

#### **BLUE RIBBONS SHOW SUPPORT OF POLICE**

After riots broke out in Missouri and New York, and NYPD officers Wenjian Liu and Rafeal Ramos were shot and killed as they sat in a marked squad car in Brooklyn on December 20, 2014, Kenilworth's borough clerk Laura Reinertsen was dismayed by the anti-police sentiment that was being reported in the national news. She had an idea of placing blue ribbons around Kenilworth Borough Hall to show support for the police and she called the Kenilworth Garden Center for help.

It was right in the midst of the Christmas holiday bustle, but owners Gail and Art Russo thought it was a great idea and they tracked down some blue ribbon for the effort. Gail and Art along with Art's mom Mary, created the bows and installed them at Kenilworth's Borough Hall free of charge.

The Russo's thought it was such a great idea that they offered their services free of charge to other towns. Laura sent a blast email to other Union County clerks asking if they'd like blue ribbons to decorate their municipal

buildings. The response was overwhelming. To date the Russo's have placed blue ribbons to show support in Union, Cranford, Winfield Park, Elizabeth, Springfield, Fanwood, Scotch Plains, Clark, Roselle Park and Kenilworth.

Remembers Gail Russo, owner of Kenilworth Garden Center, "The police were getting a bad rap. We wanted to show our support."

On January 28th, 2015 a resolution was passed unanimously by Mayor Fred Pugliese and the Council which declared their "support and solidarity with the men and women who serve as law enforcement officers for their distinctive service and dedicated efforts, earning our highest respect and deepest gratitude, which must be recognized and honored for their selfless and heroic service and invaluable contributions to upholding justice, enforcing the rule of law, and protecting the innocent in Kenilworth, the State of New Jersey and in this nation."



#### MEMO FROM THE MAYOR

Now that spring is right around the corner we can hopefully look forward to seeing and enjoying all the beauty that the surrounding areas, and particularly our town of Kenilworth, have to offer. In the past many volunteers who were members of the Beatification Committee spent a few hours on a couple of Saturdays beatifying our town by planting eye catching flowers in our downtown area as well as along the 9/11 Memorial at Borough Hall. Our thanks go out to these Borough residents who participated in the Beautification Committee such as Olga Hackett,

Thomas Hackett, Maria Cardoso and Justine Melillo, who endeavor to beautify our town every spring.

Furthermore, in years past the Borough created a Pride in Kenilworth Committee which consisted of volunteers who would assist in the planning and execution in some Borough events such as the street fair, fireworks, etc. The Pride in Kenilworth Committee was disbanded a few years ago.

We will be resurrecting the Pride in Kenilworth Committee and will be joining it with the Beatification Committee. One of the events that this joint committee will help coordinate will be the 9/11 ceremony which takes place annually at Borough Hall. The second event which is still in the infancy of the planning stage, is a "Winter Wonderland" type themed event which would take place on or about December 6, 2015 in the municipal parking lot on South 21st Street as well as indoors in the Kenilworth Veterans Center with gratitude to Commander Robert Jeans. This event will culminate with a Tree Lighting ceremony at Borough Hall.

Some residents have already volunteered to participate and sit on the joint committee however, the help of more volunteers would be greatly appreciated in participating in the planning or execution of these endeavors.

As a result of budget cutting measures we have been able to put aside funding for these events through transfer of budget line items without any additional spending. As a member of the joint committee you would help plan and/or execute the events with the budgeted funds. In addition, the Recreation Committee also has vacancies so if you wish to plan and/or participate in recreational events please contact me or the Borough Clerk. Both of these committees will only require a brief commitment of time as presumably they will only meet once a month to plan and to execute various events. We look forward to hearing from you.

One of the events that is put together by the Recreation Committee is the Easter Egg Hunt which this year it will take place on March 28 (rain date March 29) at 10 am at DiMario Park on Michigan Avenue. The Easter Egg Hunt will start promptly at 10 am so it is important that you arrive early in order that your child or grandchild can harvest as many eggs and prizes as possible. Many thanks go out to the Recreation Committee which helps put this event together.

#### **KENILWORTH POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATE**

The Kenilworth Police Department has begun a proactive community policing initiative in 2015. Traditionally, police organizations have responded to crime after it occurs and, therefore, are structured to support routine patrol, rapid response to calls for service, arrests, and followup investigations. Community policing calls for a more strategic and thoughtful incorporation of these aspects of police business into an overall broader police mission focused on the proactive prevention of crime and disorder.

