





have been honored to be a member of an outstanding volunteer service organization known as the Cranford First Aid Squad. Seven years ago I walked into the Squad building for the first time and asked for an application to join an organization which, although I didn't know it at the time, would shape both my character and my career. To this day - even in my clinical practice - there are valuable lessons that I've learned during my time on the Cranford First Aid Squad that I continue to use and apply each and every day. I have always been fascinated with medicine and a strong desire to serve others. Given my serious interest in medicine

Recently Cranford resident Shannon Rasmussen returned home and reminisced about experiences that were instrumental in shaping her future. Here are her recollections:

For the last seven years, I

and a thirst for knowledge, I felt that the Squad would offer me an experience that no other community service could – a hands-on application in the medical field and an immersion into the world where compassion and composure were just as important as clinical competency.

It was through the constant support, mentoring and encouragement of the highlyskilled squad members, that I realized I wanted to practice medicine for the rest of my life. After investigating various options, I discovered the profession of Physician Assistants. I instantly fell in love with the skilled and compassionate way they interacted with and treated patients. It reminded me of the volunteers I had come to know at the First Aid Squad - truly selfless individuals who never hesitated to go that extra mile to care for the Cranford community and neighboring towns when called on in an emergency. As a direct result of becoming EMT certified and my experiences on the squad, I applied to a 5-year accelerated program at Philadelphia University, a program that would allow me to complete a BS in Health Sciences in three years and a MS in Physician Assistant Studies during the last two years. I wrote about my experiences as an EMT for my entrance

essay, and was accepted to the PA program.

During the rigorous final two years in the PA program, I worked diligently and spent many sleepless nights studying and serving as a Physician Assistant student at various hospitals in the Philadelphia/South Jersey area. However, I always thought about the Squad. I missed the camaraderie of this group who were so giving and caring of others; volunteering entire nights or weekends responding to emergencies; giving up hours of their free time to teach Cub Scout and Girl Scout troops, community organizations and others about first aid, and run free blood pressure screenings. I knew that if I could finish the program and secure a job near Cranford, I might one day be able to return and continue to serve the Squad that I have come to cherish.

The lessons that I have taken from serving the community as a member of the Cranford First Aid Squad have been absolutely invaluable. The time that all of the members - both past and present - have invested in me has been instrumental in my development as a competent and confident healthcare professional.

I graduated PA school and became certified as a PA-C in August 2014. I am now officially off of college leave and happy to be back with the Squad. It feels great to be back home again!



TWELVE CRANFORD RESIDENTS REACH INCREDIBLE HEIGHTS AT PHILMONT SCOUT RANCH IN NEW MEXICO

stepped on a plane at Newark Liberty Airport to start their trip of a Boy Scout's lifetime to Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron New Mexico. Scouts and scouters for generations have headed west to Philmont for the ultimate high adventure experience. To date, over one million Scouts have visited Boy Scouting's ultimate destination. The 214 square mile ranch opened in 1938, a gift from oil man Waite Philips, is a piece of the real Wild West. Sitting at the foot of the Sangre de Christ Mountains, Philmont accepts over 25,000 Boy Scouts each year, making it the largest youth camp in the world.

The 14-day event started in Colorado Springs, Colorado for a 2-day altitude acclimation program where the scouts were treated to a trip to Pike's Peak elevation, 14,114 feet above sea level, a tour and hike in the beautiful red rock formation park at Garden of the Gods, a tour of The US Air Force Academy and concluded with

River.

Upon arrival at Philmont the crew 714 D-2 was introduced to their ranger, Dom F. that would conduct their final training and spend the first two days with them, teaching the scouts the ways of the trail, cooking, navigating, sanitation and first aid skills were some topics of this walking two day university of survival. Upon completion the ranger bid them farewell and the crew was on their own for the next 10 days. The high altitude and extreme thunder and lightning storms tested the training of the fit crew on several occasions during the trek. Starting at 6,000 feet above sea level they traveled to the top of Mt. Philip 11,110 ft. In total the crew travelled 75 miles with all supplies on their back totaling over 50 lbs. each.

