COACH STUEBER INDUCTED INTO WRESTLING HALL OF FAME


Rahway High School's beloved teacher and wrestling coach, Mr. Fred Stueber, was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame at a banquet held at the Jumping Brook Country Club in Neptune, NJ. He was one of only five people selected for a "Lifetime of Service to Wrestling." Among friends, family, colleagues, and former students who were there to honor him, Mr. Stueber, being characteristically modest, questioned his being selected for this prestigious honor. Those who know him feel that this award was long overdue. Fred was first nominated two years ago and won his position in the second round.

Coach Stueber is a graduate of Rahway High School's Class of 1970, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He left Rahway to attend Concord College in West Virginia, where he fell in love with wrestling, despite not being very good at first and wrestled to a 21-20 record. He returned to RHS in 1976 as a teacher and began his coaching career in 1983, having also become the 1976 New Jersey Golden Gloves runner-up. Again, he says that he was not good at first but improved with the help and support of other coaches and friends. His record of coaching six State Championships, a High School National Champion, four High School All-Americans All-Americans is a and two College testament to his talent, skill and dedication.

In the course of his career, Coach Stueber has earned many accolades and honors, including numerous "Coach of the Year" awards. In addition to wrestling, Fred has coached football, track, baseball, soccer and gymnastics and has never let the lack of funding or equipment stand in the way of his players' involvement. As a coach and Physical Education teacher, he has cultivated a better athlete, but more importantly, a better person. He instills in his athletes the values of character, integrity, honesty and hard work. He exemplifies these attributes, once sacrificing a title for good sportsmanship and doing the right thing.

As his legions of current and former students, athletes and colleagues will attest, Mr. Fred Stueber is an exemplary teacher, coach, role model, and mentor. He is not just teaching wrestling skills-he is teaching life skills. The Rahway community and schools feel privileged to know and work with this humble, dedicated gentleman. When asked how he felt about winning this honor, he responded, "It's the icing on a career. I've been on a cloud ever since. It's also a pat on the back to all of the athletes who have wrestled under my tutelage and all of the coaches who have worked with me."

Congratulations, Coach Stueber, on your induction into the Wrestling Hall of Fame. It is well deserved.


BROKEN HEARTS MEMORIAL WILL BE A LIVING TRIBUTE TO FALLEN HEROES





RAHWAY'S ANNUAL CROP HUNGER WALK

Rahway and surrounding towns gathered at following massive devastation. Rahway City Hall for Rahway's annual Crop Hunger Walk. There were approximately 125 people who participated in the walk. Along the 2.5 mile route the walkers stopped at five churches. Each church had members present to greet the walkers, take them into their sanctuaries, and give them bottled water and/or snacks. The walk concluded at Trinity United Methodist Church which is diagonally across from City Hall. Here the walkers were greeted by several members who were playing instruments in the sanctuary. Then they went to their fellowship hall for refreshments and to receive their certificate of appreciation for community service.

The Rahway CROP Hunger Walk was a huge success. More than \$4,000 was contributed by our neighbors and friends to support the hungerfighting efforts of Church World Service, both here at home and around the world. Our local soup kitchen, "Food for Friends" will receive approximately \$1,000 to aid fellow Rahway residents in need, and some \$3,000 will make possible the global work of Church World



PLANTS AS GIFTS

as a gift this season you can't go wrong with a 'croton'.

Crotons (Codiaeum) have very colorful leaves which can brighten any winter day. With basic care these colorful houseplants will easily survive for years in a sunny window. A few hours of sunlight is the key to maintain the best color on the leaves. Red, yellow, pink and green are often on the same leaf with no two leaves identical.

When giving a houseplant as a gift it is important to consider its new home. If the recipient often says "I kill every plant I get" give them a plant that is easy to care for such as a Christmas cactus (Schlumbergera). Blooming during the holiday season these tropical plants are very easy to keep alive. The key to bringing this plant into flower every year is natural sunlight. As the days get shorter it triggers these plants to develop their flowers.

Orchids and Poinsettia, both popular gifts are very sensitive to drafts and temperature fluctuations. It is important to get your plant home from the shop without damaging it. Cover the plant with plastic or a paper bag, then move it from the store to a warm spot in your car, not the cold car trunk. Once home remove it

If you are searching for a houseplant to give immediately from the wrapping (which will now hold the cold) and check the soil for moisture. When taking your gifts to their new home repeat the process. This care will avoid your orchids from dropping unopened blooms or your poinsettia from wilting away in just a few days. If the cashier is busy, step to the side and properly cover the plants before leaving the

> Finally find the care instructions for your plant in a book or on the internet, make a copy and give this with the plant. It will help answer any questions, ensure proper care and give the plant a better chance for survival.

Without a procedure called crosslinking, a cornea transplant and special contacts lenses he will lose his sight.

Keratoconus is an abnormality of the eye in which the normal round dome-shaped cornea

weakens and becomes progressively thinner and irregular in shape. The resulting cone-shaped cornea can cause high levels of astigmatism (irregular curvature) and nearsightedness. The cornea is the clear window of the eye and is responsible for refracting, or bending, most of the light coming into the eye. Therefore abnormalities of the cornea can severely affect the way we see the world, making it difficult to perform simple tasks, such as driving, watching TV, or reading.

