Union High School Junior ROTC "Maroon Guard" won its first Army Nationals title in the Armed category at Louisville, KY this spring. After two years of finishing in second place Union achieved its goal of placing first in the country. Maroon Guard Commanders C/Maj. Daryll Henson, C/CSM Tiago Teixeira, C/SGM Aaron Magras and C/1SG Vincent Francis trained the team to be razor sharp in four events: Inspection, Regulation, Color Guard and Exhibition (fancy) drill. Months of practice and drill paid off when Union placed 2nd in Inspection, 4th in Regulation, 2nd in Color Guard, and had a very strong finish in exhibition. Union's total score secured a 1st Place overall in the Armed category and earned Union Junior ROTC top honors over forty other competing schools.

The Army Nationals is the largest and finest Army-only competition held anywhere. Only the best JROTC programs are selected to attend the competition. The event is designed to host roughly 1,000 cadets and instructors and showcases many of the finest drill programs in the world of Army JROTC drill. There are four team events and the scores for each are combined for an overall winner.

The Unit Inspection event involves cadets and a Cadet Commander standing inspection in front of four event judges who will look for any and every

imperfection. Both Regulation and Color Guard drills are comprised of graded, memorized movements performed in sequence for judge evaluation. The Exhibition Drill allows units to perform both unarmed and armed movements left to the imagination of the drill team. This is a military competition with military judges therefore the displays require precision military movements and formations in this championship event.

Junior ROTC is designed to teach high school students the value of citizenship, leadership, service to the community, and personal responsibility, while instilling in them self-esteem, teamwork and self-discipline.

5K RUN/WALK KICKS OFF FESTIVAL ON THE GREEN, SEPT. 20TH

Kicking off the Mayor's Day events will be the Union Chamber of Commerce's 5K Run/Walk with race registration at 8:30 a.m .and a race time of 10 a.m. The 5K Run/Walk will start and finish on Cooke Drive (senior parking lot) at Union High School along a USATF certified course. Participants will receive an event T-shirt and gift bag. Prizes will be awarded for various categories.

A Kid's Run for grades K through five will begin at 9 a.m., with registration from 8-8:45 a.m.; no pre-registration. The cost is \$5. 

EVENTS CELEBRATE NJ'S 350TH ANNIVERSARY

The Union Township Historical Society will host Richard King, a railroad historian with particular expertise in short and obscure rail lines, on Sunday, September 21, at 2:30 pm, at the Caldwell Parsonage, 909 Caldwell Avenue, Union. King will give a presentation on the Rahway Valley Railroad-only 11.8 miles long-which operated in Union from 1904 until its abandonment in 1992. His book, Just a Short Line: The Story of the Rahway Valley Railroad (Volume 1: History of the Line, 1897-1950), will be released in August. On Sunday, September 28, members of the UTHS and guests will hike the third and final leg of the Victory Trail (from Connecticut Farms Presbyterian Church to Springfield Presbyterian Church), which traces the route followed by British and Hessian forces in their failed attempt to capture George Washington and his men in Morristown in June 1780.

Two hundred members of the Brigade of the American Revolution will reenact the Battle of Connecticut Farms on Saturday, October 18. Sponsored by the Historical Society, the "fighting" will take place where it actually occurred historically (on June 7, 1780)—in front of Connecticut Farms Presbyterian Church, 888 Stuyvesant Avenue, Union. (That encounter, coupled with the Battle of Springfield, 16 days later, prevented British and Hessian forces from capturing George Washington and his troops in Morristown.) On Sunday, November 16, at 2:30 pm, the UTHS will welcome Maureen Wlodarczyk author, columnist, genealogist, speaker, and blogger (whose website is www.pastforward.com). Maureen's latest book, Jersey! Then . . . Again, is a collection of 36 episodes of New Jersey historic people and events suffragettes, boxers, hurricanes, gangs, hot air balloonists, con artists, politicians, inventors, women in the war effort, military heroes, and more. Her program will relate how it all happened in New Jersey.





Suicide prevention hotline and trainer CONTACT We Care will be offering its next round of training for volunteer listeners beginning Wednesday, Sept. 10, at 7:00 p.m. at the First Baptist Church of Westfield, 170 Elm Street. The training program meets once weekly for 12 weeks.

Volunteers undergo 50 hours of instruction in empathetic and nonjudgmental active listening and mental health issues and go through a twoday intensive session on suicide intervention called ASIST, or Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training. There is a fee for materials of \$75 and volunteers are asked to commit to eight hours on the lines per month for a at least one year.


