JUNIOR AMBASSADORS EMBARK ON DOG RESCUE MISSION

Three New Jersey teenagers will join Home for Good Dog Rescue on July 13 to pull dogs from high-kill shelters throughout South Carolina and Georgia as part of the organization's Junior Ambassador Program.

For ten days, the team will collect dogs, oversee their medical care, place them in southern foster homes, and arrange for their eventual transport to New Jersey. The Junior Ambassadors will then foster the dogs in their own homes and help adopt them into permanent families.

"During the summertime, the shelters tend to become more crowded, and you see a lot more flies, fleas, and ticks," Junior Ambassador Nora Brindle, an incoming freshman at Westfield High School, said. "I hope to save as many as we can so these dogs can get out of the shelters and start the journey to finding their forever home in New Jersey."

Brindle has been volunteering with Home for Good Dog Rescue for three years. She and her family have fostered nearly 100 dogs and puppies with the organization, and she hopes to eventually start an international dog rescue of her own.

This will be her second time accompanying Home for Good to Aiken, South Carolina, which will one day be the site of Home for Good's ALMOST HOME Wellness Center, a specialized facility preparing southern dogs for their journey north.

Brindle is joined by Rachel Lehner and Anna Newmark, Warren, New Jersey natives and students at Watchung Hills Regional High School. Together, the girls have conducted car washes and bake sales to raise nearly \$6,500 for their trip.

The Junior Ambassador Program is a selection-based opportunity reserved for Home for Good's most dedicated young volunteers. Its 2013 trip resulted in the rescue of nearly 100 puppies from euthanasia.

Home for Good Dog Rescue is a foster-based non-profit rescue organization dedicated to rescuing dogs from high-kill shelters in South Carolina and Georgia. As it approaches its fifth year of its mission, it has placed over 3,600 dogs in loving homes.



HILLS COMMUNITY INVITED TO JOIN STUDENTS IN SUMMER READING SELECTION

Students and teachers are inviting the general public to join them in reading one of the summer reading assignments for rising seniors at Watchung Hills Regional High School, "Tales from the Bed: A Memoir," by the late Jenifer Estess, as told to her sister, Valerie Estess. Tales from the bed is about the author's battle with A.L.S. (amyotrophic lateral sclerosis).

In addition to increasing the students' awareness about A.L.S., the initiative will try to engage the community at large in reading the book, Then the community will be invited to join with student, parent and community groups during the 2015-2016 School Year at community fundraising events and at a community "book group night," according to Watchung Hills

English teacher Laura Goodson said.

The student government at Watchung Hills, including both the All-Student Council (ASC) and the Grade-Level Councils (GLC), plan to make support of Project A.L.S., and A.L.S research in general, the focus of their fundraising efforts during the 2015-2016 School Year. Watchung Hills students are hoping to hold a year-long series of events to support research efforts and to raise awareness, among students and among the broader community. Student government advisor Maureen Kelly is joining Goodson in coordinating this initiative.

The late author, Jenifer Estess, succumbed to A.L.S., known more broadly as Lou Gehrig's Disease, in 2003. The memoir was first published in 2005.





WATCHUNG HILLS REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL'S 58TH ANNUAL COMMENCEMENT

Some 555 students from Warren Township, Watchung, Long Hill Township and Green Brook Township received diplomas on Wednesday morning, June 24, at the 58th Annual Commencement at Watchung Hills Regional High School.

Under bright sunny skies, and with temperatures in the high 80s, family and friends filled the stands of Tozier Stadium to witness the graduates, with the girls dressed in white gowns and boys in gold, process in under a canopy of brown and gold balloons, the school's colors, to occupy seats on the football field. They walked behind school administrators, board of education members and faculty members, many of who wore gowns bearing academic colors earned from their own college and post-graduate graduations.

The school's Concert Band, under the direction of Music teacher David Udell, who, himself, is retiring this year, played "Pomp Circumstance." The Senior Choral Group, under the direction of Music teacher Angela DiIorio Bird, herself a graduate of Watchung Hills, sang the National Anthem.

Four students made remarks at the

commencement, all fondly remembering their time at Watchung Hills, and encouraging their fellow graduates to seek and conquer new challenges, be leaders, and never forget their home, Watchung Hills. The student speakers were: Joseph Pecoraro, the president of the All Student Council, who also led the Salute to the Flag: Katherine Schechter, president of the Class of 2015; Joseph Da, who presented the Salutatory address; and Christina Liao, who presented the Valedictory address.

Also speaking at the graduation were: Principal George Alexis; Superintendent Elizabeth Jewett; and Watchung Hills Regional High School Vice President Dr. Gregory Przybylski. They echoed the sentiments of the student speakers.

"Dream big and aim to do good," said Alexis. "Examine the world with a critical eye and ask the right questions. Be brave and creative, empathetic and kind, authentic and resilient. As you become our newest alumni, the world and your place in it changes inevitably. The river continues to flow, but one constant remains: This is your school and you have a home at Watchung Hills."

Jewett reminded all who gathered on graduation day that the day also belongs to the parents, family and teachers who have contributed to the individual and collective successes of the Class of 2015.

Przybylski recalled how at the very start of school, students learn the basic building blocks, the "ABCs." At their graduation from high school, and now as young adults, he urged the members of the Class of 2015 to still remember their ABCs, which he suggested stand for the building blocks for success: "Advocacy," "Bravery," and "Compassion."

After the official ceremonies, graduates, families, faculty and school officials lingered on the field and later, met up back in school, to take photos, sign yearbooks, say goodbyes, and head out to family parties.

Later, many of the graduates attended the annual Project Graduation party at the FunPlex in Mount Laurel, organized by the 2015 Project Graduation Committee. The commencement booklets included the names of some 176 families and nearly 70 businesses and community organizations who had supported the Project Graduation effort.






