WARRENBROOK SENIORS "GET INTO THE ACT"

Warrenbrook Senior Center celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the Older Americans Act by getting into the act. The month of May is designated as Older Americans Month and this year's theme was "Get Into The Act." The Older Americans Act is a government Act which funds the Nutrition Program and health promoting activities offered at senior centers along with many other community services for people age 60+.

Members "Got Into The Act" by giving back to overseas military families by collecting manufacturers' coupons, prepared eating utensil packs for a soup kitchen meal program, performed acts of kindness to others and became a part of a Young At Heart Cabaret Show.

With the help of the community (students and community residents were invited to collect and drop off coupons during the month), manufacturer coupons valued at \$66,265.44 were collected and will be send to military bases overseas. In conjunction with the Overseas Coupon Program, coupons were collected, sorted and counted and will be sent to military bases overseas for military families to use in the PX, BX and Commissary.

The 50th Anniversary theme of the Older Americans Act featured ways in which people 60+ could make a positive impact in their community by showing acts of kindness to others. Members performed 27 positive acts of kindness. Some of the kindness acts that were posted on the "Together We Can Fly" butterfly poster were:

- Light Grocery Shopping for Disabled Person
- Installed Flags on five cemetery graves of Veterans in Warren
- Made cookies for senior day care center
- Took a friend out to dinner

Members assembled 295 eating utensil packs for the Samaritan Homeless Interim Program (SHIP). These packs are given to those receiving meals at Ship's Galley (a soup kitchen), SHIP's Mobile Soup Kitchen and SHIP's Holiday Meals programs. In addition to the required knife, fork, spoon and napkin, each pack was given a copy of the grace that the center uses before meals and a special hand-made "thinking of you greeting card."

In honor of Older Americans Month's 50th Anniversary theme, "Get Into The Act," the Warrenbrook Senior Center hosted a "Young At Heart Cabaret" that featured members of the center and the North Plainfield High School Women's A Cappella Group, under the direction of Amy Six, Director of Choral Music at North Plainfield High School. The mother and daughter team of Adrienne Graubard (mother) and Amy Six (daughter) teamed up to provide the musical direction for an entertaining and funfilled program. The Warrenbrook Senior Center entertainment included hand-bells, harmonica and piano presentations. The choral music included several solos.

When the hand-bell presentation included "It's a Grand Old Flag," the A Cappella Group sang along. When Paul Horwath, from Watchung, played "Let Me Call You Sweetheart" and "He's Got The Whole World In His Hands" on his harmonica, everyone sang along.
