver of the vehicle which caused the accident is arrested for drunk driving, and later charged with 2 counts of Criminal Homicide Death by Auto, and the mock trial is held at the Kenilworth Court. After hearing testimony from the victims and witnesses, and victim impact statements read aloud, she

pleads guilty to the Judge, and received a sentence of 7 years in prison. "

Lt. Dowd of the Kenilworth Police added "to maintain the real life experience that we wanted to keep, the student actors are sequestered from their families and friends overnight after day 1, to project the "loss" of them due to the consequences of the accident, such as the injuries and deaths that happened, and the driver being in jail. I don't think it could get any more realistic than this production." The students stayed at a local hotel overnight, chaperoned by several officers and school personnel.

"On day 2, the students all reported to school early for the initial viewing of the professional video of the entire event, and also heard from the student actors and finally heard first hand from someone who has lost a close family member to a driving while intoxicated accident " said Chief Zimmerman, "The emotionally charged program was offered for the first time in Kenilworth, and we plan on doing it again, and by the reactions I saw from those who viewed it and the emotions seen from those that were visibly shaken to crying, the Kenilworth Police certainly know that the message was presented to show the students the dangers of drinking and driving, and the extreme consequences that occur afterwards."

The professional video of the entire event will continue to air on Kenilworth's local cable access channel.





Students were super-excited when Mrs. DeMaio greeted them at the front door along







# KENILWORTH VETERANS CENTER DECLARE MAY 26TH, 2014 AS RAY SCHEUERER DAY


Commander Bobby Jeans of VFW Kenilworth Post 2230 designated May 26th, 2014 as Ray Scheuerer Day. Ray was born in Kenilworth. He is married to Sally (Kennark) and is the father of Susan and Elizabeth. Ray enlisted in the US Army at the age 18 in February 1943. Shortly after completing recruit training (Boot Camp) he found himself preparing to be part of the largest military invasion in the world. On June 6, 1944, Private First Class Raymond Scheuerer landed on Omaha Beach, with the 1st Division 16th Infantry Company C, where the most brutal D-Day assault took place. Not too long after hitting Omaha Beach under heavy enemy fire, PFC Scheuerer sustained a combat wound to the foot from an exploding land mine at about 8:00 a.m. A medic dressed his wounds then continued on helping others. Ray laid above the beach head for several hours unable to move. Bombs were

exploding so close to him that shrapnel hit a hatchet in his back pack. Around dusk that evening, 2 GI's escorting German prisoners found Ray and seeing how badly he was wounded picked him up and carried him back to the command post medical tent. Ray was later transferred to a Navy LST where hundreds of wounded soldiers were being medically attended to. After he recuperated in the states, he returned to active duty and completed his enlistment. Ray was honorably discharged at the war's end in November of 1945. Among his many battle decorations, medals and awards, Ray was awarded the Purple Heart. Ray is a founding member of Kenilworth's Veterans Center Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 2230 and is still active in the Post to this day. Ray was honored for his service to our country and his dedication to the VFW during the Memorial Day services held at the VFW on Monday, May 26, 2014.

# **IMPORTANCE OF SUMMER LEARNING**

Summer is upon us . . . While these months are important downtime for children, do not think for a moment that they want to just sit back and relax like we, as adults, dream of doing. Children can quickly become bored. Instead, they are looking for adventure and excitement. Summer learning loss is the loss in academic skills and knowledge over the course of summer activities. The loss in learning varies across grade level, subject matter, and family income. A common finding across numerous studies is that on average, students score lower on standardized tests at the end of the summer than they do at the beginning of summer (on the same test).

Mathematics - 2.6 months of grade-level equivalency loss
Reading - 2 month of reading-level

achievement loss

Educators have recognized that summer vacation is a period when students' rate of academic development declines relative to the school year. It has been proven the learning in the summer months of the primary school years has increased knowledge as students get older.

All of our students in Kenilworth will be participating in a summer activity. The Harding students will have a Reading Activity designed by the classroom teacher. In Grades 3-5 the students will also participate in a Mathematics activity. The students at Brearley will have an opportunity to choose from a variety of activities in each of the four content areas (Language Arts, Science, Social Studies and Mathematics.) Allowing the students to choose their interest area will give them empowerment over the activity.


