

Union Township Chamber of Commerce again this year at its Fifth Annual Mayor's Day 5K Run on Sunday, September 20, 2015. A committee has been actively working over the summer to plan and expand this year's event.

Held rain or shine, the event will start at Union High School on Cooke Drive. Registration begins at 7:45 a.m. with the actual race commencing at 9:00 a.m. Participants will traverse a USATF - certified course beginning and ending at the high school. This year's course is being updated and redesigned.

Eugene Mitchell of Spencer Savings Bank and Hayley O'Connor of Electro America, Inc, both of Union, have been named co-chairs of this year's 5K.

"This year marks the fifth anniversary of this popular community event, and we are working to make it our biggest and better ever," said Chamber Executive James Masterson. Prizes will be awarded for various categories, and t-shirts and gift bags will be distributed to participants.

MEET BENJAMIN....THIS YEAR'S RECIPIENT OF A PORTION OF THE 5K PROCEEDS

Ten-year-old Benjamin was born healthy at seven pounds and two ounces. It was at 10 days old when Benjamin's parents received notice from the State to make an appointment because the State-mandated sickle cell screening came back positive. Sickle Cell Anemia is a hereditary disease in which the red blood cells are crescent moon shape instead of round. Due to their crescent shape the red blood cells are rigid and sticky which can slow or block blood flow and oxygen to vital parts and organs. This often creates intolerable pain.

Ben's first hospital admission was at seven months for a fever. Since then, he has been admitted for Vaso occlusive crisis, pneumonia and fevers numerous times. When he was younger, his arms/legs would swell up -- helping the family to identify the reason for his crankiness and tears. The disease required him to have surgeries, frequent tests, blood drawings, multiple blood transfusions and hospital admissions. There is only one cure for this illness: a bone marrow transplant, which can be very dangerous. The illness continues to claim lives in early adulthood.

In September 2014, Ben was diagnosed with Stage IV Avascular Necrosis to the left hip resulting from loss of blood flow to the femur head. This has left Ben unable to walk without pain or assistance. Being too young for a hip replacement, he has endured many procedures followed by months of hospitalization and rehab. Ben has been recovering well; however, he still has days ofpain and fatigue from the anemia.

Ben is an intelligent youngster wholoves to



make people laugh. He is the fourth son od parentsEmmanuel and Perette Duvelson. His three older brothers have traits of the illness. His younger brother shows no sign of illness. They have learned to adjust to many changes that this illness has cause to the family.



PREMIER DESIGN + BUILD GROUP, LLC BREAKS GROUND FOR 263,415 SQ FT FACILITY IN UNION

A groundbreaking celebration was held July 1, 2015, to celebrate the coming of a 263,415 sq ft industrial speculative facility in Union, New Jersey. Bridge Development Partners purchased 18 acres of land to house Bridge Point Port West at 750 Union Avenue and selected PREMIER to lead design and construction. This site was previously home to Tuscan & Lehigh Dairy, which has remained unoccupied since 2006. Demolition is underway to clear the site to make room for the new construction.

In attendance were Union Township representatives, as well as representatives from Bridge Development Partners, LLC, PREMIER Design + Build Group, LLC, Jones Lang LaSalle, CIT and MidAtlantic Engineering Partners.

"Bridge Point Port West meets the demand for new industrial buildings with class A amenities in the Northeast. This is one of several PREMIER sites in the area that will exceed tenant expectations," says Alec Zocher, Executive Vice President of PREMIER Design + Build, LLC.

Bridge Point Port West tenants will have convenient access to neighboring sea and airports. These businesses will also be able to pull from a local labor pool from surrounding towns.

Building envelope materials will consist of load-bearing, precast wall panels and aluminum frame storefront entrances. The facility will be equipped with a 60 mil TPO roofing system. A complete storm drainage system and sanitary system will be constructed as well.

Bridge Point Port West will feature 36 ft clearheight warehouse spaces, 44 truck dock positions, 2 drive-in doors and an ESFR fire protection sprinkler. Additionally, a new lot with 153 car stalls, 76-onsite and 26-offsite trailer parking spaces will be provided.

Joel Lubin, Blake Chroman and Chris Hile of Jones Lang Lasalle are representing the building. Cornerstone Architects are providing the architectural design and MidAtlantic Engineering Partners, LLC are providing civil engineering services.