While in camps the crew were treated to the featured activity of that camp. Blacksmithing, real rock climbing, firing black powder rifles and shotguns, gold mining, tomahawk throwing

This summer twelve Cranford residents a whitewater rafting adventure in the Arkansas and horseback riding were just some of the activities. The staffed camps featured period reenactors of the mountain men that ran logging camps in the early days on the 20th century. A comedic musical show by the reenactors was the evening's entertainment for two nights on the trail. A special side trip lead the crew to the crash site of a world war II B-24 bomber. Parts of the plane still remain on the mountain. The trek wrapped up with a root beer reception at the home of Kit Carson and the Kit Carson museum.

In the spirit of giving back the crew served on a conservation project to repair trails for crews who will follow in years to come.

Although the trip was 12 days in length, many hours of conditioning and training were spent in preparation for the rigors of backpacking through the wilderness and climbing to such elevations in the thin aired environment of the 11,742 foot high mountain tops. The brotherhood that the crew created in the year of comradery will last for a lifetime.

AMATEUR ASTRONOMERS INVITED EVEY FRIDAY EVENING

Amateur Astronomers, Inc. (AAI), with its home on the Cranford campus of Union County College since 1967, is one of the largest astronomy clubs in the U.S. The William Miller Sperry Observatory, located on the campus, holds two of the largest telescopes available to the public in the Northeast. The East Dome of the observatory holds a 10-inch f/15 refractor built by AAI members and donated to the college in 1972. The West Dome holds a 24-inch f/11 Cassegrain reflector purchased and owned by AAI and installed in 1974. AAI hosts a Qualified Observers course for members only where they learn to operate the 24-inch and 10inch telescopes. Members can also learn astrophotography and telescope making. For information contact membership@asterism.org.

Open free to the public every Friday evening from 7:30 to 10:30 in all weather (although the domes will be closed on cloudy nights), AAI hosts a public Astronomy talk at 8:30 pm. Earlier programs for younger audiences, such as

scout groups and school children, must be scheduled in advance by emailing info@asterism.org. These programs are tailored to the particular group and consist of such topics as the Constellations, the Solar System, and how to use binoculars and star wheels. The public is invited to look through the huge 10-inch and 24inch dome telescopes and AAI members' telescopes set up outside the observatory. Admission is always free and there is plenty of free parking! In addition, AAI holds Star Parties at Trailside Nature &n Science Center, in Mountainside, and at Sandy Hook State Park.

From September through May, on the third Friday of the month, AAI holds is monthly membership meeting in the Nomehegan building on the UCC campus. Each month a professional guest speaker from prominent universities such as Columbia, Rutgers, and Princeton as well as NASA, give a presentation relating to Astronomy. These meetings are also free and open to the public.

Please be advised that Sperry is an Observatory and not a planetarium. The temperature inside the domes is the same as outside, and viewing of the night sky is done in cramped quarters in almost total darkness. Such conditions may not be suitable for very young children.


CRANFORD HISTORICAL SOCIETY TO PRESENT "FREDERIC CARDER AND STEUBEN GLASS"


"While many recognize the name Louis Comfort Tiffany and associate it with turn of the century art glass creations, far fewer may recognize the name Frederic Carder. Carder, the founder of Steuben Glass, was a contemporary of Tiffany, who considered him his most important competitor (even bringing an unsuccessful lawsuit against him for theft of intellectual property). While similar to Tiffany in being a "Renaissance Man" in his breadth of skills, Carder distinguished himself from the former by actually blowing some of the creations he designed—something Tiffany never did.

Cranford Historical Society Trustee and art glass collector Vic Bary will speak about Frederic Carder and Steuben Glass. The presentation will include many visuals as well as some examples of Carder's Art Nouveau glass. Mr. Bary has previously presented on the Art Glass of Louis Tiffany, as well as competitors Quezal and Durand on behalf of the Cranford Historical Society previously this year.
