



CREATING A MODEL OF THE SOLAR SYSTEM

Students in Ms. DeFalco's and Mr. Rodriguez's 6th grade Earth Science classes at Carl H. Kumpf Middle School in Clark took advantage of the beautiful fall weather and went outside to create a model of the Solar System.

Students have recently studied the unique characteristics of the planets in our Solar System. As a part of the learning process, students were required to conduct research on their own to answer such questions as, "What is the largest planet?", "Which two planets are closest together?", "Why are the terrestrial planets closer to the Sun?". Students then worked together to create a scaled down model of the Solar System. The lab required students to research the distance in astronomical units between each planet, and come up with a system of measurement that would accurately express these distances on an open field.




on the track. This was a non-timed event.

The event drew over 100 registered participants. All event proceeds raised will go towards PTA programs and activities for Hehnly students throughout the year.



On October 7th, students from Arthur L. Johnson High school were privileged to attend a knee replacement surgery through the Liberty Science Center's "Live From Surgery" Program. Bernadette Jacobi, accomplished Biology Teacher at ALJ, has developed a long-standing relationship with the staff at the Liberty Science Center through repeated successful field trips to the facility for the program. Jacobi, who teaches AP Biology, Anatomy & Physiology, and Premedical Studies, has had such noted success in bringing student groups to the Liberty Science Center that two ALJ students, Caitlyn Moran and Justin Veltre, were interviewed by the center to make a promotional video. The "Live From Surgery" program, primarily funded by Johnson & Johnson and Verizon, enables students to witness a live surgery and ask questions of the surgeon via microphone during the procedure. afforded her students, has been previously honored by being selected to pilot surgeries that are new to the program- like last year's open heart surgery. POST-IMPRESSIONIST PAINTERS

If you looked in the courtyard at Valley Road School during art period, you would find a group of fifth graders, diligently painting the landscape surrounding them or a landscape from their imagination. Students have begun creating their post-impressionism landscape paintings, inspired by the style of Vincent Van Gogh.

In Michelle Matesic's art class, students are learning all about the famous artist Vincent Van

Gogh. Van Gogh was born in the Netherlands and began painting in the late 1800s. The color palette on his work was first limited to dark colors but this all changed when he encountered the neo-impressionism and impressionism styles in Paris. Van Gogh then began incorporating brighter colors into his painting and developed more of painterly style that was distinctive of his paintings. He also became the pioneer for the

post-impressionist style, where the paintings had vivid colors, a thick application of paint, and real-life subject matter. Artists who used this style of art also distorted form for expressive effect, emphasized geometric forms, and used unnatural or arbitrary colors to complete their work.

After learning about Van Gogh and his painting style, students then looked at his famous painting, Starry Night. Fifth graders discussed the style of the painting, the short brushstrokes and bright colors as well as the art principles harmony and unity. Then students moved class outdoors and began their paintings. Matesic instructed them to create an outdoor landscape just as Vincent Van Gogh did and use the post-impressionist style while painting. Student artwork contained vibrant colors and lots of movement, showing their understanding of the art style, post-impressionism.

"The fifth graders were instructed to create outdoor landscape paintings and at Valley Road School we have this beautiful outdoor area that was perfect to be utilized for this project. The students were able to make use of the nature around them to inspire their paintings and help create their landscapes," said Matesic. "Vincent Van Gogh once said 'Great things are done by a series of small things brought together.' And I believe that the small act of moving art class outdoors has helped students to see a different side of creating art and will help them to continue doing great things in art class."

TRAILBLAZING PLANS FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF **NEW SCIENCE STANDARDS**

Teachers and administrators from the Clark Public School District are part of a multi-district consortium focused on New Jersey's adoption of the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). This phase of the consortium, which began in July, involves a series of grade-band collaborative meetings. On October 20th, the consortium focused upon K-2 science instruction and, specifically how the NGSS entail both a dichotomy shift in science education and a realignment of which topics are covered in which grades. The NGSS mark the first time that state science standards in New Jersey will provide specific direction on what topics are covered in each grade K-5. The NGSS

take effect September 2016 for grades 6-12 and September 2017 for grades K-5. The NGSS were already adopted by a multitude of states prior to their adoption by New Jersey and, comparable to the Common Core Standards, the NGSS mark an overall trend for alignment in United States education. At the elementary level meetings, 5th grade teachers Bryan Lowe of Valley Road School and Kathy Ulrich of Frank K. Henhnly School were joined by K-5 Supervisor Janeen Allmendinger and 6-12 Science, World Language, Business & Technology Supervisor Thomas Misiak as the Clark Public Schools collaborated with other leading districts on the adoption of the NGSS.



WHAT RESIDENTS SHOULD KNOW ABOUT WILDLIFE, RABIES, AND RODENTS

On October 20, 2014, the Clark Health Clark Township in the area of Terminal Ave. Department was notified that a skunk involved in an attack on a domestic animal (dog) tested positive for rabies.


Pet owners are reminded to check the rabies vaccination status of their animal and to keep the rabies vaccination current.

All residents are encouraged to read and review the following advisory.

of wildlife due to its natural waterways, deciduous woodlands and suburban geographic boundaries. Types of wildlife include raccoons, skunks, groundhogs, moles, opossums, squirrels, rabbits, fox and most recently coyote. Clark also supports a large rodent (i.e. rat) population.

Rabies is a viral disease that is transmitted through virus-laden saliva of a rabid animal introduced by a bite or a scratch. The rabies virus can infect all warm-blooded animals. Since infected wildlife does not always appear sick or exhibit the symptoms of rabies, it is advisable to avoid contact with wildlife. Some animals such as skunks and raccoons, which are primarily nocturnal, may be seen during the daytime. This does not mean that they are rabid. Their homes may have been disturbed, it may be breeding season, or they may be foraging for food for their young.

In 2009 a rabid raccoon was identified in

In an effort to protect you, your family and your pets, residents are urged to take the following precautions:

- 1. Vaccinate your dogs and cats against rabies. 2. Make sure that all garbage, especially garbage containing food waste, is placed in metal or heavy duty plastic garbage cans with lids.
- Clark Township is indigenous to many types 3. Clean up after your pet. Wildlife and rats will eat animal waste.
 - 4. Never leave pet food or water outside of your home.
 - 5. DO NOT FEED THE BIRDS. THIS INCLUDES BREAD.
 - 6. Discard of rotted vegetables from your garden.
 - 7. Cut grass, trim bushes and cut back tree branches frequently to prevent harborage and access to your home.

- 8. Remove den sites such as wood pilings. Keep storage sheds free of debris and accumulation.
- 9. Have chimneys professionally capped. Screen off decks and porches. Rats will burrow under decks, elevated sheds etc.
- 10. Perform a home self-inspection. Check for broken windows, torn screens, cracks and holes in building foundations and gaps under doorways.
- 11. Drain pool covers of water, invert buckets, barrels, planters etc, and eliminate areas of stagnant and/or standing water.
- 12. Educate and supervise children to stay away from wildlife. THINK SAFETY FIRST.
- 13. Never attempt to corner or trap wildlife. Seek professional assistance from a certified wildlife removal company or licensed exterminator.
- 14. Remove compost piles as they are a source of harborage and food.






