**SCHOOL JOINS MILLIONS IN TEACHING COMPUTER SCIENCE** 

90 percent of American schools don't teach computer science. Fewer students are learning how computers work than a decade ago. Girls and minorities are severely underrepresented. And yet, technology is increasingly shaping almost every aspect of how we live our lives.

That's why 621 of the students at Franklin Elementary School in Rahway are joining in on the largest education event in history: The Hour of Code. During Computer Science Education Week (December 8-14), Mrs. Linda Lampert, the school's Elementary Technology Facilitator had every student from kindergarten through 6th grade spend one hour learning computer science, doing online tutorials featuring Bill Gates, Mark Zuckerberg and Angry Birds.

The Hour of Code is a campaign to prove that regardless of age, race or gender, anyone can learn how to not just consume, but build the technologies of the future.

Franklin School students are joining 2 million

already planning to try one Hour of Code during Dec. 8-14 worldwide. This movement, organized by Code.org and supported by Apple, Google, Microsoft, Amazon, Boys & Girls Clubs of America, and over 100 others, is a statement that today's generation of students are ready to learn critical skills for 21st century success. **NIKOLA TESLA BUST DISPLAYED AT TRAIN STATION PLAZA**


A bust of the famous scientist was recently donated to the city by the

Tesla Science Foundation and has been temporarily placed on the east side of the station, under the canopy, at Train Station Plaza.

"A permanent location for the bust will be determined but the current spot was chosen because it fit nicely in the space and was protected from the weather", City Administrator Cherron Rountree said. "We are also reviewing options for a more prominent location at or near Train Station Plaza, where Tesla flipped the switch for the first time" she said. An small unveiling ceremony is expected once a permanent location is chosen.

Some commuters and residents wish that the bust be moved sooner rather than later. A commuter recently voiced on Rahway Rising's blog "They couldn't have put this in a worse spot. Nobody but us commuters sees this piece of art where they situated it. It's an insult to Tesla's work and residency in Rahway. "

Nikola Tesla formed the Tesla Electric Light & Manufacturing company in April 1887. Based on Irving street, the company started after Tesla left Thomas Edison's employment following a disagreement over payment. Tesla found financial backers who funded a laboratory where Tesla developed an arc lamp for streetlights; the design was patented, the lamps built and first installed in Rahway.

# **EASY WINTER BIRD FEEDING: FRUIT**

Mockingbirds, Cardinals and Purple Finches blueberries or cranberries if available. are a few of our local back yard birds that eat fruit. Bountiful in the summer a planting of fruiting trees and shrubs is a sure way to bring these and many other beautiful migrating birds into our gardens. Most birds follow these fruiting trees and flowers as they migrate south in the winter months.

For the birds that don't migrate, fruit in winter is impossible to find but still greatly appreciated if you can supply it.

Apples, grapes, raisins are the best choice for winter bird feeding.\*

Raisins are the easiest fruit to supply. Just put a few in the same area each day and your birds will make a daily visit to that area.

If you have extra apples, rather than putting them in the trash feed them to birds. Apples store for a long period of time so keep them in your crisper until you want them. They don't have to be perfect. Over-ripe apples with a few brown spots are fine. Birds aren't picky. Simply cut off the top or slice them if you prefer. You can toss them out the door but I put them on a spike where I have a good view from my window.

If you have a lot of extra grapes put some in the freezer until you need them. I only put out three of four grapes a day. You can also serve

I try to avoid waste that can attract unwanted visitors at night, such as mice.

Don't be surprised to see a beautiful Mockingbird in your garden every winter day enjoying an apple or a few grapes.

\*Our local birds do not eat oranges, bananas and other tropical fruit so don't put them out.

# A LOOK AT RAHWAY 50, 75, AND 100 YEARS AGO

This time of year always brings an opportunity to look ahead and wonder what the next twelve months may bring. It's a time for resolutions and a new beginning. It's also a time to be nostalgic, to long for "the good old days" when life seemed to be less complex and less hurried. Yet because time has a way of clouding our memories, it might be interesting to look back at what was really happening in our city 50, 75, and 100 years ago.

## 1915

Jan. 8 - Rahway Board of Education purchased Riverside Park (Veterans' Field) for \$3,100. Renovations were made to the field transforming it into a first class baseball diamond, track, and tennis court. On Wednesday, August 4, 1915, the field was covered by six feet of flood water.

