WATCHUNG MOUNTAIN DISTRICT BOY SCOUTS HOLD FIRST ANNUAL CHESS TOURNAMENT SPONSORED BY WHITE CASTLE

The Watchung Mountian District of the Boy Scouts of America hosted their first Chess Tournament open to all registered Boy Scouts, Venturers and Explorers.