JANET'S LAW ENSURES AED AVAILABILITY

from sudden cardiac arrest (SCA). Children are not immune from this statistic, which is why schools all over the United States are writing and enacting policies to increase SCA survival with strategies that will deliver defibrillation earlier than an EMS system.

In New Jersey, the bill ensuring that all public schools have an automated external defibrillator (AED) available on school property is called "Janet's Law." This law is in memory of a student who died of SCA following a cheerleading practice in New Jersey.

This recent bill was just put into effect in September 2014.

Some of the many stipulations in this bill include:

- Every year approximately 220,000 people die Someone certified in AED use must be present at every athletic event, team practice and cheerleading practice or other such activities.
 - The AED must be placed in a specified unlocked location within close proximity to an athletic field or gym.
 - This AED needs to be maintained and tested according to manufacturer's guidelines.
 - An "Emergency Action Plan" needs to be written and implemented to respond to sudden cardiac events, including, but not limited to, those cardiac events which would make use of defibrillation.
 - At least five school faculty members be certified in CPR and AED use. This list must be posted, updated as necessary, and made current yearly.





YMCA IN RAHWAY DATES BACK TO 1879

The Young Men's Christian Association, commonly known as the YMCA or more simply the "Y," was founded by George Williams in London, England on June 6, 1844. Williams and his associates were concerned that the only leisure activities available for most young men were found in pool halls, taverns, and brothels and felt there was a serious need for a place that would offer healthy activities. To this end, they set out to create an organization that would "instill Christian principles into practice by developing a heathy body, mind, and spirit."

The concept grew and by the 1870s the YMCA had become a recognized organization with "Y" groups forming in several countries including the United States. The first reference to a Rahway group appears in a newspaper article dated May, 28, 1879. "A number of young gentlemen have arranged to organize a gymnastic club provided that at least 15 names can be procured as subscribers. Arrangements have been made for a suitable room and it is hoped that the necessary apparatus will be secured within a fortnight. Gentlemen who are interested can obtain information by inquiring of Christian Elrich, Irving Street, near Cherry."

Within the next six months, the interested gentlemen had organized to the point where they were ready to adopt a constitution, by-laws, and elect officers. Their stated objective was "To promote and advance the cause of religion and morality in the community, and to establish a reading room where the young men of the city may spend an evening in useful reading and social intercourse." The initial meeting was held on Thursday, November 13, 1879 in a room above the post office which was then located in the Woodruff Building on Irving Street.

YMCA membership grew and before the end of the 1880s, the group was able to construct their first home which was located on the same site as the present "Y." The building contained two bowling alleys, offices, and a gym. By 1918 a new, more modern building was needed and in March of that year, plans were underway for a new "Y." The staff reported, "It will be the best building in the city. It will be 3 ½ stories high containing 46 separate bedrooms, and will contain a large gymnasium and a swimming pool, 21x60 feet. There are to be four Brunswick Balke bowling alleys and five billiard tables. The ground floor is to be one great long open room 93 feet long with a fireplace at one end.

The cost will be about \$135,000 when completed."

The official Grand Opening of the new "Y" took place on Monday, December 23, 1918 with over 1,000 people on hand to hear speeches and tour the complex. YMCA President, F. W. Rossell, accepted the key to the building and commented, "The Young Men's Christian Association of Rahway with this building and its fine appointments, we trust, will become the center of mental, physical, and spiritual advancement for its members and the city at large."

Baby Boomers born after both WWI and WWII kept membership high over the next 50 years with "Y" teams excelling in swimming, basketball, and bowling. A major highlight occurred on April 5, 1930 when the Rahway YMCA basketball team travelled to Oak Park, Illinois to capture the International YMCA Basketball Championship by defeating the team from Kansas City.

By the 1970s, due in large part to the economic and social changes of the times, and to a facility that had become antiquated, activity at the "Y" had waned. To re-energize the plant and the program, a modernization plan was initiated with the biggest project being the construction of a six-lane, Olympic sized, heated swimming pool in 1978.

Just as interest and activities were increasing,




a major setback occurred on the night of November 11, 1981, when a fire swept through the building causing substantial damage to the 2nd and 3rd floor dormitory rooms, the roof, the old bowling alleys, and offices. Fortunately the new pool, lockers, and gym were not affected.

In 1996, the "Y" was acquired by the YMCA of Eastern Union County, joining Union and Elizabeth as a third branch. The new group modernized the 1918 structure over the next two years with renovations done to the gym, locker rooms, and pool. A preschool childcare center and cardiovascular fitness training area were also opened.

In 2013, The YMCA of Eastern Union County changed its name to The Gateway Family YMCA and began a \$4 million dollar, 16,938 square foot renovation. The work included a new front entrance and lobby with four multipurpose rooms and a lounge area overlooking the pool with original fireplace. Renovations were done to the men's and women's locker rooms, two family locker rooms were added, and 27 new bathroom facilities were constructed. A new cardiovascular room and new strength training room were added and the third floor dormitory space was remodeled into five artist lofts.

Once again the YMCA has re-established itself as a center for wholesome activity for Rahway and the surrounding communities.




