Kenilworth Board of Health President, Randy M. Moscaritolo, announced that The Michael L. Vitale, Sr. Health Fair will be held on Saturday, September 26th, 2015 at St. Theresa's Elementary School, 540 Washington Avenue, Kenilworth, NJ from 9 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Health Professionals will be providing screenings and educational materials for: Vision, Hypertension, Dental, Colorectal cancer, Hearing, Vascular Educator, Prostate Health, Posture, Scoliosis, Podiatry, Diabetes and Blood Chemistry (SMAC/CBC).

NOTE: If you are taking the SMAC/CBC blood test, You Must Fast after 12AM the night before. DO NOT TAKE THE DIABETES TEST.

The following IMMUNIZATIONS will also be provided at no cost: DPT for ages one to seven years old; MMR-ages 15 months to six years old (three in one Vaccine provides protection against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella), Polio vaccine-ages one to eighteen years; Tetanus booster shots for adults.

The SMAC & CBC Blood test will be offered FREE of charge to Kenilworth Residents and a \$30.00 fee for Nonresidents. There will also be a \$30.00 charge to residents taking PSA (Prostate Screening) and \$35.00 to Non-Residents.

FLU SHOTS will be available at a cost of \$20.00.

The Blood Center of New Jersey will be accepting blood donations in their mobile unit located in the parking-lot area. Any one planning to donate blood should eat prior to donating.

Fees may be subject to change by the Laboratory.

Snacks provided for blood donors and individuals having had blood work.

CHILD ADVOCATE TRAINING STARTS SEPTEMBER 29TH

CASA volunteers speak for foster children. When removed from her parents' care, threeyear-old Alyssa was found underweight, dirty, and mostly grunted, cried or pointed to communicate; she even had been attempting to change her own diapers. When the foster mom tried to clean dirt from Alyssa's body and crust from her hair, the child was terrified of water. As the words "autism spectrum" and "developmental testing" were tossed around, the foster mom worked with Alyssa to improve communication and lessen tantrums, and introduced ageappropriate toys and books into her world.

Also about to enter Alyssa's world? Her CASA, the Court Appointed Special Advocate assigned by a Union County family court judge. Nearly 40 percent of children CASA of Union County has served this year alone entered care due to neglect, just like Alyssa, whose parents struggled with drug abuse. Armed with a court order, CASAs speak to all parties in the child's life: foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate those findings, as well as observations from the CASA's own visits with the child, into reports for the judge. CASAs participate in court hearings and speak on the child's needs and best interests. For Alyssa, her CASA's advocacy included securing speech and occupational therapy, changed placement to a more age-appropriate special education class, and increased visitation with a caring grandparent.

Alyssa, now five, has tested out of specialneeds interventions and this fall will walk through the doors of a mainstream kindergarten classroom. She is a bright and enthusiastic child who loves horses — and her CASA.

Why don't you walk through the doors of the next CASA training sessions and be the voice to change the life of one of the 542 Union County children in foster care?