Issues of women's equality were reaching a boiling point in 1915 - Jan. 8 - The question of appointing women to the Board of Education was discussed. May 7 - The question of appointing women to the police force was being debated by the common council. Aug. 7 - Rahway women rallied for the right to vote when the "Torch of Liberty" was brought to the city. On October 19 a vote was taken on three Constitutional Amendments including women's voting rights. Equal suffrage was defeated in both Rahway 972 - 602 and on the state level 175,000 - 125,000. Women would wait another five years before they got the right to vote.

April 30 - The Board of Education reported that more school rooms were needed. The four grammar schools, Franklin, Washington, Columbia, and Lincoln had more students than desks.

June 15 - 42 students graduated from Rahway High. To that point, it was the largest number of seniors to graduate in the school's history.

July 4 – A big rally for prohibition was held which featured a speaker from Kentucky who spoke on the evils of "King Alcohol." The 21 saloons in the city were under attack by members of the clergy and prohibition groups. In 1920, the 18th Amendment of the Constitution would ban the sale of alcohol.

Oct 5 – A survivor of the Lusitania visited Rahway and told of her ordeal on the ill-fated ship that was sunk by a German U-Boat. Of the 1,198 passengers and crew members who perished, 110 were Americans. War was in the air.

Nov. 30 – Rahway doctors promote the need for a local hospital. It would eventually be housed in the building on the corner of W. Hazelwood Ave. and Jaques Ave., which incidentally, still stands.

# 1940

Jan. 4 – Building in the city in 1939 was reported to have been the best since the record year of 1927. Forty-eight new homes were built and 286 permits were issued for building valued at a total of \$1,156,427.

Jan. 25 – A discussion was held regarding the disposition of the Campbell Street high school. Dedicated in 1909, by 1940 it was outmoded and too small to accommodate the growing number of students. City officials would eventually opt to renovate and restructure the building to serve as the city hall. In June 1940, the police department would move into what had been the high school annex.

May 23 – Traffic concerns were an issue in 1940 with an increase in speeding violations. Traffic lights were finally installed on major intersections along St. Georges Avenue.

May 28 – The population of Rahway was listed as 17,579.

June 20 – The first appeals were made by the Rahway Chapter of the American Cross to aid to civilian refugees in Europe. War was in the air.

Jan. 14 – Contracts were signed for the redevelopment of Lower Main Street. Today, the property is the site of the City Hall/Police Headquarters, Recreation Center, Library, Rahway Plaza Apartments, SDI Technologies, Meridia Water's Edge Apartments, Center

Circle Sports "Tents", the Post Office and the Fire Headquarters.

April 1 – Captain Herbert T. Kinch was named Deputy Chief of the Rahway Police Department. He was the first African American to attain that rank in any municipality in the state.


Several new civic buildings were being planned in 1965 - April 15 – An ordinance was passed to build a new library. July 22 – Bids were taken to build a new Fire Headquarters. Oct. 1 – Plans for a new post office were approved.

June 24 – Rahway High school graduates 508 seniors (largest in city's history to this day).

July 15 – Plans were made with the Army Corps of Engineers for flood control remediation.

Sept. 2 – Lincoln School was razed. Built in 1873, it served as Rahway's first high school until 1909 and later as a grammar school until it was demolished.

Oct. 28 – The names of Rahway boys stationed in Vietnam were listed in the Rahway News Record. War was in the air.

The RHS students were thrilled to perform for this sold-out crowd of 3,000 that was filled with plenty of celebrities! The Rahway Band also got the chance to sit in on the sound check of such superstars as Salt and Pepa, as well as the host herself, Cyndi Lauper. It was truly an amazing experience that both students and band staff will never forget.



Yes, the Rahway Public Library offers more to members than simply supplying books, DVDs, and a quiet place in which to read. The Library is very much a center of our community, providing meeting space for such local organizations as the Garden Club, Girl Scouts, NJ Association for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, as well as various alumni associations.

The library itself also offers a wide variety of programs, some sponsored by the Library Board or Friends of the Library, which provide free live entertainment for those who may not be able to get to other venues in New Jersey. These programs often have an educational focus as well, such as the small business and the job search programs.

The library plays a key role in preparing very young children to read and go to school. The Every Rahway Child Ready to Read program enhances existing story time programs with guidance for parents to take home and read to their children. Special children's events, such as baking gingerbread cookies, bring children of all ages to the library. For older children, the Teen Circle is an enclosed space where teens can gather and feel a little freer to be themselves.


