JUNE 7TH TO BE A DAY OF REMEMBRANCE IN KENILWORTH

10, 2014 a presentation was made by Michael Ysenko, Borough Historian for Early History Colonial American Revolutionary War history and Dorothea Krihak. Afterwards a proclamation was signed recognizing the Borough of Kenilworth's role in the American Revolutionary War during the Battle of Connecticut Farms, and June 7th was designated as a day of remembrance in the Borough.

Mayor Pugliese said much of the information in this proclamation was garnered by Michael Ysenko and Dorothea Krihak.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Kenilworth, County of Union State of New Jersey, on this 10th Day of December in the year 2014 hereby proclaims that our Borough was part of Connecticut Farms during the Battle of Connecticut Farms on June 7, 1780, in the course of the American Revolutionary War 1775 - 1783; and

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to honor our citizen hero militia who fought in this major battle against the British

During a Kenilworth Council meeting held on December Crown; protecting General George Washington and our American Continental Army who were encamped at Morristown, New Jersey at that date by stopping the surprise attack of five thousand British soldiers on route through Connecticut Farms, with the intent of marching to end the war with a British victory at Morristown; and

> WHEREAS, General George Washington himself praised the militia at the Connecticut Farms Battle that took place that day on June 7, 1780, stating they fought "with honor".

> THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Borough of Kenilworth hereby proclaims that moving forward every year, June 7th will be a day of remembrance and recognition of the hero militia here at Connecticut Farms that helped to win our independence from British rule to become the United States of America, fighting the Battle at Connecticut Farms, New Jersey during the American Revolutionary War.

> BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in recognition and remembrance, from this day forward, Borough flags be flown at half-staff every June 7th.

MEMO FROM THE MAYOR

As we now find ourselves in the midst of the winter season there are a few measures we could all take to make our town safer and more enjoyable for all. I would ask, if possible, that all residents remove as many vehicles from the streets as possible in order that our Department of Public Works may plow as much as the roadway from curb to curb. This will make the roadway safer for all vehicular and pedestrian traffic alike.

As for parking on municipal roads, the new town ordinance provides that, unless otherwise posted:

- On days of the month that are even numbered, a vehicle shall not
- be parked on the even numbered side of the street; and
- On days of the month that are odd numbered, a vehicle shall not
- be parked on the odd numbered side of the street; and
- Between the hours of 9 PM to 12 AM the restriction

on alternate side of the street parking shall be suspended.

In addition I would also ask that if you have a sidewalk abutting your property that you remove any snow and ice that may exist so that it is safe for pedestrian traffic. There are many residents including senior citizens and children, who use our sidewalks and therefore it is incumbent upon us to insure that they can safely walk within our borough during this winter season. As a gentle reminder it is noted that Borough Ordinance 170-2 requires owners and tenants to keep sidewalks free from snow and ice within 18 hours after the cessation of any fall of snow, sleet, or freezing rain. In addition our walkways and steps leading to our front doors should be salted or otherwise have ice and snow removed so as to assure proper and safe passage for our postal carriers and other service providers.

During larger snow events the Borough's fire hydrants can become covered by snow or otherwise difficult to reach due to the movement of snow by residents and plows. This could make it difficult for firefighters to locate and reach the fire hydrant in the case of a fire emergency. I ask, if possible, that the residents within our community "adopt" the fire hydrant that abuts or otherwise is near their property and remove any snow that would otherwise conceal or make it difficult to reach the fire hydrant during a snow emergency. This communal undertaking will make things safer for our residents and easier for our fire department as they often take time to cause the snow removal following a snow event. As another gentle reminder Borough Ordinance 170-4 prohibits the depositing of any snow within a 5ft radiance of any fire hydrant.

Lastly there are many senior citizens who as a result of infirmity, illness or otherwise, are unable to travel during a weather event, therefore if you know of any senior citizens in your neighborhood, and if you have the time and ability, please inquire with them whether or not they need any basic groceries, amenities, prescriptions or if you can be of any other assistance to them during the weather event. It could be something as simple as merely taking out the garbage or spreading salt on their steps.

Working together as a community we can make this winter season safer and more enjoyable for all.



KENILWORTH SCHOOLS WILL BE TAKING THE PARCC ONE STEP AT A TIME

Kenilworth's children are moving closer to taking the PARCC for the first time. Students in grades 3-8 will take the test on specific days during the month of March. The PARCC is intended to replace outdated and ineffective tests with new assessments that measure real world skills colleges and employers say they value such as critical thinking and problem solving.

The national conversation about the PARCC is heating up. Regardless of one's position on the assessment, the fact is that New Jersey's school districts will be required to implement the test. However, how districts use the resulting test data is a matter for each community to decide. Kenilworth Public Schools will be taking a waitand-see approach. What will have to be determined is the authenticity of the data. The primary question schools around the country like Harding and Brearley will have to answer is whether or not students' results on the PARCC

Model the value of learning, self-discipline, and hard work. Communicating through questioning and conversation, demonstrating that achievement comes from working hard.

Express high but realistic expectations for achievement. Setting goals and standards that are appropriate for children's age and maturity, recognizing and encouraging special talents, informing friends and family about successes.

Encourage children's development/ progress in school. Maintaining a warm and supportive home, showing interest in children's progress at school, helping with homework, discussing the value of a good education and possible career options, staying in touch with teachers and students.




