The Community Access Unlimited (CAU) has opened a new Respite Home in Union Township that provides shortterm safe and nurturing care to people with disabilities and respite to their families and caregivers so they can travel, undergo medical procedures, have home repair work done or take time away from care giving for any other reason.

"Caring for loved ones with disabilities can be a full-time job, and at times a very demanding one," said Sheila McDowell, assistant executive director of disability services at CAU. "It is only natural and even healthy that they receive respite from their responsibilities at times.

"At the same time they do not want to feel guilty about leaving their loved one and want the peace of mind knowing they are staying someplace where they receive the same care and attention by trained personnel as they receive at home. That is why they chose Community Access Unlimited. We have been providing comprehensive care to people with disabilities for 36 years."

CAU is a statewide nonprofit providing support programs and services to more than 6,000 adults with disabilities as well as youth served under the Department of Children and Families (DCF) to enable them to live independently in the community, in areas including vocational and life-skills training, education, advocacy and recreation and in-home services.

The home, called Knollwood, is the new home of the CAU Knollwood. Respite program. It is a ranch-style home that is wheelchairaccessible and houses up to four visitors in private rooms for one to 30 days. While there the visitors participate in recreation, attend day programs and enjoy their own personal activities. Trained staff are with them 24/7 and take them for her daughter has high needs. I told her, 'Ma'am, this is what medical appointments, social engagements or errands.

Families and caregivers are referred to CAU Respite through the Family Support Unit of the state Department of Developmental Disabilities.

"We've had some families bringing their loved ones to CAU Respite for 18 months or longer," McDowell said. "They're so pleased with the care and attention they are given that we've earned their trust."

Kim Sharpe is one of these parents. She has been bringing her son, Dwight, to CAU Respite for nearly two years and his next visit will be later this month.

"He likes it there," she said. "My son is a social butterfly. He gets along with all participants very well. The love and care that someone shows to their child is very important to a parent. Once we have this bond between us, between Community Access and myself, it became very easy. They would like to come back."

"They are very responsive to any concerns I have. It's not about collecting a paycheck for them. You have to have that will to care for a person with a disability. It means the world to me."

"Kim has been using our service anytime she needs to travel or has a conflict," he said. "She took Dwight someplace else once and said she would never do it again.

"We had another parent who was very skeptical because we do. We take care of our visitors, give them whatever care they need.' She ended up extending her daughter's stay. She said, 'My daughter is very happy while she's there.'"

Margaret Rector and Fanny Sacca are two visitors currently staying at Knollwood. While at the home Rector attends a day program in Springfield, enjoys her private room, which she keeps clean, and watches television. Staff take her shopping and help her select what clothes to buy.

"I like it here," she said. "The staff is very nice. They care about you."

Sacca attends day program at CAU's Day Habilitation Services program. She likes to sew or go shopping or to the Dunkin Donuts with staff and enjoys getting fresh air and seeing what's going on in the neighborhood.

"I like it here," she said. "They're very respectful people. I

## **KEY CLUB HELPS YOUNG GIRL GO TO HIGH SCHOOL**

Education is not always delivered on a silver platter to those who seek to reap its benefits. In the United States, public school may be offered free of charge (save taxes) for the individual, but in other countries, students are not always so serendipitous. They have to work hard to pay for their education, and without the money allocated towards this goal, they may fall short of the advantages of learning and may be forced to work physically laboring jobs which may be dangerous to their overall health.

In efforts to prevent this, the Union High School Key Club partnered with a nonprofit organization called Yuda Bands for its last service project of the year. Yuda Bands is an organization based in Guatemala focused on helping young impoverished children finish their education, since free public education ends at 6th grade in the country. The organization helps fundraise the costs by selling bracelets handmade by the participants in Guatemala and using the revenue from the sales to help these children get an education – deriving their name from their sole purpose, Yuda being the abbreviated form of ayuda, the Spanish word for help.

In their first endeavors to sponsor a budding student without bias, the officers of Key Club randomly chose Astrid Quiroa to support on her journey to finish high school. As a sixteen-yearold girl without a father and with younger siblings for her mother to support, Astrid faced dropping out of school to help the family monetarily if she could not receive help from Yuda Bands – and this is where Key Club stepped in to help out.

With about 175 bands at \$7 each, it took only

two days for the bracelets to sell out and for Astrid's goal to be reached. By the purchases of the bands and donations from students and staff alike, Astrid Quiroa could finish high school without fear of having to drop out because of a lack of funds.

The UHS Key Club would like to thank everyone who donated to the cause or who purchased a bracelet for making Astrid's dreams a reality, and hope in the upcoming service year that they, through the participation of the student body and staff, can continue to make these wishes come true for more aspiring students through Yuda Bands.

## UNION POLICE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES INITIAL LAW ENFORCEMENT ACCREDITATION

The Township of Union Police Department has received its initial law enforcement accreditation and is now an "Accredited Agency", after a more than two-year process. Administered by the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police, the accreditation program requires agencies to comply with best practice standards in five basic areas: the administrative function, the personnel function, the operations function, the investigative function, and the arrestee/detainee function.

The department must comply with more than 100 standards in order to achieve accredited status. Accreditation results in greater accountability within the agency, reduced risk and liability exposure, stronger defense against civil lawsuits, increased community advocacy, and more confidence in the agency's ability to operate efficiently and respond to community needs. Verification by the team that the Township of Union Police Department meets the Commission's "best practice" standards is part of a voluntary process to achieve accreditation, a highly prized recognition of law enforcement professional excellence.

"We, on the Township Committee, are extremely proud of the work our police officers and their leadership do on a daily basis" stated Mayor Manuel Figueiredo, "This accreditation is validation of the respectful and diligent job performed by the men and women on our force for many years." Police Commissioner Clifton People was proud that "under the supervision and direction of Director Zieser the Police Department has become extraordinarily proficient as witnessed at the May 26th Township Committee Meeting where they received the assessment award."

A team of assessors from the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police (NJSACOP) examined all aspects of the department, its policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services, during an on site inspection in the fall of 2014. The assessment team is composed of law enforcement practitioners from similar New Jersey law enforcement agencies. The assessors reviewed written materials, interviewed agency members, and visited offices and other places where compliance with the standards were observed. Once the Commission's assessors completed their review of the agency, they reported to the full Commission, which then decided to grant accredited status on March 19, 2015.

Accreditation is valid for a three-year period during which time the agency must submit annual reports attesting to their continued compliance with those standards under which it was initially accredited.

The New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police through its New Jersey Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission is the legitimate authority and accreditation agency in the state of New Jersey. The Accreditation Program Manager for the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police is Mr. Harry J. Delgado.