Some of the Kenilworth Police Department's community based policing initiatives are having



an increased presence in David Brearley Middle/High School, Harding School, and St. Theresa's School both during school hours and after hours and weekends. The David Brearley Middle/ High School currently have a full-time School Resource Officer assigned that is on their premises. In addition, a walking post in the center of town was instituted on weekdays during the early afternoon hours when the center of town is most busy. The officer will be making stops amongst the local businesses while on the beat to form stronger lines of communication and familiarization between the local police and businesses. In addition, the officers will be stopping by the Senior Citizen's building and Kenilworth Public Library to address their concerns and be more accessible to their patrons and the community. The community will see an increased presence in local parks and community and sporting events where the Kenilworth Police will be present and accessible for all community members alike.

Another community service performed by the

Kenilworth Police Department is conducting periodic vacant residence checks while residents are away on vacation or their home is vacant for an extended period of time. If you wish to be added to this program please stop by the police department to complete a form for this service.

A new initiative currently slated for – July 13th through July 17th this summer is the Kenilworth Police Department Youth Academy. This program will be for Kenilworth residents who are going into 9th through 12th grades and limited to 30 applicants. The mission of the Kenilworth Police Department's Youth Academy is "To Introduce the Youth of Kenilworth to Basic Police Practices and Routines in an Effort to Promote Understanding of Law Enforcement Principles as well as to Encourage Positive Interactions Between the Community and the Kenilworth Police Department." Youth Academy applications will be available in May at the High School through the School Resource Officer Brian Pickton who will be running the Youth Academy.



#### **KENILWORTH PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT MAKES** TREMENDOUS GAINS ON THE NJ DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION PERFORMANCE REPORT

The performance of the Kenilworth Public School District rose dramatically in peer and statewide rankings according to the latest New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) annual School Performance Reports.

The NJDOE annually publishes a "report card" for all of the schools in the state that measures progress in several areas, including Academic Achievement, College and Career Readiness, Student Growth Graduation/Post-Secondary Preparedness.

Harding and David Brearley Schools rose in the peer and statewide rankings in five of the six categories by which the district was judged (ranking in the sixth category remained the same from last year). Harding Elementary School is now outperforming 52% of the schools in its peer group (up from 21% last year). Brearley

Middle-High School is placed in the 99% percentile of like schools in the area of Graduation and Post-Secondary Preparedness.

The tremendous increase in our performance is a direct result of the very hard work of our support staff, teachers and school leadership who responded so well to a reform program put in place several years ago.

Our reform plan meant changing the way the school community thinks about teaching and learning so that academic rigor has become the cornerstone of what everyone in the district



#### KENILWORTH RESIDENT AMONG CLASS FROM TRINITAS SCHOOL OF NURSING



#### WHAT SOUND REPRESENTS KENILWORTH BEST







films "Birdman" and "American Sniper" at this year's Academy Awards, a group of about 200 volunteers at a local suicide prevention and crisis intervention hotline were more touched by two obscure winners.

"The Phone Call," a short film about a suicide prevention hotline operator and her distraught caller, won for Best Live Action Short Film. "Crisis Hotline: Veterans Press 1," documentary about the employees who staff the suicide hotline of the Veterans Administration, took home Best Documentary. Both films are heart-wrenching.

The volunteers of CONTACT We Care understand why these two films garnered such honors. As real-life operators who take the calls of people in crisis, many of whom are suicidal, they understand the emotion that goes into these exchanges – on both ends.

Dean Marsh has been a volunteer listener at CONTACT since December. He recalls one recent call he took toward the end of his shift. He spent two-and-a-half hours talking to the caller.

"What he was feeling at the beginning of the call and at the end of the call was an amazing turnaround," Marsh said. "He told me he didn't know what he would do if someone didn't pick up the phone. He said having someone to talk to really changed his world. You really feel good about yourself when you get off that kind of call and know that you changed or potentially saved a life."

CONTACT We Care, headquartered in Westfield, is a suicide prevention agency that operates a suicide prevention and crisis intervention hotline and provides suicide prevention training to the public, community groups and businesses.

The agency relies on more than 200

While most Americans were focused on the volunteers to staff its listening lines and texting services and the hotline is always looking for new volunteers, according to Joanne Oppelt, CONTACT's executive director. Listeners answer about 14,000 calls and texts each year.

> "It is so essential that people in crisis or distress have someone they can talk to who will listen in an empathetic and non-judgmental way," Oppelt said. "Our callers come from all walks of life and every socioeconomic level. They are our neighbors and at a dramatic moment of crossroads in their lives, our listeners are here for them. What our listeners give is a remarkable story – Oscar-deserving in itself."

> CONTACT volunteers undergo 50 hours of instruction in empathetic and nonjudgmental active listening and mental health issues and go through a two-day intensive session on suicide intervention called ASIST, or Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training. Training is followed by an internship on the lines with experienced listeners.


