MOTHER SETON STUDENTS GIVE THANKS








N.J. DEVILS RIGHT WINGER GRANT MARSHALL HOLDS HOCKEY CLINIC



GIRL SCOUT TROOP 40549 LENDS A HAND TO PROJECT "BRAVERY BAGS"





ALJ MARCHING BAND DETAILS END OF SEASON ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Johnson's Crusader Marching Band flew through the rankings this past season with their field show, "Apollo 13". Throughout these past two months, they have accomplished so much, on and off the field—and this season was only the beginning.

The Band's 2013 field show, "Atlantis", earned the band some great recognition; one of which being promoted from A-Class to Open Class. A-Class is a competing class aimed a bands with less experience, funding or staff, and just eight years ago and has molded itself into a Open Class is for the most competitive, highachieving bands. ALJ's band spent three years in A-Class before being promoted. The promotion to Open Class meant that the band had to work harder than ever, and that they might not do as well as they have in past years, but this did not scare the band members.

"We went from an inexperienced group who had to learn to walk left-foot-first, to a conditioned powerhouse that took control of the field. It's been unbelievable!" stated colorguard co-captain Katie Weilandics. "Mrs. Bollaro pushed us to our limits, and we've created a band whose name will not be unheard of in seasons to come."

At their first competition this season, the band took home the award for second place, receiving a score of 80.3. To the band and staff, this was a good starting place. They understood that they needed to grow, and grow they did.

At the Atlantic Coast Championships in Hershey, PA, the band competed against band's with decades of experience competing in the Open Class. With that afternoon's performance, they finally placed ninth out of twenty-six qualifying bands with a final score of 92.2! Additionally, the Band's woodwind section placed second overall.

"We accomplished so much," stated Caroline Hoynowski, piccolo section leader. "We have really pushed ourselves enough to make this show the best it can be!"

ALJ's Marching Band started from nothing successful, disciplined machine-one could say the band has skyrocketed, and in more ways than one. This season's success in Open Class was only the beginning.

Though it's disappointing to see this season come to a close and tough to see the seniors say goodbye, the Crusader Marching Band will continue to strive for a long, long time because of its wonderful staff members, hardworking students and supportive parents.




BUDDY CLASSES GIVE THANKS FOR EACH OTHER






