KENILWORTH RESCUE SQUAD GETS A MAKE-OVER

volunteer service of a team of New York Life representatives from the Parsippany NJ office resulted in a \$6,000 Volunteers for Good grant to the organization. A team of 50 volunteers, consisting of 11 New York Life Volunteers for Good, 19 Kenilworth Fire Fighters and EMT's and 20 Kenilworth family and friends supported the two-day "make-over" event which resulted in a major facelift to the aging EMT building. "Our team is proud to be actively involved with the Kenilworth Rescue Squad," said Kate Matier, Kenilworth EMT as well as NYL volunteer.

Located at the corner of Cross Street and 17th Street, the little brick building the EMT Squad calls home faithfully services Kenilworth's 7,800 residents, responding to almost 1,000 emergency calls annually. The all-volunteer Department is comprised of 45 active members with 8 dedicated EMT's and 15 fire fighters who also pull doubleduty as EMT's.

Organizers Lieutenant Jessica Delgado-Days, EMT Kate Matier and Kenilworth Fire Department Battalion Chief John Mauro conducted several meetings to identify the feasible scope of the work. After determining the various projects (new ceiling tiles, fixture lamps, carpet, furniture, paint, etc.) tasks were divided amongst the members and all went to work.

As a charity endeavor, the team enlisted the support of local merchants who would be willing to assist. Battalion Chief John Mauro and volunteer Bill Matier wrote up the general construction materials list and headed to Home

The Kenilworth rescue Squad announced today that the Depot of Union on Rt. 22. There over \$700 worth of ceiling tiles, fixture lamps and lenses, paint, brushes, rollers, and various other sundries were purchased at a 10% discount. Two beautiful convertible couches were provided by Furniture ConnXion of Kenilworth at a significant discount. Of course, new furniture needs a new floor and Hannon Floor Covering Center came to the rescue providing new carpeting at cost. All new window blinds were donated by Stan Wnek of Suncoast Window Treatments in Springfield.

Once all the materials were on-hand it was time for the "big day". On Saturday, May 3, 2014, over 50 volunteers mobilized to the building. During the next 12 hours, the building began its transformation.

Of course, all these volunteers require feeding and again it was local businesses to the "rescue". Lunch was provided by Big Apple Pizza at a 50% discount. Dinner offered burgers and hot dogs off the grill, courtesy of an unknown benefactor.

A beautiful mural depicting the EMT Star of Life on one wall of the meeting room was painted by the skilled hand of artist and EMT Julia Adubato.

"The team of volunteers from New York Life's Parsippany Office has been instrumental in assisting our organization," said Lieutenant Jessica Delgado-Days. "We are grateful to New York Life for supporting our mission." The Volunteers for Good Program recognizes and encourages the group efforts of New York Life's employees, retirees and agents. Qualified teams may apply for a grant for nonprofit organizations where they volunteer.





KENILWORTH SCHOOLS OPENING THE YEAR WHILE MAKING STRIDES

The Star Ledger's top high school rankings list has been published in its September issue of Inside Jersey and David Brearley has risen on the list of Union County schools. This year, Brearley ranks five schools higher on the list and improved its score by three points.

Kenilworth's high school maintained a distant 25 points from its next lowest county peer (Union Township) and is within three points of its next highest county peer (Roselle Park). The article can be downloaded in its entirety by going to the district's website - www.kenilworthschools.com

The Harding and Brearley test scores are on the rise, and the progress comes as the 2014-2015 academic year kicked off with teachers and support staff returning on September 2. Other changes as personnel and families return include the addition of two new educational leaders who have already made a tremendous impact on our programs.


Andrew White comes to Kenilworth from the Watchung Borough School District and has assumed the mantle of David Brearley's Assistant Principal. Mr. White hit the ground running and has already helped Principal Brian Luciani prepare for the opening of the school

year with plans for getting to know the middle and high schoolers on very personal levels, preparing the Kenilworth Scholars Academy, and closing out the summer school program.

Susie Budine is the school district's first Director of Pupil Personnel Services and comes to us with over eight years of administrative experience. The Brearley Guidance Department has been expanded and made more effective under the summer leadership of Mrs. Budine. A third guidance counselor has been added to the staff and there are now two secretaries assisting students in the high school's guidance office. All special education and guidance services have been centralized.



Kenilworth Board of Health President, Randy M. Moscaritolo, announced that the Michael L. Vitale, Sr. Health Fair will be held on Saturday, September 27th, 2014 at St. Theresa's Elementary School, 540 Washington Avenue, Kenilworth, NJ from 9 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Health Professionals will be providing screenings and educational materials for: Vision, Hypertension, Dental, Colorectal cancer, Hearing, Vascular Educator, Prostate Health, Posture, Scoliosis, Breast self-exam, Podiatry, Diabetes and Blood Chemistry (SMAC/CBC).

NOTE: If you are taking the SMAC/CBC blood test, You Must Fast after 12AM the night before. DO NOT TAKE THE DIABETES TEST.

The following IMMUNIZATIONS will also be provided at no cost: DPT for ages one to seven years old; MMR-ages 15 months to six years old (three in one Vaccine provides protection against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella), Polio vaccine-ages one to eighteen years; Tetanus booster shots for adults.

The SMAC & CBC Blood test will be offered FREE of charge to Kenilworth Residents and a \$25.00 fee for Non-residents. There will also be a \$30.00 charge to residents taking PSA (Prostate Screening) and \$35.00 to Non-Residents.




